Monday Morning Week in Review & Recap 6/11/12

the school bus for the photo. The littlest students were seated in front, around Harriet, and Art Rogers was very patient with them from high on his perch atop the ladder with camera affixed, coxing their attention away from worms on flowers, toward the camera. It was delightful and a great way to have a lasting remembrance of Harriet and her 40 years of creating and guiding the art shops to national recognition.

The three meetings I got to this week were: Resource Recovery, which has lots of compost to move out, so this is a good time to mulch your garden to help hold water better; School Board Tuesday, with many issues, most controversial of which is a proposed \$10 million obligation (that means we are obligated to pay it back) bond measure, to help accommodate preschool in the District by building a \$6 million gymnasium (?); and Wednesday's (WMTAG) West Marin Transportation Action Group meeting, with Anny Owen beating the drum for the school's Green Team, working along with a variety of W. Marin organizations to make public transportation happen in a more user friendly way. There are plans for a "Beach Bus" for the summer, shuttling surfers/bikers/ kayakers from Fairfax to Bolinas, to keep car impact down in our town and help riders connect with the bus from here to Stinson. It is also a way to raise funds to put more seats in this shuttle bus, so it can be available to augment the August start up of the early morning/late afternoon Stage route between Bolinas and Olema for students heading the opposite direction from the Tam Route. This shuttle is a grass roots route, helping replace the canceled #62 Stage line. There will be a meeting tonight at the firehouse, with Marin Transit and Steve Kinsey to give them input on this important way to connect the communities of the unincorporated areas of West Marin. This beautiful weather has me thinking about summer, so this is a good time for shuttle plans. Press On, jp






