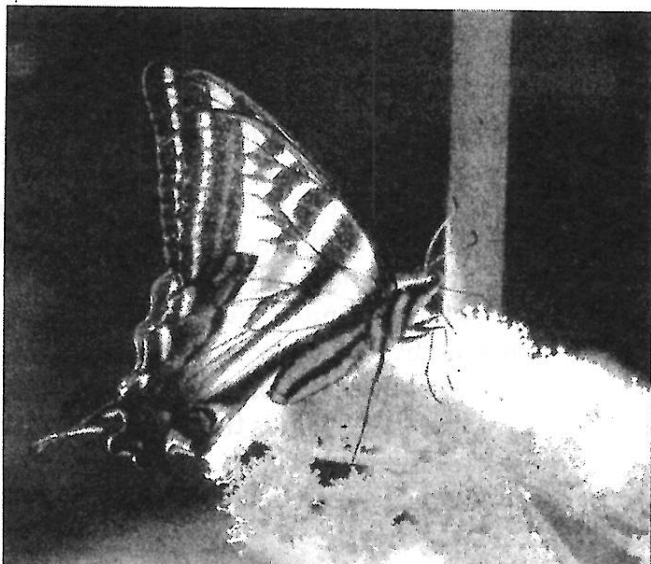

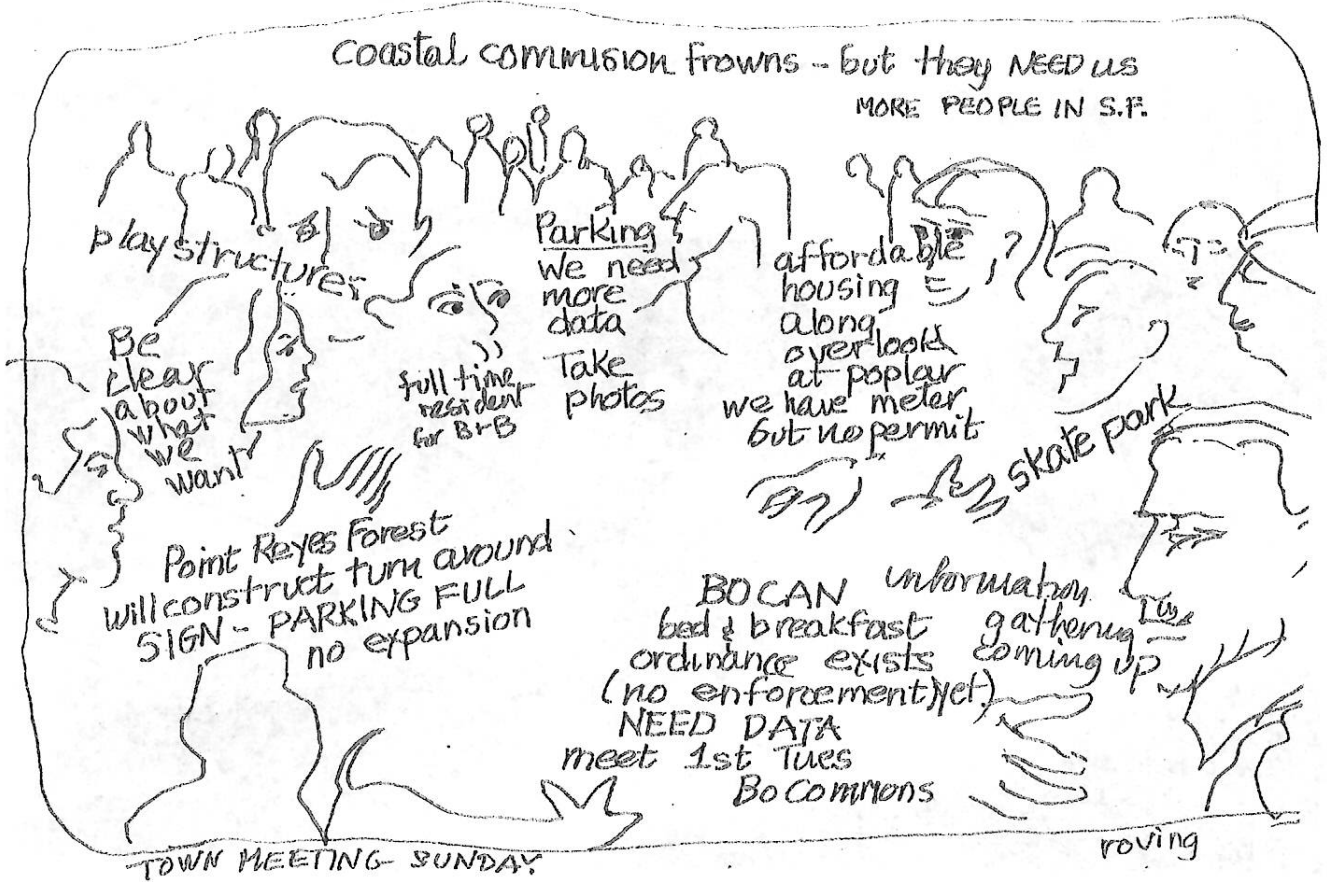

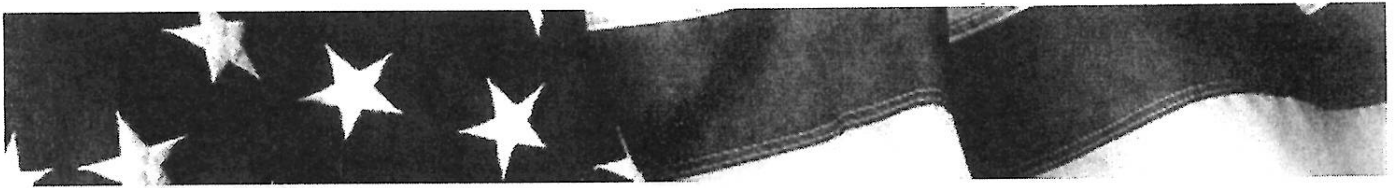
To Malcolm Ponder,

Your utter lack of first-hand knowledge makes you a thoroughly uninformed and