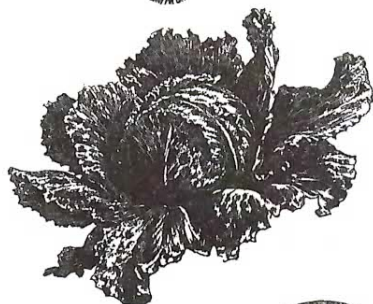
Is this grass growing in your yard?



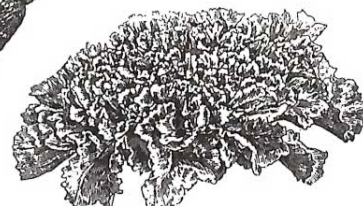
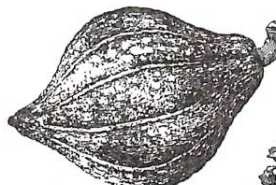
California oatgrass

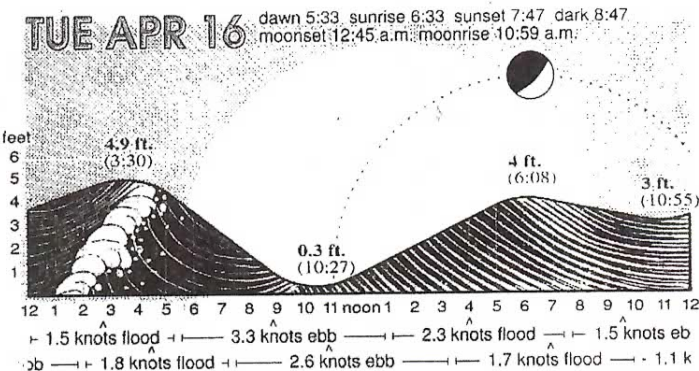
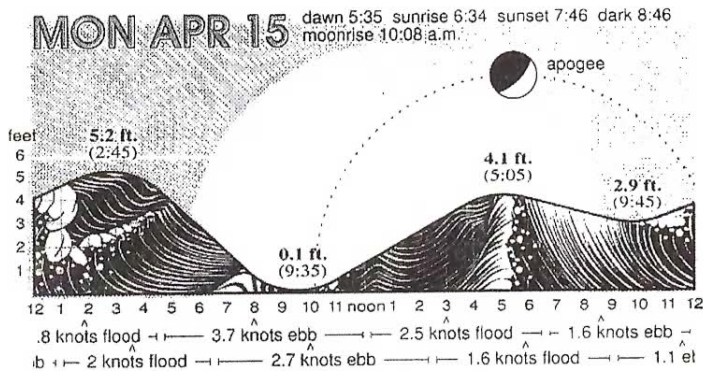

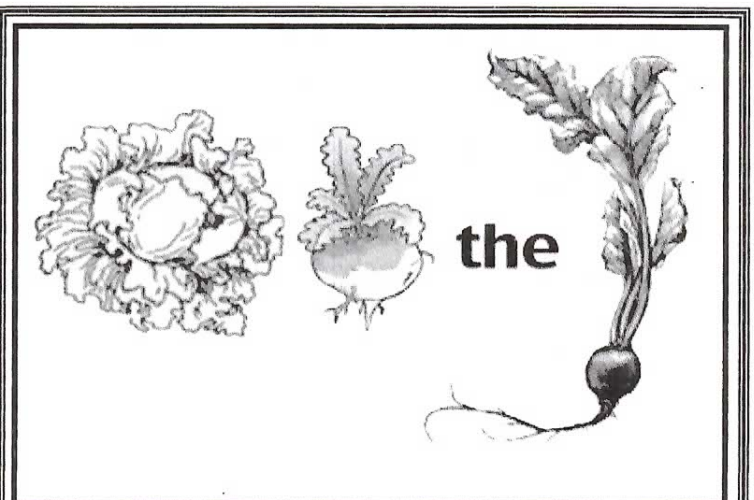

Not only was open space preserved, but their efforts pioneered a conservation ethos that today is more the norm than the exception in Marin County.

REBELS celebrates the people and passion that saved the coastal wonders that would become the Point Reyes National Seashore and the Golden Gate National Recreation Area. With California's rapid population rise in the 1950s, the California coast seemed destined to follow the prevalent pattern of suburban development. But, these rebels changed the fate of the land. 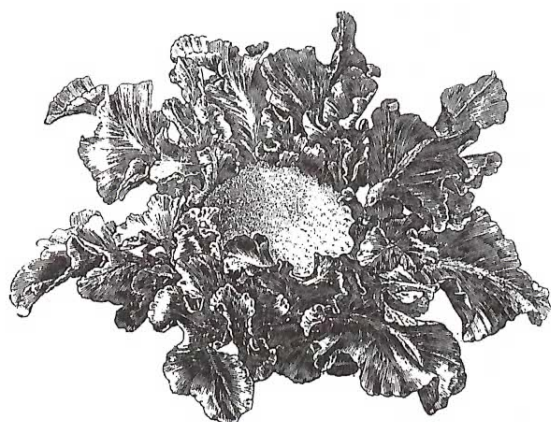

MESA PARK BOARD MEETING

March 11, 2013 7:00 PM
Firehouse Community Room

Call to Order: 7:00 PM

Members present: Dylan Squires, Charles Whitefield, Jane Mickelson, Bryan Lee

Others: Vic Amoroso, Roger Peacock, John Bryant, Jennie Pfeiffer, Geoff Geupel, Angela Calpestri, Kim Bender by conference call.

