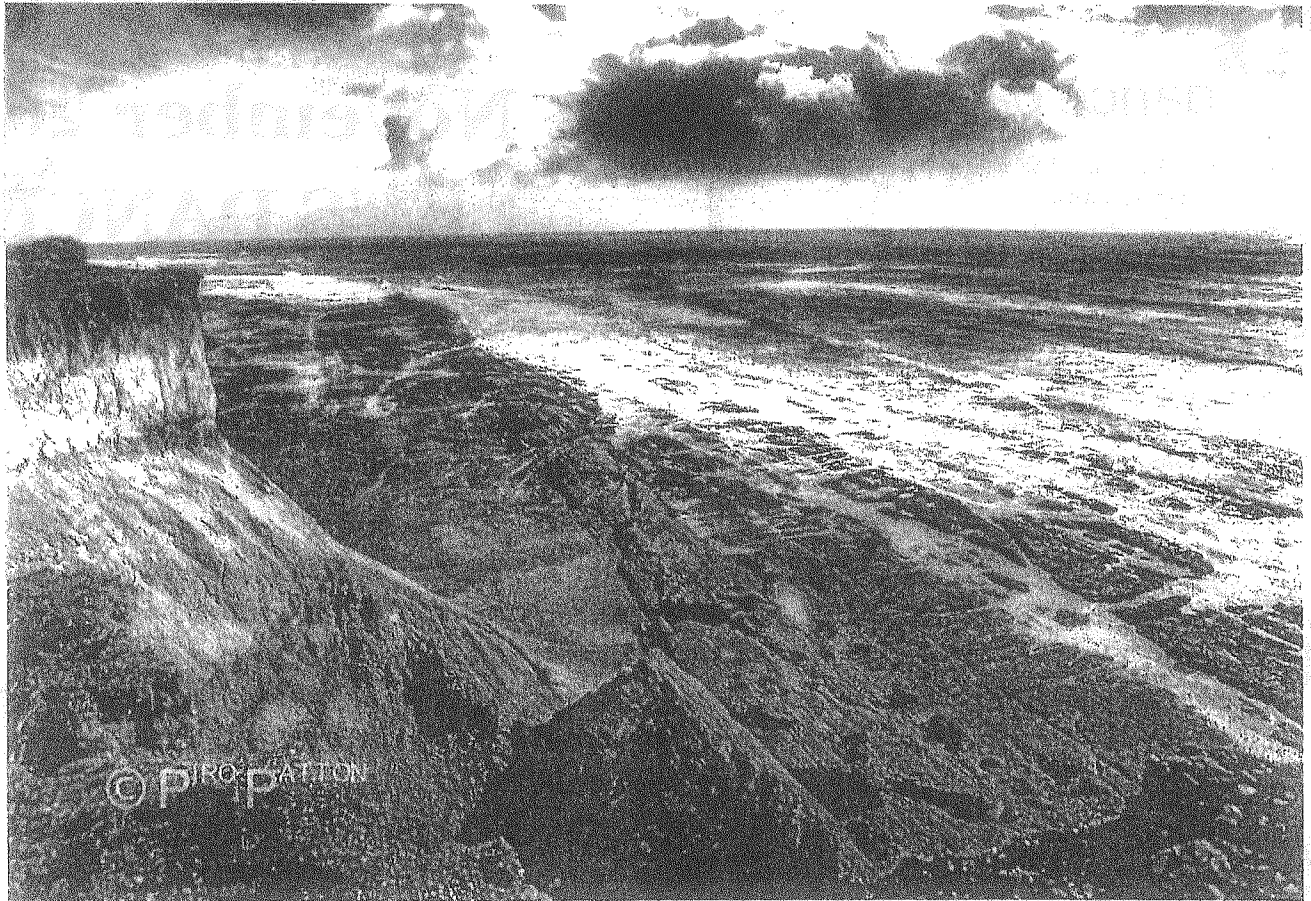

**First 5 Marin  
grant awarded**

Bolinas-Stinson School trustees were ecstatic Tuesday as Superintendent Larry Enos announced a \$25,000 grant from First 5 Marin to study the feasibility of developing a "universal" publicly funded preschool for three- to five-year olds living within the district.

There now are 35 to 40 preschoolers. The goal is to begin a pilot program in 2013 or 2014.

The groundwork was laid by former principal Leo Kostelnik's in-depth presentation and a Resolution last spring recognizing the importance of high-quality pre-schooling for all students. Trustees acknowledged that many children entering the district's kindergarten class arrive from the private Stinson Beach and Bolinas Children's Center preschools.

