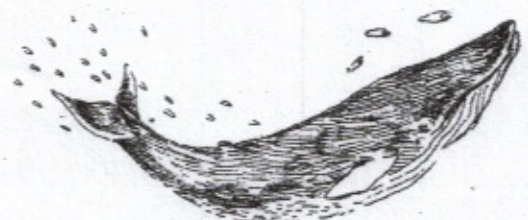

**Marjory Stoneman Douglas**

You have heard of the mass shooting at the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida in February – and you have probably watched videos of the students campaigning for gun control and thereby energizing the country. Do you know why the school was named after Marjory Stoneman Douglas? I was astounded by reading about this woman, who was a tireless activist for women’s suffrage, civil rights, the environment, and in particular for the Florida Everglades.

Marjory Stoneman Douglas was born in 1890; she lived 108 years – until 1998 – and remained a writer and activist all that time. She published over a hundred short stories and numerous books, while working for the Miami Herald as a freelance writer. Her most influential book was *The Everglades: River of Grass*(1947), which showed that the Everglades was an important river and not a worthless swamp to be invaded by agricultural and business interests. This book had a strong impact and has been credited with the survival of the Everglades. Work is still continuing on preservation of the Everglades, with many difficulties.

Marjory Stoneman Douglas was accorded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1993 by President Bill Clinton, when she was 103, for her work on the Everglades, and was invited to witness the signing of the Brady Bill for gun control, establishing federal background checks for those seeking to purchase firearms. The effectiveness of this legislation has been debated as it is differently enforced from state to state. Studies on gun deaths by murder and suicide are urgently needed; some research may now be funded at the Centers for Disease Control, and also at the University of California at Davis and at Rutgers University. Stay tuned.

Dear Everyone who responded to the request to help a former Bolinas neighbor, Maria Luisa of Escuinapa, Mexico.

Our goal was \$2000 which would have set her up bare bones with a sewing studio and we raised \$3100 thanks to everybody.

Thank you for your generosity and loving kindness. Maria is very happy and her voice sounds hopeful and happy.

Now the story of trying to send the money. So far I have spent hours in San Francisco on Mission street looking for a Western Union place. Everyone seemed to know just where it was....down the way 2 blocks, etc. After 2 hours I gave up and decided to send it WU in Marin.

Next day to the Safeway in Mill Valley where they told me I could only send \$2999.00 (this all entails fees also) so I asked where the main office of Western Union was and it was on 4th Street in San Rafael. That sounded easy. Now at WU in San Rafael. Send \$3100.00 after all the input of information and then call a number at WU headquarters as part of process. Call number and they cannot send the money and they cannot tell me why. They send the money back to me. I wait in line again then go to the window, collect the \$3100.00 and ask the clerk why this happened? She does not know but I could call WU and ask. I call WU and give them all the numbers and info and they tell me that they cannot disclose why they could not send the money. Back in line. I talk to the clerk she says it has to do with Sinaloa and drug money and money laundering. I should try sending less. Tomorrow I go to a WU depot in Novato and start over this time with \$1500 and if that works with another \$1600 the next time. One way or another Maria Luisa will receive the money. I will keep you posted. Asi es.

Espero en la cola de nuevo luego ir a la ventana, recoger el \$3100,00 y preguntar al recepcionista por qué sucedió esto? Ella no sabe pero yo podría llamar a Wu y preguntar. Yo llamo a Wu y les doy todos los números e información y me dicen que no pueden revelar por qué no podían enviar el dinero. Vuelve a la fila. Hablo con el Secretario que dice que tiene que ver con Sinaloa y el dinero de las drogas y el blanqueo de dinero. Debería intentar enviar menos. Mañana voy a un depósito de Wu en Novato y empezar de nuevo esta vez con \$1500 y si eso funciona con otro \$1600 la próxima vez. De una forma u otra María Luisa recibirá el dinero. Monday Morning Recap from Jennie Pfeiffer

In between rain showers this past week, there was a lot of work done at the school Bolinas Campus to clean up an unfortunate septic set-back/back-up that found its way into the school office, a result of the flooding that occurred the previous weekend. The spring break this past week gave an opportunity to clear out the office, cleanup and remediate the mess, and remove the carpeting. Office operations have been moved to what used to serve as our tech classroom. Thanks to the quick discovery of this emergency by staff member Ben Lowrance, (who was able to immediately notify authorities), he and stalwart school personnel Kirsten Starsiak, and Paul Gillis, were able to do damage control to keep this from being a back-to-school nightmare, as students returned this morning from vacation. I love that our local libraries provide so many opportunities for music, poetry, art, science, and literary events for our kids, and adults as well. Kudos to them.

Yesterday, there was a mid-day Memorial Celebration for Josh Pruess, an alumni of our school, and a young man whose life was unfortunately cut short mid-stride, an occurrence that is always sad to see. Condolences to his mother Claudia, a longtime Bolinas resident, now in Point Reyes, and his brother Tai, who moved on to other parts of Marin in the last decade. There were many remembrances of Josh in his childhood here. He was a strong, goodhearted young man and his passing is a sad loss.

Tomorrow at 6:00 p.m., the monthly School Board of Trustees meeting will be held at the Stinson Beach campus. It was delayed a week because of the Spring Break, so if you thought you missed it, you have another opportunity to voice your concerns or/and enthusiasm regarding our fine educational institution. 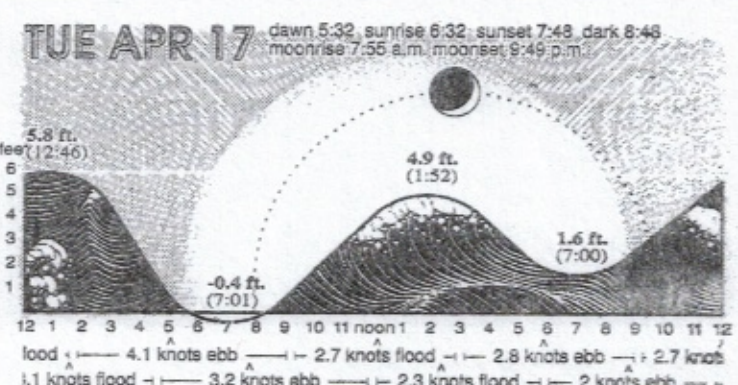
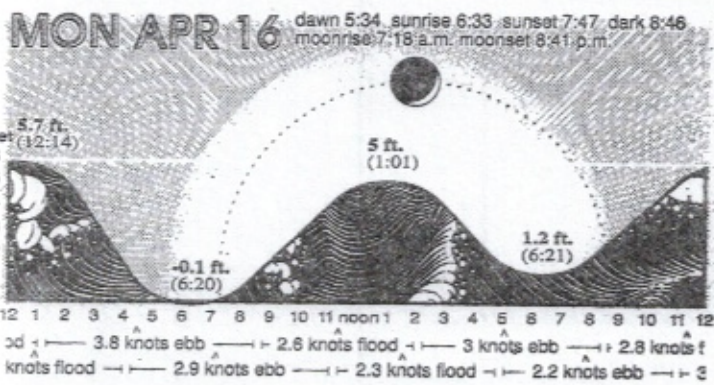

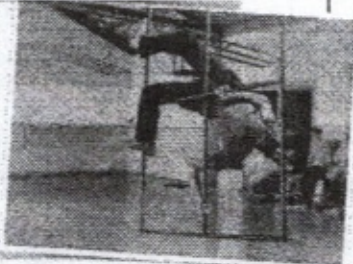