Community Expression: Angie's report on LL field: the field is good; 1/3 each of expense paid by Mesa Park, Little League, and local donors. Rovon doesn't want the old tractor, but has offered to help remove it from the storage container so the LL teams can use it. The offer of a free tractor will be posted in the Hearsay, with Charles facilitating. Must take entire tractor; it is not offered for parts.

Downtown Park: ordinances. DT park operating budget report from Dylan. Preliminary use plan for Mesa Park. [Roger] Still want to have a boat for the children's area. Alethea presented the tugboat idea to the parents. It's moving forward, and the parents are supportive. The pavilion roof is framed. We're going to pour the concrete pad next week. There's a membrane roofing on it now. Permit requires sidewalk repair from the park to the library. Redwood engineering is doing some other work and we're hoping to piggyback onto that delivery because we only need about \$50 of concrete. [Charles] Is some funding set aside for maintenance for a year or so? [Roger] Absolutely. We've accumulated quite a bit of data over the past year to get a sense of what the annual costs will be. [Charles] Can you give us a proposal for changing the urinals to dry rather than water flush. [Roger] Yes. [Charles] has put locks on the gates and the electrical outlets, and has made copies of keys for people who are in charge of maintenance [Bryan] Concerning the ordinances for the DT park, Jack is working with the county council to come up with appropriate parameters for the town & community. [Dylan] The largest cost for the park has been for maintenance and water. We need a better job description for the position.

Maintenance Report: Suki not here. [Charles] We need to reassure her to keep doing the same tasks in maintaining the fields even though Measure E didn't pass. They must be mowed and kept in good shape.

Irrigation Report: [Bryan] We'll have Oliver sign affidavits saying they've been paid for the lift station. It was amalgamated into the overall costs and is difficult to parse out. I met with Jennifer to discuss the public billing and finding the project manager. By next Wed. it

will be on the BPUD agenda for presenting the package of the final documentation. [Kim Bender] We should set up a single affidavit to include all those concerned. If you can scan and send the paperwork we can set this up. I think we're looking for the binder with all the invoices, showing the plumbing for the sewer lines. That should be in the attic at the Firehouse. [Bryan] We have a fully funded project manager's position in the grant. [Kim] It's very important to move fast on this because of timing with the state. I'm happy to be a resource on this. Call me if you have any questions.

Pool Development: [John Bryant] We have the survey results, generally positive. We'll be sending out another survey once we have a proposed budget. Half the budget goes to lifeguards. We are meeting with a pool designer tomorrow evening. We're moving forward with the idea of the development fund. Gail Reitano is serving as pro bono project manager for the interim. We met with the BPUD last month. We need to talk with MP board about the water meter to be moved from DT to MP once that's been scheduled. Belle gave us the records for that meter from '73-'74. When the time comes, the usage will have to be determined. Water efficiency and efficiency on every level (energy usage, employee hours, etc.) are critical. [Dylan] We want to make it clear that the MP board cannot manage the pool project or the pool. [John] It may be best for the pool to rent from the MP. We've been looking into whether an association with the school would open more funding possibilities.

Treasurer's Report: Regular monthly costs.

Approve Warrants: Jane moves to approve, Bryan 2nds. Unanimous

Other: none

Up-date on election status: [Jane] We should plan to get our measure on the November ballot. The deadline for submission to is Aug. 9th. We need to get parents involved and committed.

Approve Minutes: Dylan moved, Jane 2nd. 3 aye, Bryan abstaining (due to absence at that meeting.)

Next meeting: April 8, 2013 7:00 PM

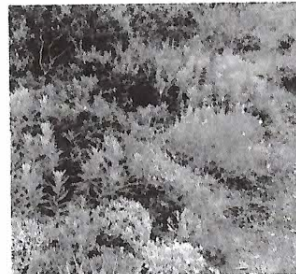

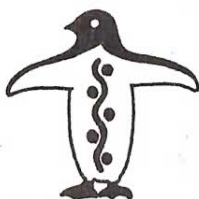

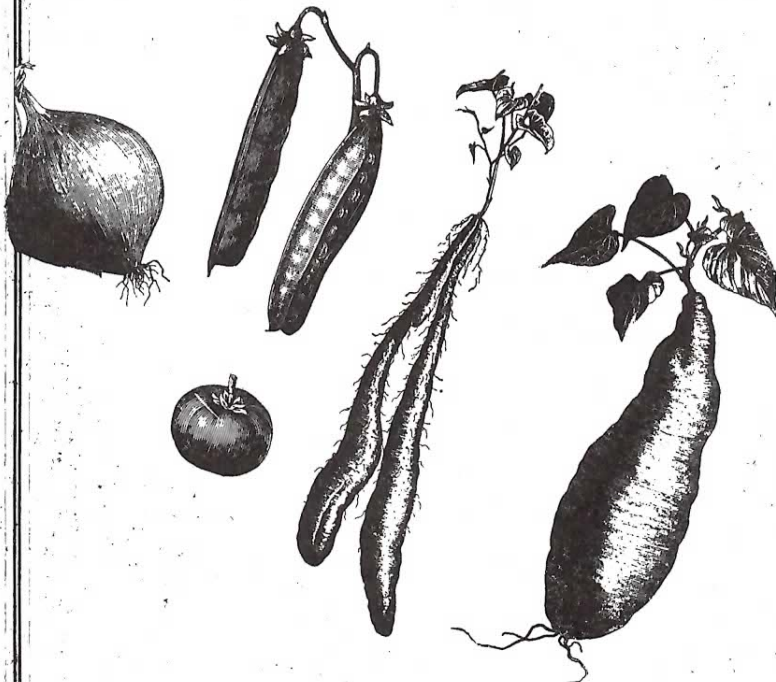
