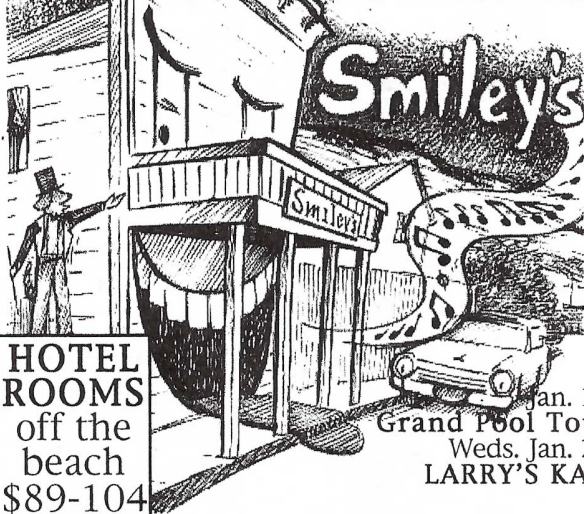

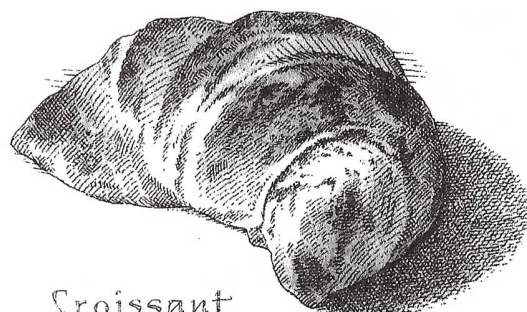

Go to Health: Drs. Anna O'Malley and Wendi Joiner

Last week I wrote about Dr. Mike Witte, the medical director of the Coastal Health Alliance, who works in Bolinas every other Tuesday. This week I am profiling Anna O'Malley and Wendi Joiner, two Family Practice doctors who have studied Integrative Medicine with Dr. Andrew Weil at the University of Arizona. According to Andrew Weil, integrative medicine is the intelligent combination of conventional and alternative medicine, focusing on a person's mind, body, spirit and community. The patient is an active part the healing process, using both conventional and alternative therapies that are based on science. Patient and health care provider work together on health promotion and the prevention of illness.

Here is what Dr. O'Malley says about herself. Anna O'Malley is a board-certified Family Medicine physician, and is currently a Fellow in the University of Arizona's Program in Integrative Medicine. She graduated from the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 2005, and completed her residency training at the University of California-San Francisco in 2008. She completed a fellowship in Integrative Medicine in December 2010. Anna is committed to providing a holistic approach to healing and wellness, and is particularly interested in the healing power of food, movement and mind-body medicine. She enjoys working with people on bringing their lives into balance, and exploring meaning.

Her other interests include social justice, environmental sustainability, and enjoying life. When not working, she can be found hiking the hills of Marin, dancing, savoring yummy food, reveling in the beauty of nature, and sharing the mysteries and joys of life with her children and partner Jeffery. Dr. O'Malley works in Bolinas on Wednesdays, Stinson Beach on Thursdays and Point Reyes on Fridays.

Here is what Dr. Joiner says about herself. "I was raised in Oklahoma, but I always knew my true home would lie elsewhere. After completing an undergraduate degree in Biology with a Neuroscience emphasis, medical school

was the next step. I recognized that by becoming a family practitioner I could join my love of the mysteries of the biologic organism with my appreciation for the existential beauty of the human person.

Family practice seemed the one place where the medical profession best utilized traits I found strongest in myself—a listening ear and an open heart.

I began my medical practice in a small town in Humboldt County, where, for eight years, I offered full spectrum family and community care, integrative medicine techniques, and end-of-life care. I prize the relationships I developed over this time and am committed to a lifelong practice of listening and learning from my patients. My studies in non-traditional healing methods; both in India and with Dr. Andrew Weil at his Integrative Medicine program at the University of Arizona; and a fifteen year practice of ashtanga yoga have taught me respect for "alternative" forms of healing, and an awareness of the innate healing power within the human organism.

I am thrilled and honored to be joining the Coastal Health Alliance team. This is truly my dream job, and I look forward to working within this unique rural community in an excellent patient-centered health care practice and with a team of kind-hearted, enthusiastic and highly qualified colleagues. I move to West Marin with my fiancée and our three children and we are looking forward to becoming part of this community." Dr. Joiner works in Bolinas Thursday, Friday and every other Tuesday, Stinson Beach on Monday, and Point Reyes every other Saturday.

