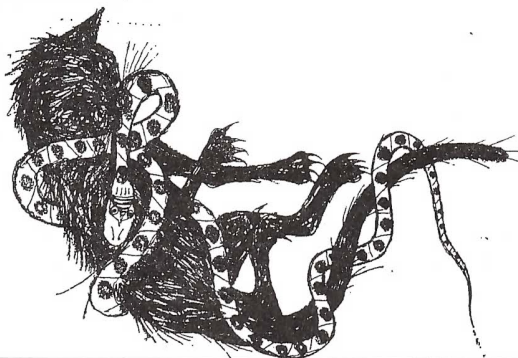

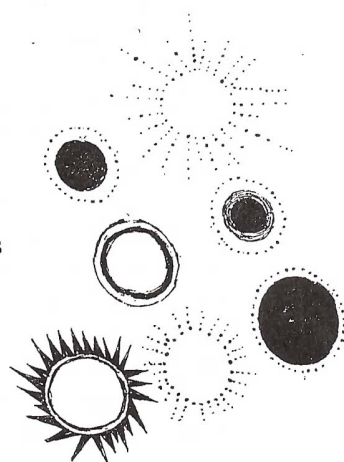

RUMINATIONS ON PROTESTING THE PIPE

Sunday Feb. 17th was no day of rest. We started the morning with the jabbing question - to be or not to be.....in San Francisco for the Keystone XL pipeline protest. (This 2,151 mi pipeline would deliver Canadian crude oil to the US Midwest. The said environmental risks include potential oil spills, displacement of natural habitat, contamination of groundwater and would create more greenhouse emissions than conventional petroleum extraction.)

We debated for three hours. Was it worth it to drive all that way to put in our two body count in the protest? Probably not. Would we make better use of our time staying home in Bolinas, writing a letter to our congressman or better yet, taking the Sunday morning off and do nothing? Well we drank our tea and worked on our art for a show that was to be later that night, then with a quick decision decided to jump in the car to see what all the fuss was about.

The rally, held at the Embarcadero in SF in solidarity with the gathering of 40,000 in DC that same day, was your typical good old fashioned Bay Area rally, good crowd, medium turn-out, peaceful for the most part. Interestingly, it was the first major demonstration sponsored in part by the Sierra Club, marking a shift in that organization's strategic policy. I do wish there had been a couple more powerful speakers to really move the audience, and it felt like- well just another check on the world's bucket list of concerning issues, and once your attention is turned to this, it seems hard to not go down the list of all other potentially harmful environmental moves that our country makes daily...

.....but back to THIS issue, seems like a pivotal moment for this country to address climate change, and if Obama allows this one, it's just more of a foot in the door of a future f**** you to the land as we scavenge for more of our drying up resources. So check out some links, make your own conclusions and perhaps write to your politicians.

Later that day, we returned from our protest, not feeling like better people but feeling a little more well-rounded, then went to an event at the Gospel Flat Farmstand where musicians played, wonderful art hung on the wall and the dialogue of culture continued. How do we stay engaged in wider geo-political issues while living in a self-sufficient, beautiful community? hmmm