unreliable source of information, and your unending stream of criticism is tiresome and destructive to us all.

* **No Fires anywhere including the beach! High tide this year at 1pm.**

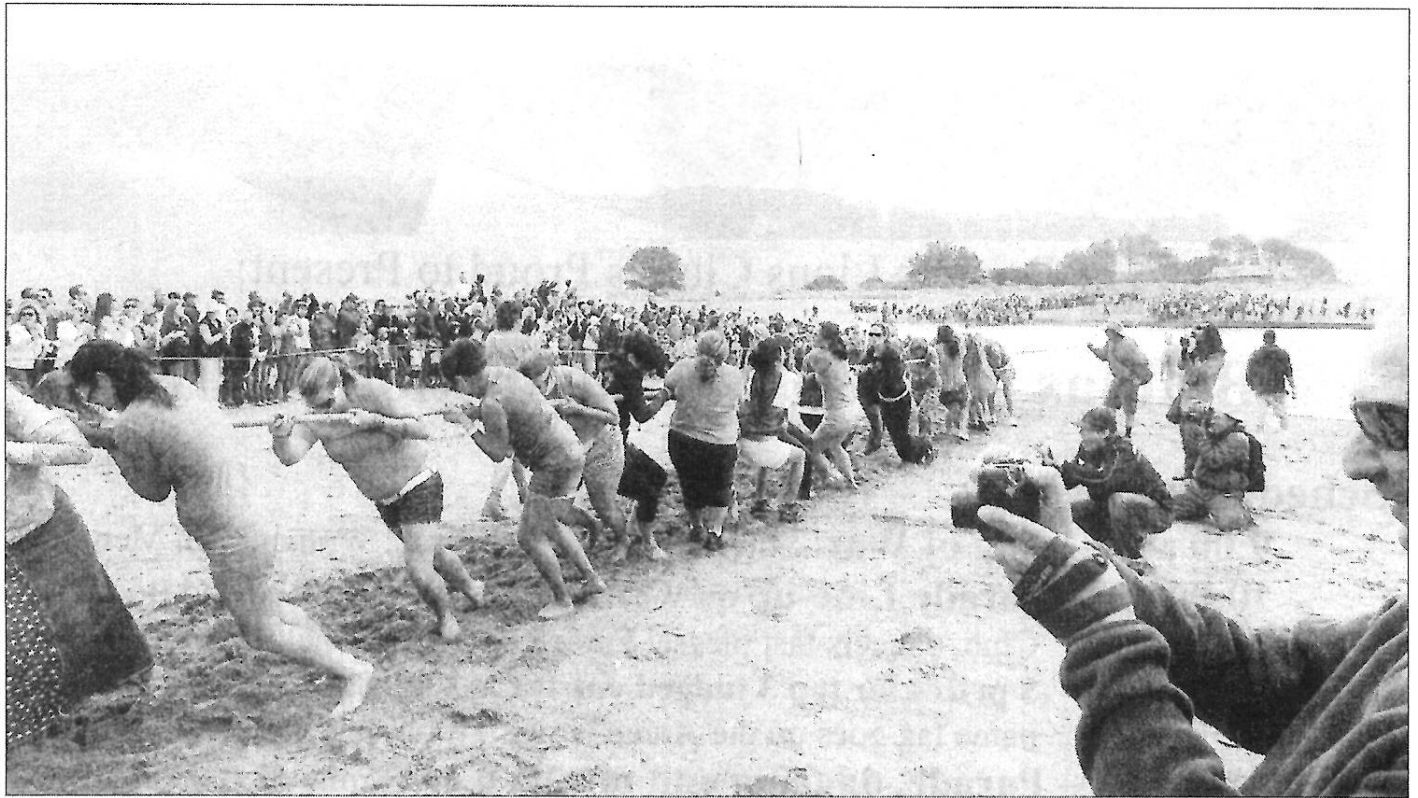
