Stinson preschool approved for mobile classroom

Pt Reyes Light 4/10

The Stinson Beach Preschool received approval from the Bolinas-Stinson Union School District trustees in a unanimous vote Tuesday to install a portable classroom on the K-2 campus.

"We're very thrilled," said Susan Tacherra, the pre-

school's longtime director. "and now we can start raising the \$115,000 to complete the project." When asked where she would begin, Ms. Tacherra jokingly asked, "Do you have any ideas?"

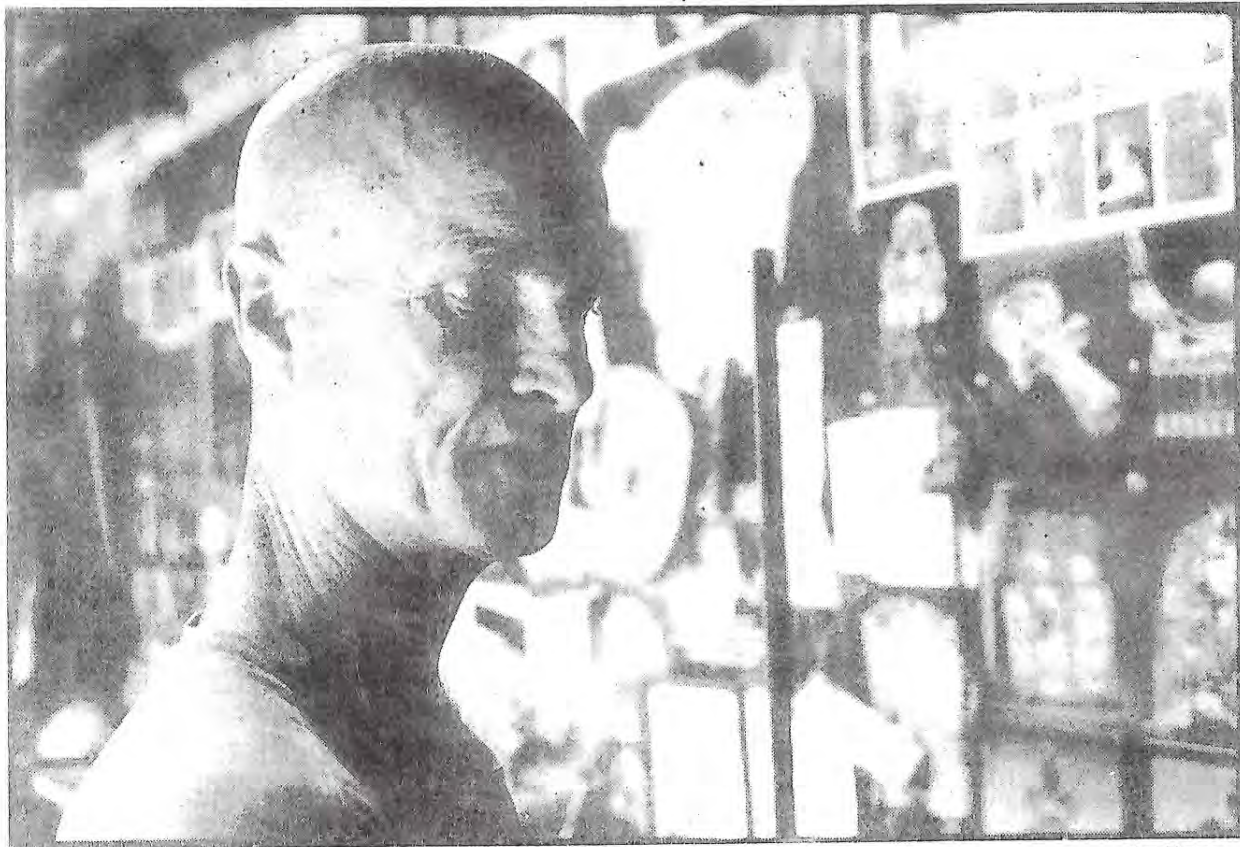
She said the school plans to approach the community and alumni for support and will seek out grants. The preschool currently serves 18

families with a Montessori-inspired creative curriculum. The school district will be charging a monthly rent of \$10 for the next three years, starting this July.

The portable classroom—a 40-foot by 24-foot box with wood siding and carpeted floors rented for \$6,600 annually—is scheduled for installation on June 25, and

the new playground and replanted garden will be fenced in by mid-August.

"I will be a contractor this summer, not only the teacher and director," Ms. Tacherra said. "It's going to be a steep learning curve." The preschool is still awaiting approval of permits from the county, "the last hoop we have to jump through," she added.

