Many thanks to Samira and John's extended family for their generosity; our love and condolences go out to them for their great loss. I've been told the store will continue to serve the town as it has since 1978, run now by Samira and family members who have helped keep it going for years, much the same, but forever changed.

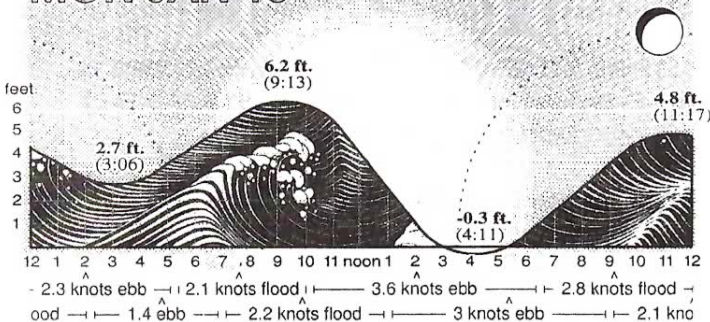

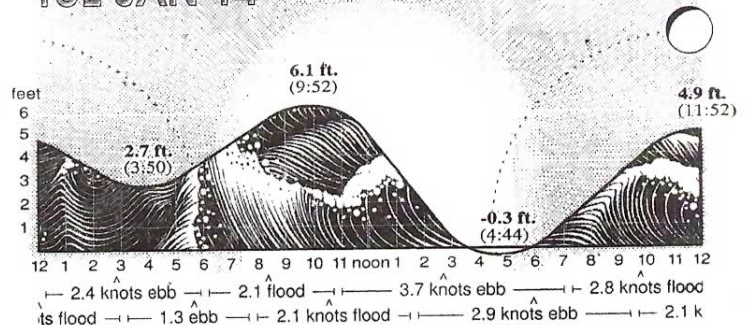

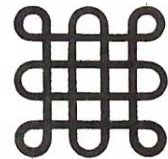
