


Zachary Seifert-Ponce Concert Saturday, July 9, 7:30 PM

He must respect women, parents and his nation's laws.

The cowboy is a patriot.

For those of you too young to remember Gene Autry, he was a popular folk figure on the radio from the early 1930s, and was called 'the 'Singing Cowboy'. His code is peaceful and tolerant, and could be an inspiration to a young horseman today.




