Expatriate Post: Dispatch to Boboland from a Small Town near Greece – V

The ancient Romans were my kind of people. Apart from their proclivity for prime real estate around the Mediterranean, they were thoroughly preoccupied with making tasty things such as wine, olive oil and fermented fish sauce. They also very kindly mass-produced pottery such as amphorae for me to find in the sea covered in barnacles and other decorative elements. When I get tired of looking for ancient Roman artifacts, I can always retire to my kitchen and, because of Roman industry, appreciate a bowl of pasta made from Roman durum wheat.

Unfortunately, our prudish society never incorporated the concept of public toilets as once enjoyed during the Golden Age of Rome. Imagine buying the morning paper and a piping hot caffe latte and sitting with your friends and acquaintances in the public square on cool, marble potties arranged in bench fashion. Cool, fresh spring water washed away any disagreeable waste while you smoked and joked and caught up on the latest hearsay.

Then there were those Gods of Liberty, those free agents found in the temples lying around the sacred altars and traveling with the Roman army on their jaunts to exotic locales: cats.


TREE HOUSE