The former is on its last annual lease of a district classroom. One practical concern of trustees has been that losing one of the preschools could result in declining enrollment of community children if parents were to send their tots out of the district.

The first phase of the study will begin with a community gathering in January to connect the "early education" and "K-8" parents, administrators and supporters. A presentation will focus on research showing the benefits of linking the two stages of education and to mobilize community support.

One model Enos mentioned is the Bremerton (Washington) School District.

Trustees expressed relief at the passage of Proposition 30 last week, eliminating the possibility of a \$42,000 triggered budget cut. But that only "stops the bleeding," Supt. Enos said. Education funds have been steadily reduced, such as a 20 percent decrease in transportation funds over the past four years.

Educators are warily watching developments in Sacramento on school finance reform—specifically, the impact on Basic Aid districts such as Bolinas-Stinson [and Shoreline, Lagunitas and Nicasio] of a "weighted student formula," Governor Brown's pet idea. The formula would include a base "weight" of funding per student plus extra amounts for English learners and low-income students. It would wrap up most categorical, or restricted, funding into a block grant program. No specifics on any of it have been decided.

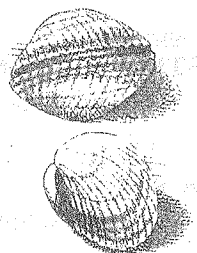
Principal Elaine Doss reported \$2,245 in funding from the Bolinas-Stinson Beach School Foundation for a fourth grade Yosemite trip and class book, a school wide trip to the San Francisco Symphony, a fourth and fifth grade trip to the Museum of the American Indian, and a new reading book.

Doss also reported the results of California's Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) "continue to show progress

over time." The state target of an overall 800 Academic Performance Index was surpassed at 844 in spring 2012, up from 843 in 2011, and 816 in 2010. Doss distributed a comparison chart of other local schools [Citizen, 10/18/12], noting that only Nicasio School had a higher overall score.

Seventy-five percent of Bolinas-Stinson students scored at the "proficient" or "advanced" level in English-Language Arts and 67 percent did so in mathematics. Ninety percent of English learners made progress in learning the language, compared to 63 percent statewide, based on the state's School Quality Snapshot. Eleven percent of students in 2011-2012 were English language learners.

Trustees also passed an anti-bullying policy and amended the policy on transfer applications from students bullied in their home districts. State law requires they be given priority in order to escape the district where they have been victimized.

Oh, dear. John will be so missed. The mellow afternoon swims in their beautiful garden, with John always having interesting <sup>THINGS</sup> to tell me he was into. A lot of times he talked to me <sup>ABOUT THE</sup> Diggers, and in Emmett Grogan's book, Ringolevio, there's a magnificent scene of John delivering a baby at the home of one of the Digger families. <sup>DIGGER BATMAN IS BORN!</sup>

John was an enthusiastic appreciator of life and although he was kind of hard to get to know sometimes, he was kind to me, unfailingly, and put me at ease. I remember the twinkle <sup>in</sup> his eyes when he was telling me about the part of a pig <sup>YAWS</sup> they put into his heart. He said, "I'm part hog!"

Of course his history in Bolinas was long and the weekends at the Brighton house were always so mellow and fun. He got hung in effigy for stopping a hepatitis outbreak. How weird, what B.S. -- only in Bolinas!!!

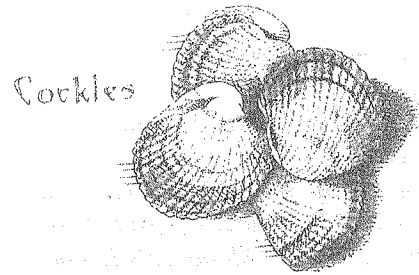
I wrote this out longhand early <sup>SON</sup> on the bench at the end of Wharf, high tide, crab season, thinking about his wife's spectacularly poetic scattering of ashes, the procession from Horseshoe Hill with her ashes in the back of the exotic <sup>SON</sup> drawn carriage at dawn and that bagpiper playing as the tide went out.


Now, typing this over for the Hearsay in the Library I'll just say obviously not all the good die young. And thank you, Dr. Doss, for being helpful and like a Dad when I was a teen-aged juvenile delinquent. He and Margot helped straighten out many a thing for many people, I suspect. They knew how to travel, live, eat well and hang out!!!
