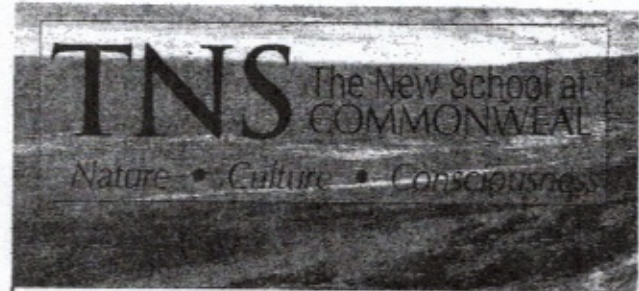
WHAT HAPPENED

3-19-18 Monday Morning Recap
Week in Review from Jennie Pfeiffer

There were a couple of action-packed meetings this week. First, Tuesday's School Board meeting, covering many more items than I have room for here, but I can happily report the Board approved a resolution to support students (locally and across the nation), on their Wednesday walkout to promote stricter gun laws. Then Friday's two hour session with our District Supervisor Dennis Rodoni. The meeting with Rodoni was mainly about his listening to a Bolinas Community Center full of people expressing concerns covering a wide variety of topics, but mainly concentrating on housing, vehicle habitation included, since it's all about not enough affordable housing and sometimes a car is all that keeps one from sleeping on the street/beach, which is illegal, unlike the old days. This housing conversation spilled over onto the street after the allotted two-plus hours were over, then continued through the weekend at most every gathering, and onto Next-door Bolinas/Olema/Stinson Beach.

The biggest present concern is how short term rentals are sucking up community long-term rental housing and families are not finding places to live. It is a complex issue and everybody has a story to tell and an opinion on what should be done, (some solutions not to be repeated in a family newspaper), but most everyone is agreeing that an over-concentration of vacation rentals are tearing at the fabric of our communities in West Marin. Empty homes belonging to people who have several houses (because they can afford the exorbitant sale prices and locals cannot), used for vacationing here and there, some for STR's posted on VRBO, and AirB&B, etc., have been a large problem. I've been thinking about a property tax rate that would operate like the water bill, which is a tiered rate that increases if water use goes over a standard amount. Maybe a property tax rate could be tiered depending on how many houses a person has, i.e. one house is a lower tax rate, a second home would be a higher tier unless it is available as a long term rental which would give it a tax break, and a very high corporate (or greed) tier for a 3rd (or more) house, some of that tax money going back to the community to assist first time low income buyers with down payments and closing costs. I'm sure people have all sorts of reasons why that wouldn't work, but it somehow makes sense to me.

Sunday's soccer club annual St Paddy's "Awards Banquet", was held this year at Toby and Christina Nemeč's home, with a big thank you to them. Mark Lucanic is new pres.; William McGovern was most valuable player with a beautiful trophy by Richard Shaw; Patricia Hickey got the **Patricia Hickey Most Improved Player Award** in absentia; I think the Don's Liquors' award for nothing in particular went to young Cooper (if I remember correctly), since it no longer has the bottle of Irish Whiskey connected to it and the age limit is expanded; and finally, the **Jerome Bohlman Turn It Up a Notch Award**, went to Kelly, who said they would need to put up a second unit so there would be room for this giant trophy. It was another good one this year, adding two new babies as Nate and Clair's, (3 weeks old), and Jake and Liz's (11 days old) new babies were both there. The number of kids is getting entirely out of hand and I think pretty soon they will be kicking us long timers off the field.

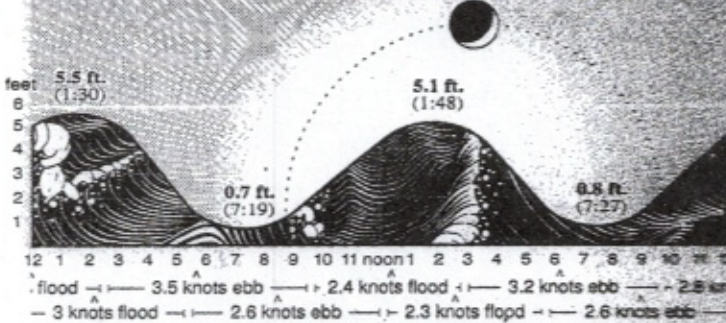

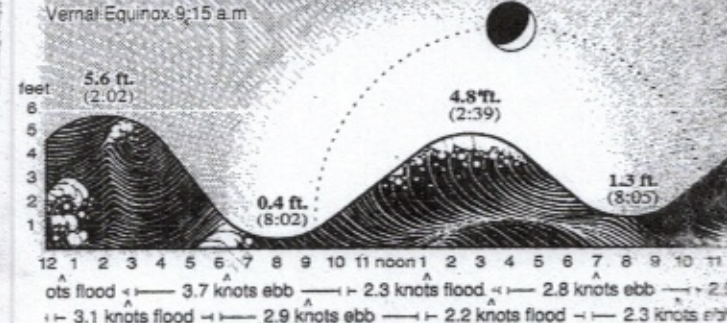
