

Another Reason to Buy Organic Products:

Genetically modified enzymes — used increasingly to create flavors and fragrances and to enhance the strength of detergents and medications - appear to be "potent allergens" for the industrial workers exposed to them, according to a pilot study in Occupational and Environmental Medicine. Researchers tested blood samples for IgE antibodies from some 800 people exposed to enzymes in factories where they work. Roughly one-quarter of participants tested positive for antibodies against their particular workplace enzymes. In a subgroup of workers for whom clinical data were available, 17% reported wheezing/asthmatic dyspnea and 19% reported rhinitis/conjunctivitis associated with their jobs. Participants with higher antibody levels were more likely to report such symptoms.

Sensitization was particularly common for workers exposed to enzymes used in cleaning and home-care products.

The authors conclude: "Enzymes should be tested like any other potentially hazardous chemical." (from the New England Journal of Medicine's Column: Journal Watch)

We have long been aware of the problems of farm workers exposed to herbicides and pesticides; this article exposes a new danger to factory workers.

You are probably aware that Vermont's law requiring the labeling of genetically modified ingredients was at least partially invalidated by a law passed by congress in August, and signed by President Obama. The new law would require most processed foods with genetically engineered ingredients to carry either a text label, a symbol or an electronic code (a QR code) to be read by smart phones. People without smart phones, including the poor and many elderly citizens, will not know what genetically modified ingredients are in the food. Anyone shopping in a hurry will also be in the dark. Vermont's governor Peter Shumlin said that Vermont was overpowered by the food industry's lobbying power and financial resources in the fight over labeling of genetically modified food.

The take home message for concerned people is this – buy organic local produce whenever possible, stock up on frozen organic fruits and vegetables from discount stores in the winter, freeze or dry these foods yourself, and find simple ways to cook at home from scratch.

WHAT HAPPENED THIS WEEK 10/10/16 Monday Morning Recap from Jenniepfeiffer

It's been an amazing week. I just got back to Bolinas this morning from a predawn trip to Alcatraz, supporting Indigenous People's Day, where maybe 2,000 or more people gathered in ceremony and prayer to support the global call to protect water and land from corporate takeover. It was very moving, standing on that historical rock, in the cold, windy darkness, watching the fire, listening to tribal representatives from as far away as Alaska, South America, Nevada, and the Red Rock Camp in North Dakota which is part of the Standing Rock gathering to stop the Dakota Access Pipeline. It was strange to be a white face in a mostly brown skinned assembly, and the words, prayer songs, and dances touched me in a dramatic way. The whole adventure - leaving my comfortable routine, getting up at 3:30 am, traveling to the city, parking, boarding the ferry in what seemed like the middle of the night, with so nany people - was an altering experience and I'm glad I did it. I was on the third ferry of 600 people, and there were still more behind that one - so odd to be with so many people in the dark with single purpose.

It was good therapy for me, after grimacing for a couple of hours watching last night's Presidential Debates. There is nothing I can say about them that hasn't been said in a variety of ways in the post debate pundit pontifications, so I will refrain, other than to say I am so ready for this seemingly endless campaign cycle to be over. I am a proponent of the belief that there is a dark side lurking in the best of us, and a bit of goodness in the worst of us, but honestly, it is hard to locate those redeemable qualities in the Donald. I think maybe the best thing he's offering to so many people is to serve as a receptacle for all the rage people have been carrying as a result of disappointment with their own lives, difficulties attributed to government failings. So maybe after enough retching about their wretched lives, people can get back to finding ways to move forward, without including Donald Trump.

Before the dismal debate, was an uplifting day of music, children, dogs, dancing, food, and reminiscing at the Kindred Souls Reunion event at MacDonald Meadow. It was a beautiful day with delightful discourse and harmonic convergence. So happy to be in this place, part of this comfortable Community, the comfort zone I like to venture out from every now and again, but am always so happy to rejoin as I press on regardless, JP




