Today we are lucky to have a second New Year's Day holiday, so that gives us an opportunity to get our Resolutions and "thank you's" firmly in place. Thanks to Just Friends and the Bo Community Center for making a happy place to the ring in the New Year; thanks to the Asian Museum for another New Year's Eve day of literally ringing in the year on their marvelous 500 year old Chinese bell; and thanks to the Shaw's for opening their home on New Year's Day for decades, as a loving place to gather. Thanks to anyone I might have neglected to say that to in 2016, and apologies to those I've slighted in one or another of many possible ways.

My resolution for 2017 is to work on a plan to learn how to avoid being a victim, learn how to stand firmly and not be pushed or bullied, while not retaliating by becoming a pushy bully myself. Fortunately, the prognosis is good for a recovery, extended though it will be. He is still with us and for that we are very thankful. The take-away is that if a self-driving vehicle, programmed to take note of items moving around it on the road, has made this same error in trial runs, it is note-worthy that bikes are at risk from cars, always. It's important to slow down and look at every intersection. Life is short so hug the ones you love at every opportunity.

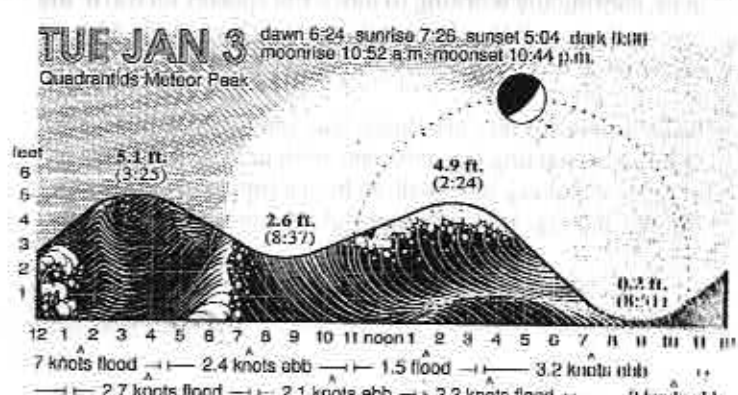
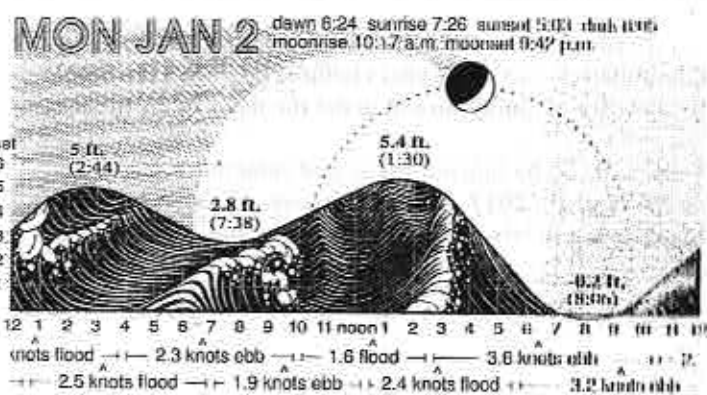

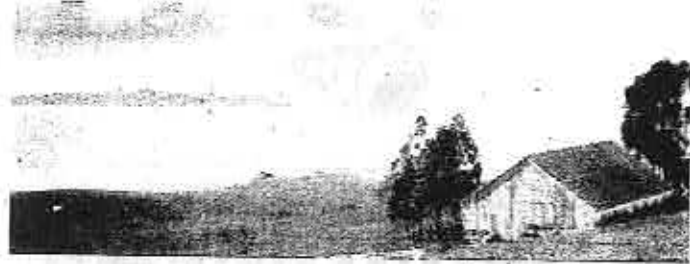
