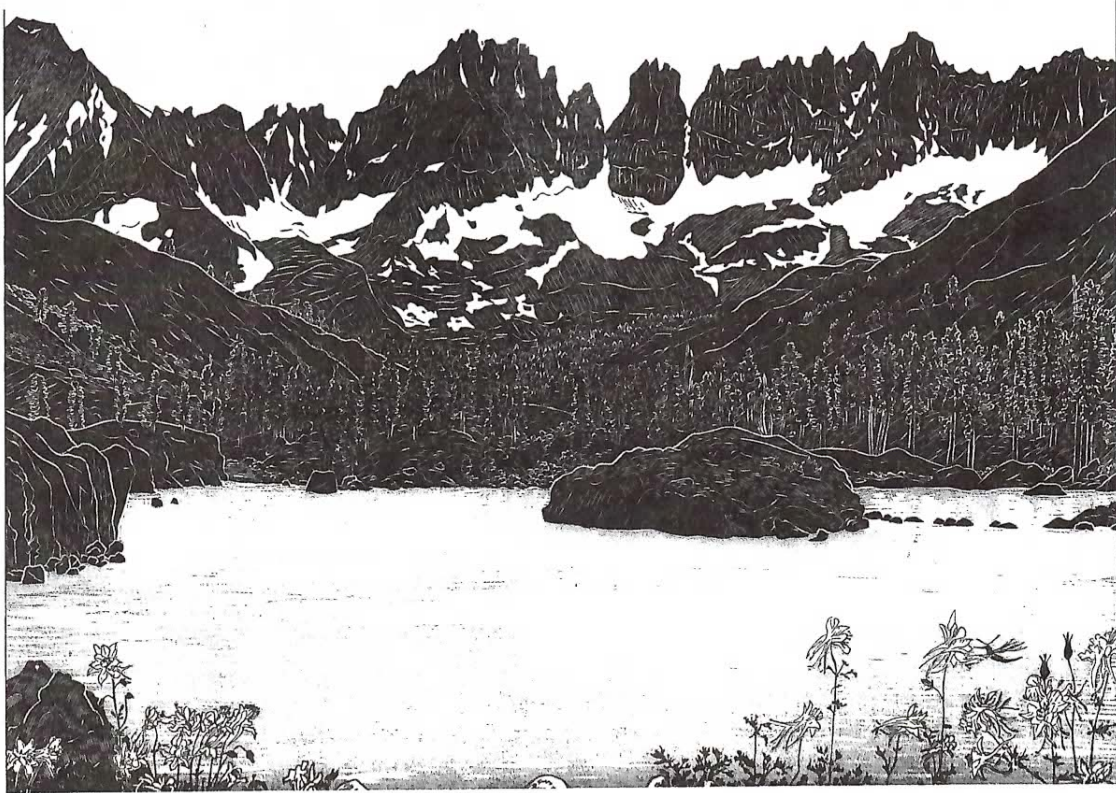

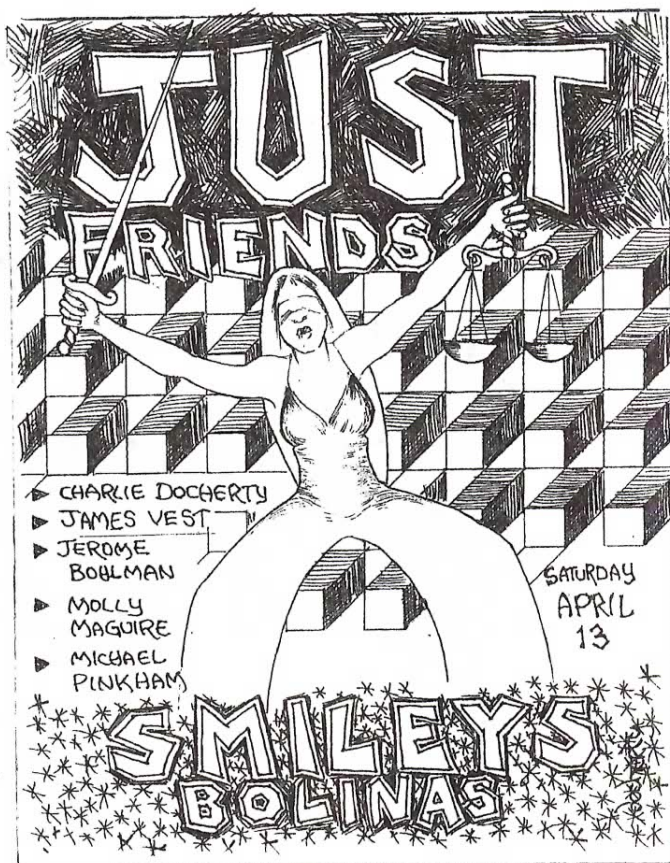

WEEKLY WRAP & RECAP 4/8/13

Goodbye to Marianne Patton, mother of longtime community member Sharyl Patton. Marianne died on April first after over 100 years of enthusiastic participation in the up's and down's of life. She has been living with her daughter, and son-in-law Michael Lerner, receiving their love and excellent care for more than a dozen years. The times we visited, I saw her as an upbeat personality, sharp as a tack, and a consummate bridge player, always happy to find other card-loving partners to keep the bridge game going. My mother was also a competitive fan of the game, and I remember a New Year's Eve bridge game 8 years ago, when they played together at Marianne's cabin and the game kept going even when the power went out and they had to play by candlelight. You just can't keep a dedicated bridge player down and I'm sure that's part of what kept Marianne engaged, even though her eyesight was failing and the card faces had to get larger. My mother used that as an excuse for why she got tromped (or maybe I should say "trumped") by Marianne. Mom said that deck with the jumbo numbers threw her game off. She wasn't used to being bested. I had just last Monday mentioned in this column that there had been no departures in town that week, then this sad news came in to the Hearsay office. Condolences and all best love to the family. Congratulations to all for a task well done.

In the larger world, there was the sudden end of life of Roger Ebert, whose thumb, up or down, marked the success or failure of the efforts of many hopeful film producers, actors, and directors. He had high standards and that will be missed. It will be interesting to see what fills in that large void, left by his departure.