BOLINAS: David van Leeuwen, who started the metalwork program at Bolinas-Stinson School 42 years ago, will retire at the end of this school year. Despite some concern that the program would be nixed, it will continue under new leadership. Mr. van Leeuwen, who studied art as a college student, landed in Bolinas at 19. He will continue the humanitarian work he has undertaken for years in Myanmar, where he helps monasteries and nunneries build water-holding tanks, toilets and wells. Focusing on this mission in his retirement is "nothing short of a dream come true, to find a situation this rewarding."

New supe for Bo-Stin, Lagunitas

A Woodacre resident and parent of two children at San Geronimo School will become the superintendent for both the Lagunitas and Bolinas-Stinson Union School Districts this fall. John Carroll is currently the assistant superintendent of human resources at Tamalpais Union High School District, and has worked as the principal at Tamiscal High in Larkspur. He grew up in Marin and has master's degree in education administration. He will replace Larry Enos, who has worked in West Marin's schools for almost four decades. Mr. Enos started as a classroom aide and worked his way up, becoming superintendent of Lagunitas in 1990. He left when he became superintendent for Bolinas-Stinson in 2000, but in 2007 he became the head of both. "Larry Enos has been a wonderful leader for so many years, it's a bittersweet goodbye, but a welcome, too," said Laura Shain, the principal at Lagunitas School District. "I think it's important from what I've seen from my three years is to love this place. John's a parent here and he lives in the community." Lagunitas Trustee Meegan Ochs-Potter said Mr. Carroll's even-keeled manner and his background in human resources will come in handy as he runs two different districts and addresses controversy around the recently-cut Waldorf program in Lagunitas. "He is really calm and even-handed, which is very much like Larry Enos: a calm guide in a situation where people have a lot of feelings and emotions. You need someone who can be the eye of the storm and guide you through it, and I think both Larry and John have that. They aren't easily ruffled," she said. Perhaps that isn't so surprising; Mr. Carroll also has a black belt in Shaolin Kenpo Karate.

CONFESSIONS WITH A SIDE OF CHEESE by Robin Bradford

A review of Vivien Straus's "*E-i-E-i-Oy! In Bed With the Farmer's Daughter*"

I'm sometimes wary of one-person performance pieces, in which an actor must take on the guises of multiple personalities on stage without creating cringe-inducing, timepiece-checking moments that must be endured by the audience. Transitioning from one gender to another, or from a young woman to a crusty old dairyman, or from a confused country girl into a world-wise psychiatrist is a daunting proposition, even for the most experienced TONY Award winner. In her show "*E-i-E-i-Oy! In Bed With the Farmer's Daughter*," West Marin's own Vivien Straus has proven herself a first-rate performer by embodying 15 separate characters, without the use of costume changes, wigs, hats, or other gimmicks – although she does pull a bedspread over her shoulders at one particularly poignant moment.

Vivien weaves a colorful story of moving from tiny Marshall, where "...the population minus elevation equals the speed limit," into the epicenter of peace, (free) love, and brown rice: San Francisco in the late 70's. Vivien happily participates in everything the era offers, from concerts in the park to wild nights of disco dancing. One night she meets an exotic, non-English speaking Czech refugee and back in her little apartment (complete with groovy orange shag-carpeting) they revel in each other's company with abandon, just like young 20-somethings do the world over. And then, he refuses to leave.

With the use of a simple set, excellent direction by Brian Glenn Bryson, and clever sound design by Dan Adamsky, Vivien exaggerates the follies of her youth; after all, real life can be banal and that's why we gravitate to theatre to begin with. But "*E-i-E-i-Oy!*" is "...true -- at least 85% of it," Vivien says. We can identify with Vivien's desire to escape her controlling parents while simultaneously craving their approval, despite the bad choices she may make. "*E-i-E-i-Oy!*" is a lively coming-of-age portrait that's good fun, with an honest quality of self-deprecation underscoring the joyous, bittersweet quality of the play.

Vivien romps all over the stage, like the bovine creatures she's grown up with on the farm and from whom she draws parallels to the human behaviors she encounters in the larger world. She manages to retain intimacy in her storytelling by layering the entire saga into the character's voices, burrowing brilliantly and deeply into their points of view with her body language, tone and distinct accents. The 15 characters --even those with cameo appearances--come vividly alive. Most remarkably, despite the situation she gets herself into, Vivien manages to not lose sight of her dreams. "*E-i-E-i-Oy!*" is a spirited theatrical experience pulled off with great finesse and humor. It's hard to resist, and I happily jumped aboard the hay wagon for the ride.
