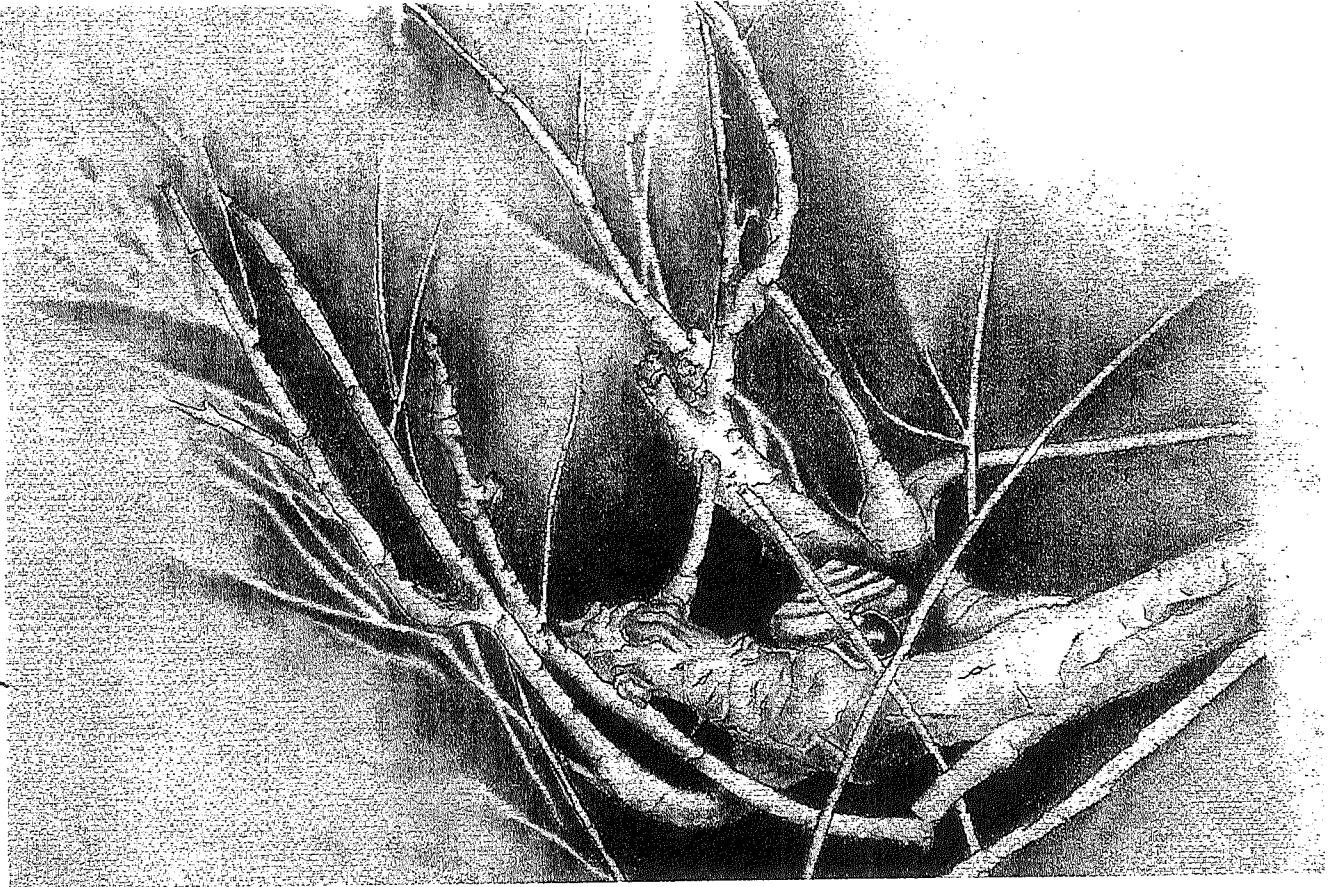

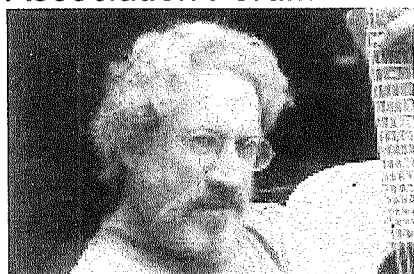

### The Latest about Your Spleen

Here are three things you should know about your spleen: it filters your blood and holds a reserve of red blood cells in case of emergency; it is an important part of your immune system, and it is connected directly with the vagus nerve from the brain.

The spleen is an organ in the upper left part of the abdomen, left of the stomach, and protected by the rib cage. Think of it as fist shaped and about 4 inches long. It is the largest lymph node in the body.

Blood filtering: as blood passes through the spleen old red cells are removed; their hemoglobin is broken down into amino acids and their heme (a molecule containing iron) is metabolized into bilirubin, removed by the liver and excreted in bile, feces and urine. Iron is returned to the bone marrow, where new red cells are made. The spleen holds a reserve of red blood cells, used in pregnancy and in case of serious bleeding. It also stores platelets, used for blood clotting, and white blood cells.

