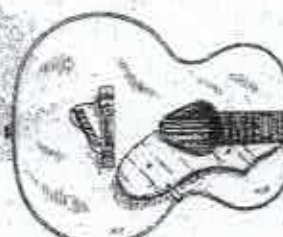

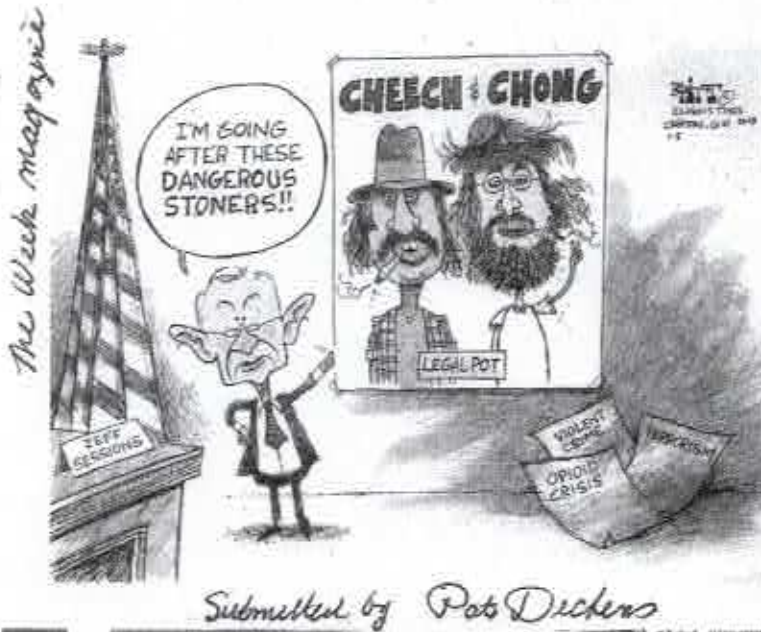

The month's second full moon, on Jan. 31, will feature a total lunar eclipse, or a "blood moon." If you live in the western U.S., Hawaii, or the Eastern half of Asia, you'll see the moon turn blood-red as it enters the deepest parts of the Earth's shadow during the eclipse. A total lunar eclipse is one where the moon passes through the central region of the shadow of the Earth, which describes a cone that stretches away from the sun. At other times the moon only passes through the shadow partway, and that's a partial lunar eclipse. During a total lunar eclipse, the surface of the moon appears to turn red because red light that passes through the Earth's atmosphere is bent; the atmosphere is acting like a lens. In addition, red light is scattered less than blue. So the red light makes it through and shines on the lunar surface, even though the moon is in shadow. This is the same mechanism that makes sunsets look red - at sunset the sun's light has to pass through more of the Earth's air and the shorter-wavelength blue parts of the spectrum are scattered away.

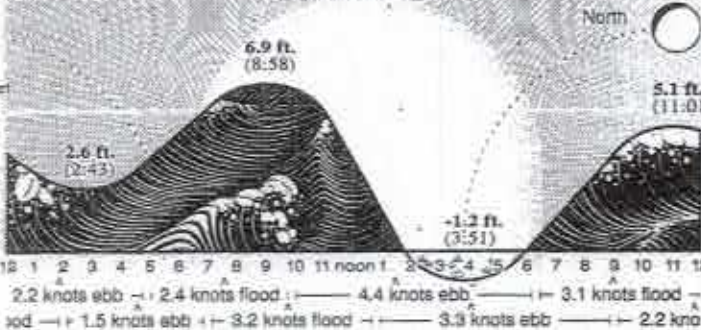

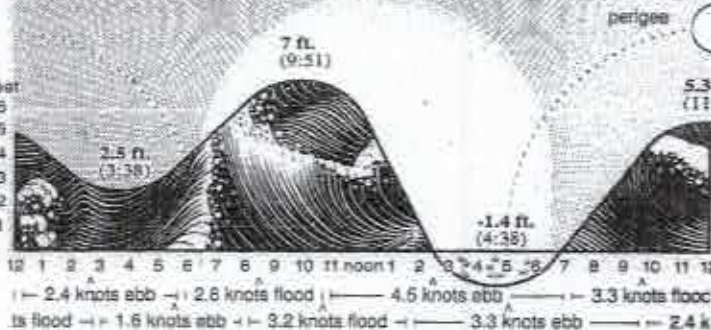
