



Traditionally, March is "In like a lion, out like a lamb" and although we have had some breezy days, it's been a very springlike start to the month, a great time to clear some clutter, gather some items together and get ready for the 2ND SATURDAY SALE this weekend. at Brighton Square, next to the post office. The couple of rainy days forecast for midweek should be over by then, with a good day for Saturday's 11:00 to 3:00 sale.

It was another full calendar in Bolinas this past week. On Tuesday, I had an opportunity to travel to Harmony School District in Occidental with some members of the school's "Green Team" to visit the Piedmont Garden. It's a beautiful acre school farm garden, that incorporates K-8 core curriculum in the biological sciences, as well as literacy through journal writing, with a nutrition and cooking program for the school. The garden provides food for the lunch program, and an outdoor classroom that gives students a "Botany on Your Plate" hands on learning experience. It is a very impressive teaching garden, nestled in between a beautiful redwood grove and a salmon/ steelhead creek where the children are working on a salmon spawning project to help rebuild the fish population in the stream. I am very enthused at the idea of incorporating such a garden program at our school. It seems a natural fit, surrounded as we are with so many excellent organic farms.

Wednesday night was the last Wednesday of February, so Midnight on the Water was helping celebrate all the February birthdays with cake and Celtic & traditional tunes at Smiley's, at our regular monthly session. It was great to see Annie Crotts back at the bar, along with other enthusiastic supporters of lively music, ready to take to

the dance floor with some high stepping.

The weekend was full of beach weather and art. There were some graffiti artists at work at the beach (like the art, but hate the toxic fumes from the spray cans that inhibit the deep breathing of the healthy sea air). At the Bolinas Gallery, Judy Molyneux had a brilliant, colorful "Spring Forward" exhibit opening, with vibrant depiction's of catastrophic results of climate change on some Bay Area landscape icons - an artist's cautionary tale using a palate as hot as global warming. I enjoy seeing the evolution of Judy's work, from the peaceful pastorals and seascapes of her earlier work, to lively snapshots of community celebrations, into bolder use of color and style. Her three books, chronicling her work, are available at Uniquities Variety. I recommend them.

Farther on down the road toward-out-of-town, Shehera and son Kayanti Kootz were having an art party at Murch's farm stand, celebrating their new efforts. Shehera has an amazing amount of work, representing endless hours of delicate colorful painting on pottery, each one more luscious than the last, so exquisite when seen all together. Kayanti has been busy taking his camera for outings, with some interesting results. He is an up and coming photographic artist to watch. I am happy to see another graduate of the Bolinas art program showing work. I am looking forward to more.

Saturday night the Mann family farm (formerly the Warren Hellman Barn) was the venue for an night of finger food and dancing, a fun festive evening with a big turnout of townspeople showing support for the Salone household, recently facing some health setbacks. Such a great night, so many good wishes for Pierre.

SACRAMENTO
The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) is advising consumers not to eat recreationally narvested mussels, clams or whole scallops from Marin County. Dangerous levels of paralytic shellfish poisoning (PSP) toxins have been detected in mussels from this region; clams and scallops may also pose a health risk. The naturally occurring PSP toxins can cause illness or death in humans.

This warning is in addition to the annual mussel guarantine that was extended on October 31, 2012,

for Del Norte and Humboldt counties. That quarantine mains in effect.

This warning does not apply to commercially sold clams, mussels, scallops or oysters from approved sources. State law permits only state-certified commercial shellfish harvesters or dealers to sell these products. Shellfish sold by certified harvesters and dealers are subject to frequent mandatory testing. PSP toxins affect the central nervous system, producing a tingling around the mouth and fingertips within a few products as few products.

within a few minutes to a few hours after eating toxic shellfish. These symptoms are typically followed by loss of balance, lack of muscular coordination, slurred speech and difficulty swallowing. In severe poisonings, complete muscular paralysis and death from asphyxiation can occur. Cooking does not destroy the toxin.

Park Wavelengths

The full moon rose Tuesday night this week with moderate high tides in the five foot range; they swell up to six feet as we move towards the new moon on March 10 and Daylight Savings hours.

Annual seal protection measures begin Friday March 1. Drakes and Limantour Esteros are closed to boating until June 30 during harbor seal pupping season. South Blue Gums Beach on Tomales Bay is closed to landings. During this sensitive period, do not approach pups on the beaches, parents are often feeding and swimming nearby and may abandon the pup.

Northern elephant seal pups are gathering in 'weaner pods' - they have finished nursing and the females are returning to sea. They lose their darker pup fur and sport a silvery grey coat. Weaners will linger on beaches through early summer. As usual, researchers are tagging the weaned pups with pink tags to study movements and other patterns of elephant behaviors. numbers are dropping and we look forward to northbound whales in the next few weeks.

Sunny weather and wildflowers greet March! Chimney Rock has violets along the lower edges of trails, iris are just getting started and splashes of pink Checkerbloom enliven the green background.