The spleen's role in the Immune system: as blood flows through the spleen, it detects infectious particles such as bacteria and viruses. Along with your other lymph nodes, the spleen puts out lymphocytes, a type of white blood cell that can produce antibodies to neutralize bacteria and viruses, and other substances toxic to the invading cells. The spleen stores half the body's supply of monocytes – another kind of white blood cell that moves to injured tissue and promotes healing.

The spleen's connection with the central nervous system (the brain): the spleen is an important connection between the brain and the immune system. In 2008, for the first time, fibers of the vagus nerve were found in the spleen. The vagus nerve supplies parasympathetic fibers to most organs in the body and influences heart rate, digestive processes, sweating, speech and other functions. In contrast to sympathetic nerve fibers (think fight or flight, excitement, anger), the parasympathetic branch of the nervous system is associated with

relaxation, a slower heart rate, lower blood pressure, and feelings of calm. Research is ongoing on vagus nerve stimulation in people with severe seizures, depression and severe pain. Activation of the parasympathetic nervous system is also associated with decreased inflammation in the body. In situations of severe septic infections, stimulation of the vagus nerve gives increased survival in laboratory animals.

Long slow breathing, preferably through the nose, is one of the simple ways that you can derive the benefits of vagus nerve stimulation. Most ways of meditation use this kind of breathing. Establishing a daily practice of relaxation can lower blood pressure, help digestive disorders, decrease anxiety and have many other helpful effects.

Take care of your spleen: Most trauma to the spleen occurs in serious auto accidents. Sometimes the spleen has to be removed as a result. You can live without a spleen, but not as well. Drive cautiously and defensively, banish road rage, wear your seat belt, and forget texting while you drive. A healthy, intact spleen is worth the effort.

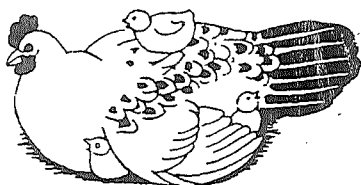

# WHAT HAPPENED THIS WEEK

4/25/16 Monday Morning Recap from Jenniepfeiffer

The week ended on a high note, literally. In fact it ended on many high notes, and some lower notes, and lots of notes in between, down at the Community Center at the Pop Rock & Soul Shop, where many community members were able to let their inner "Rock Star" out for airing. Big thanks to Molly Maguire for organizing and shepherding those musical nights where we get to support the first timers (who knew Mark Dolen had some Roger Miller hidden deep in his private self?) with shy newly sprouting buds flowering, as well as strengthening and full on blossoming performers who have had several rounds of Molly's guidance. It's nice to see the secret creativity of friends and neighbors emerging onto life's stage, right here in our town. The night ended with a contagious foot stomping rappin' beat by Emma Lee where the performers and audience co-mingled into great enthusiasm. Thank you all for such an excellent night of community.

Another night of music was at the Murch's Farmstand Saturday night. I loved seeing Jeff and Vanessa and crew with their creative energy. So happy to see this and the emerging Bolinas Commons project that had an open house Saturday midday. Faultline Institute (FLI) is now there, and once again "our FLI is open."

Another community event of the week, bringing out our best selves, included Thursday's school Track and Field Day, with an opportunity to see our kids put their best foot/feet forward, allowing us to gasp at how far our 8<sup>th</sup> graders have come in their 9 years of growth -- always an emotional moment when the torch is carried round the field and up to the top of the Quesada -- this year with Garnett up on the roof placing the torch into the stand. It was a heart melt.

Otherwise, it was a week of meetings, with Tuesday's County Board of Supervisors meeting, considering recommendations from the Coastal Commission, (that seems to be morphing into more of a Chamber of Commerce), about changes to the Coastal Act. I recommend everyone go to their website to get the full information. The Supervisors voted 5-0 to approve the Coastal Commission's recommendation to designate a core commercial zone in all of the coastal villages and promote development there, restricting residential use to upstairs and back door spaces. There were some changes made to the document, before sending it back for C.C. review. Protecting our coastline is what we look to the Coastal Commission to do, and keeping it open to public use is proper, but requiring small communities to provide services to visitors and tourists, over local need for housing, without considering water use, sanitary and parking concerns, is, in my opinion, wrong, wrong, wrong. There was discussion about this at Wednesday's BCPUD (Bolinas Community, Public Utility District) meeting and General Manager, Jennifer Blackman, wrote an excellent letter to the County regarding these matters. You can check in at the BCPUD office to see this and other materials along with sea level rise concerns, where County wants to change to a projection of 3 feet in 50 years, to be revisited in 10 yrs. Houses in the flood zone would have to be raised by three feet. What about the road to get there? POR, jp
