There will be more information coming out soon, and they will be looking for 20 volunteers to participate in this exciting trial.

Otherwise, a beautiful weather week, and lots of good art downtown. I loved the show at the Bolinas Gallery, some beautiful wood pieces from Tripp Carpenter and Kim McNeelan, and mixed media by Alison McLennan, Jude Fletcher, and H.J. Mooii. The work was beautiful, imaginative, and well crafted.

may be eligible, just check with me first.

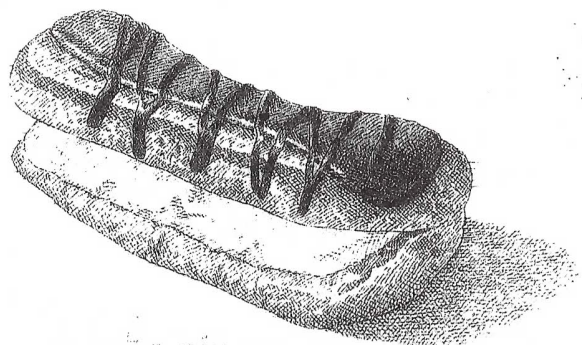
The class will focus on developing respect for