I always like Ned's column about three great things he appreciates here in Bolinas. The advent of these two doctors, along with Dr. Witte, are 3 great things I appreciate about his town. We are so lucky to have them working here, and caring for our health. We are also lucky that nurse practitioners Patty Bradford and Dale Johnson saved the clinic and served us for many years, and that Diney Wrona and Diane Holzer, Physician Assistants, and Meghan Sullivan, Family Nurse Practitioner, and Smoky Dagan, triage and advice nurse, are also on board. I also appreciate the other members of the staff that keep the clinic working smoothly. I'm sorry if I

BOLINAS: The man who helped start a youth motorcycle workshop at Bolinas-Stinson School in the 1970s is seeking funds to replace a van used in his Bay Area nonprofit youth program, Oasis for Kids, Inc. David Duffin (second from left in top row) conceived the idea for the class after a young resident, Dave Callagy, crashed his bicycle in front of Mr. Duffin's house. After driving him to the doctor for treatment of minor injuries, Mr. Duffin, who once raced motorcycles recreationally, kept in touch with the 8 or 9-year-old Mr. Callagy, whose subsequent visits to learn about motorcycles led Mr. Duffin to seek approval from school supervisors for the program. "If there would be a modern-day saint, this would be one of those guys," Mr. Callagy said. The reincarnation of the motorcycle workshop, Oasis for Kids, has offered outdoor excursions to elementary and middle school students for more than 40 years. The nonprofit hopes to replace a van that in the past decade has ferried hundreds of students to remote areas like the Mojave Desert. A fundraiser will take place from noon to 6 p.m. on January 20 outside of the Rockwall Wine Company, in Alameda. For more information, call Mr. Duffin at (415) 999.5322.

The Board is committed to working to bring preschool into the District's educational program.

So this is the first installment of the 2012 recap. The rest seems to be evolving into some manner of verse, which could be better or could be worse. In any case, I'll save the rest of the rhyme, for more space at a later time.

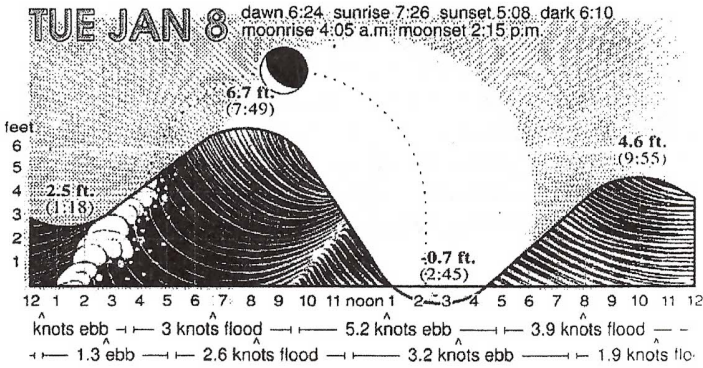
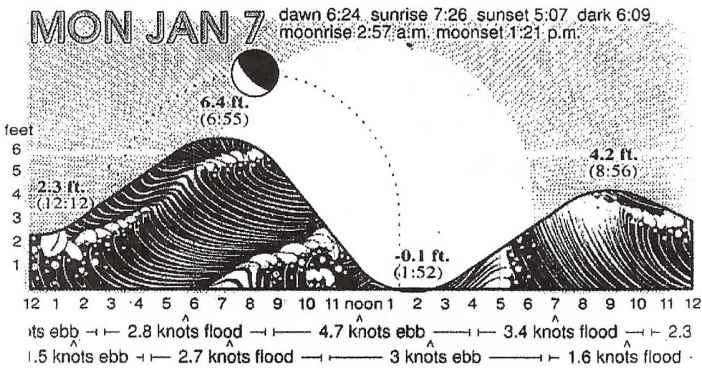

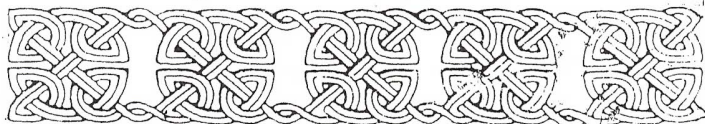

Twelfth Night, when the debris of the Yule feast must be cleared away. In the Julian (Old Style) calendar it is Old Christmas Day. The nocturnal rite in honor of Kore was held overnight 5-6 January in the Koreion at Alexandria. It was a mystic drama preparing the way for Kore/Persephone's rise into the world.

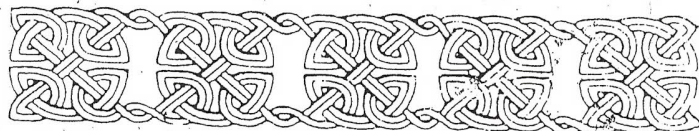