As life goes on, Wednesday, there was a large demonstration in San Francisco, protesting the proposed Keystone XL pipeline. Large numbers of concerned citizens, maybe a couple thousand, lined the route that President Obama was to take to several fund raisers in the city. I was proud to be standing, shoulder to shoulder with so many passionate participants, in the windy, cold mist, waiting for hours to catch sight of the President. When his entourage did finally speed by on the way to a \$4000 a ticket event in Pacific Heights, there was still enough light for him to see our large banners of protest, and calls for his administration to come up with less toxic ways to produce our energy. It truly is time to stop the degradation of our planet, the fouling of our waters, the chase for big money for big oil companies that is putting our children's future in jeopardy.

On Friday, the kindergarten through 8th grade students of Bolinas-Stinson school celebrated their 31st annual Track and Field Day. It is a perennial favorite, and even

the periodic splash of rain showers didn't dampen the spirits of the enthusiastic participants. Former long-time school P.E. teacher, Anthony Stewart, happened to be back in town from his new residence in the Virgin Islands, and was back on the loudspeaker announcing events as if he never left. Carlos Contreras, our current Phys Ed specialist, is to be congratulated for his organization of another year of this outstanding event.

The weekend was about art, with the opening Saturday of Tom Dibblee's plein aire/studio painting exhibit at the Bolinas Gallery. His paintings are reminiscent of the works of early depiction's of Bolinas and other California areas, with the use of a pallet featuring muted colors. Also on exhibit with Tom, are some sculptural works of Kirk Kirkham and Steve Lewis. I highly recommend you fit a visit to this show into your schedule, weekends through the end of the month.

Then on Sunday, at Bolinas Museum, there was an inspiring talk by Mola and Huipiles collector, Sandy Dierks; mythologist Jane Michelson; and Camille Martinez, director of the Maya Seed Ark Project, about the beautiful Mola and Huipile textiles on display in the main gallery of the Museum. Before and after the lecture, Sandy had a well-attended sale of some of her personal collection, in the Inner Space Art Room at Michael's Book Exchange.
