The National Weather Service has issued a **RED FLAG WARNING** for all of Marin County from until 5 am Tuesday.

MAJOR FIRES STARTED OVERNIGHT AND ARE CURRENTLY BURNING IN SONOMA AND NAPA COUNTIES. MANDATORY EVACUATIONS ARE UNDERWAY! DO NOT CALL 9-1-1 FOR A SMELL OF SMOKE ONLY. SMOKE IS DRIFTING TO MARIN FROM NEARBY FIRES. CALL 9-1-1 IF YOU SEE ACTIVE SMOKE OR FIRE LOCALLY.

Strong north and northeast winds and very low humidity's will combine to create extreme fire growth potential, contributing to wildfire conditions that fire fighting resources may be unable to control.

Take the time now to consider what you would take with you in the event you have to evacuate. Personal and financial documents, pictures, medications, pet needs. Have a plan and be prepared.

Remove dead vegetation from your roof, gutters and around your home. Many homes that burned overnight were started by embers landing on and around the structure, in neighborhoods that have a lot less vegetation than Bolinas has. It is best not to operate power tools during a Red Flag Warning due to the potential for starting a fire.

Everyone must do their part to be as prepared as possible.

WHAT HAPPENED THIS WEEK
Week in Review Recap from Jennie Pfeiffer
10-9-17 Monday Morning Memo

We made it through the first magically beautiful week of October and then the fire worry became a reality as we woke up with the smell of smoke this morning around 3:00am. Napa and Sonoma Counties are on fire. October is our dry beautiful weather, but the Santa Anna Winds make us very vulnerable to these horrific fires. There are six fires now burning in Napa and Sonoma Counties, with hospitals and homes being evacuated. Buildings, homes, historic sites, wineries, all are under threat or are on fire. We here in Marin are being rained with a fine mist of ash, and the air is smoke filled. Everything is so dry, fire is moving amazingly quickly. Electricity has been shut down in front of the rapidly racing fire. Roads heading north out of Marin are closed; schools in those counties are closed. So far, only ash and smoke, but we are inventorying items of import to facilitate a quick evacuation, should a change in the winds make that a necessity. This morning, I am so grateful for firefighters and first responders in action. Thankfully, no deaths reported at this time. My heart goes out to our neighbors to the north.

Otherwise in the week, Monday had happier news with the much anticipated opening of the new school District Preschool 4 year old program, and this morning was the first day they rode the school bus. Such excitement! They looked pretty tiny in that big bus, but seemed to be enjoying the adventure.

Our household spent most of the week welcoming 4 year old granddaughter Simone, back from 6 weeks in Montreal. So happy to have that lively, enthusiastic energy in the house again! She had some of her friends over to celebrate her return and as part of her welcome back she decided she wanted it to be a surprise party, so we all had to practice saying "surprise" until she was satisfied, then everyone hid inside until she came in and we jumped up with our big surprise voices and she was thrilled and delighted - the best way to have a surprise party - no stress of having to keep it secret.

Yesterday was another excellent Greg Schindel, Kindred Souls Reunion party at MacDonald's, with great music, good food, perfect weather. It's such a heart swell to hear the songs from the old days, and some new songs for the recent days, and dance like nothing 's ever changed -- "too old to die young, just have to keep keeping on..."

Last week Governor Brown signed into law the California Values Act (SB 54), sometimes referred to as making California a "Sanctuary" state, effective January 1, 2018. The law will:

- Prohibit state and local resources from being used to investigate, detain, detect, report or arrest persons for immigration enforcement purposes.
- Ban state and local resources from being used to facilitate the creation of a national registry based on religion.
- Prevent state agencies from collecting or sharing immigration information unless necessary to perform agency duties.
- Ensure that California schools, hospitals, and courthouses remain safe and accessible to all California residents regardless of immigration status.

In Bolinas we have many immigrant residents who have fled their homes in Mexico and Guatemala to find work and refuge here. The Bolinas Immigrant Action Committee is working to provide assistance and protection to our neighbors in the event ICE agents should come to our community.

Mark your calendar! On **Sunday, October 22, at 4pm** we will be holding a film showing event at the **Bolinas Community Center** and a panel of local residents who will tell their stories about:

"WHY WE COME"

which is the theme of the film that tells the stories of a few Mexican and Guatemalan residents living in the Canal District of San Rafael. Following the film and panel presentation, there will be a time for audience participation. Information about how you can help our immigrant residents will be presented.

