

MONDAY MORNING WEEK IN REVIEW 12-5-11 JENNIEPFEIFFER-RILEY

IT WAS A WINDY WEEK OF UNSEASONABLE CLEAR WARM DAYS BRINGING US INTO DECEMBER, AS WE REMEMBER THE LIFE OF PETER LEE. Long time Bolinas resident, Peter Lee died.this past week. Earlier this year, Peter Lee moved up to Walnut Place in Point Reyes Station, as his health started failing and he was no longer able to stay at his home at the end in PETER LEE DRIVE, alongside the Community Center. Peter was a prominent fixture in downtown Bolinas for many years, painting delightful primitives depicting our town, the school, and San Francisco. His home next to the People' Store was Bolinas' true affordable housing for many years. He opened his house and property to many in town who otherwise would have had no place to stay. This kindness of spirit was something he kept mostly out of sight. He was a large person, with a large crusty personality, and a voice to match. His salty comments and quick temper kept many people at arms length, maybe even a couple of car lengths, distance. He would cruise around in that big boat of a car of his that was filled with art supplies, paintings, and some new concept he had for raising money for a deserving town project. He was very generous with people he liked, and could be verbally brutal to those he disdained. Peter Lee and I got off to a rocky start when I was organizing the ongoing Garage Sale at the Bolinas Garage "Garagemahal" before affordable housing went in there. He would sometimes offend a shopper, or cause a child to whimper, and when I called him on it he referred to me as a femininazi, one of his favorite misogynist terms. We eventually made our truce and forged a friendship of sorts, I think mostly because he was a big fan of my daughter, Adrienne, and her work with KWMR. He became a regular "drive-up" costumer at the garage sale, and frequently bought items for one or another of his "tenants". I remember one time when he was looking for musical instruments to buy to replace those stolen from a Guatemalan Band that stayed at his place. Those were the kindnesses I came to see in him and I once again learned the lesson of looking beyond a rough surface to see what might be hidden underneath. Peter Lee was such a character, and I will miss his artistic genius and his random acts of kindness.

Speaking of random acts of kindness, I saw a community member expending large effort to enhance the children's bus stop on Alder. I have been wondering who was maintaining it, with the beautiful bench and now and then prayer flags, keeping poison oak at bay. I was glad to be able to say thanks for that. He said that even though his kids are way past the use of it, he has a sentimental feeling for the old bus stop and likes to keep it looking good. I love that.

More acts of kindness of the week include a "Knit-in," in Berkeley, by "Occupiers" of the East Bay, making hats for the OWS hardy souls in the harsh New York weather. Our own Bolinas Stinson students made over 500 scarves for homeless families and individuals closer to home. Our kindergarten staff, Cathy Nichelini and Kristen Noel organized this all school event. Congratulations and thanks to them.

MEETINGS OF THE WEEK included a Monday afternoon Resource Recovery meeting, with a report that the drainage has been improved, making access better this winter; a Monday night Fire Board meeting that had only two community members (where was everyone) there to hear a report about a proposed addition of a microwave dish on a tower, a decision that was put off until next month; a Wednesday STAGE MEETING, with Steve Kinsey with a full house of proponents to speak to the need for a replacement to the line between Bolinas and Stinson that is being discontinued in January (write those letters to the IJ so the Board of Supes know how we feel);and a Thursday School Staff/Board meeting for better communication and a thankyou to all those who show kindness every day, random or otherwise, to the children of our school. jp

BOLINAS: At 1:54 p.m. deputies assisted a citizen on Wharf Road.