The October 22 film showing will include food and family entertainment. It will be a **FREE** event. Bring your friends and family. We will have food and entertainment.

- Prohibir que se utilicen los recursos del estado y de comunidades locales para investigar, detener, detectar, reportar or arrestar personas en cuanto de asuntos de inmigración.
- Prohibir que se utilicen los recursos del estado y de comunidades locales para facilitar la creación de un registro nacional basado de su religión,
- Prevenir que se recoja y comparta información de inmigración fuera de la que se requiere de cumplir los deberes de sus propios agencias.
- Proteger que las escuelas, los hospitales y los tribunales de justicia en California se queden salvo y accesible para todos los residentes de California sin hacer caso de su estatus de inmigración,

En Bolinas hay muchos residentes que huyeran de sus hogares nativos de México y de Guatemala para buscar trabajo y refugio aquí. El Bolinas Immigrant Action Committee se estableció para proveer asistencia y protección de nuestros vecinos a caso que los agentes de ICE, o sea "la Migra", vengan a nuestra comunidad.

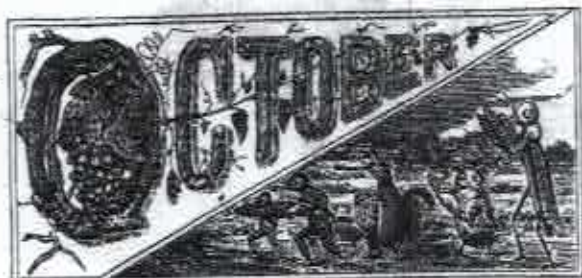
Anótelos en su calendario! **El domingo, 22 de octubre a las 4 de la tarde** se presente la película bilingüe,

I am sure that you know by now that fires
north of Marin are causing major
damage. We'll keep you updated on how
that might impact our schools as the day
goes on.

Some employees were not able to make it to
work today but we have enough coverage to
stay open. We are being careful to make
sure that students do not exert themselves
because of poor air quality and are keeping
people indoors as much as is practical.

We may be seeing people who have been
displaced coming into our communities and
we are getting ready to support them as well
as we are able. So far, 20 people have
arrived at the San Geronimo Valley
Community Center and The Center's staff is
attending to their needs. It sounds like there
may be many more in Point Reyes Station
so it is difficult to know what the overall
impact is going to be. There is a chance
that the County will ask us to open the gym
as a shelter but so far that has not been
needed.

We are coordinating with the County of
Marin Office of Emergency Services and
MCOE to make sure we can be as helpful as
possible.

We'll keep you all posted as we learn more.

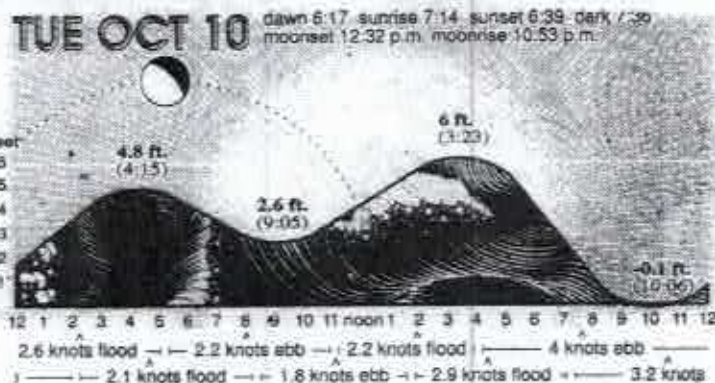
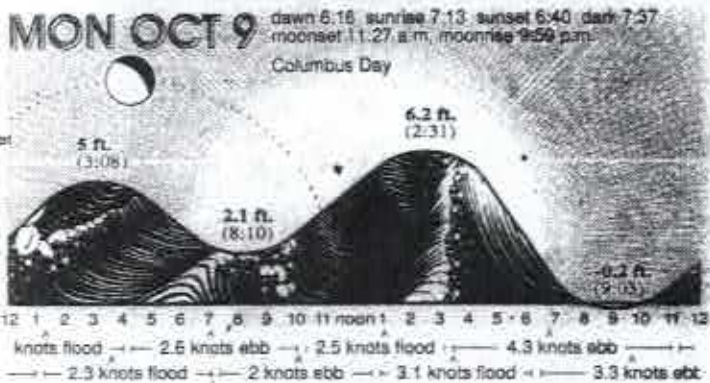
