WHAT HAPPENED THIS WEEK
6/6/16 Monday Morning Recap from
Jenniefeiffer

We are coming to the end of the first week of June. Memorial Day Monday is behind us, fading away in the rearview as we speed on down life's highway - and we can now be wearing our whites as we travel, because the fashion police have set Memorial Day as the signifier that summer attire is now okay. We can pull our warm weather (if we get some) whites out of the closet, keeping a jacket close at hand for when the fog rolls in and cools the Coast. I love that fog!

I was sad to get the news this week of the death of the Heavy Weight Boxing great, Muhammad Ali. He died after a long struggle with Parkinson's disease, a harsh ending for a nimble and quick-witted champion. He had changed his name early in his career from Cassius Clay, what he called his "slave name", to Ali, his chosen Muslim name. He was well known around the world as a master boxer, and will be long remembered for his refusal to be drafted into the army to fight in Viet Nam. These were his words on the subject of Vietnam: *"No I'm not going 10,000 miles from home to help murder and burn another poor nation simply to continue the domination of white slave masters of the darker people the world over. This is the day when such evils must come to an end."* *"I have nothing to lose by standing up for my beliefs. So I'll go to jail, so what? We've been in jail for 400 years."* He was an amazing contradiction and worth a study.

Also lost this week was Fairport Convention folk-rock fiddler Dave Swarbrick, at age 75, twenty years after his first obituary was mistakenly published. Way to hang in there two more decades. Sadly, it seems to be for real this time. Dave was part of a movement in Britain melding folk-rock and psychedelia.

Tuesday, the school sponsored the showing of a film called *Screenagers*, an in depth look at the increasing amount of screen use by teenagers, and a look at Social Media and how that is affecting our young people physically, psychologically, and socially. It is an alarming phenomenon. It is worth seeing. It is more important than ever to pay attention to what your children and grandchildren are engaging in on line. Looks like more family time is crucial.

And speaking of family time, Thursday night's Stinson Beach Preschool camp out at Volunteer Canyon was delightful. I was a tag along with granddaughter Simone and I was reminded of what a wonderful resource the facilities at Volunteer Canyon, next to Audubon Canyon, are for schools. Loved it.

Your Gut, Your Microbiome, Your Health

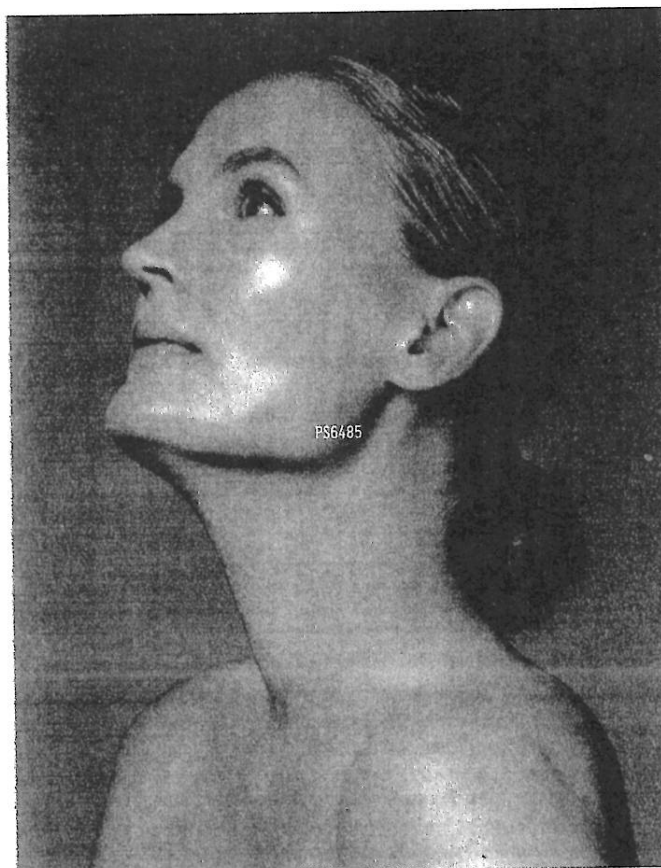
The microbiome in our gut consists of up to 1000 different types of bacteria and about 100 trillion cells. As such, it has ten times as many cells as we have. The development of the microbiome depends on a number of factors: absorption of microorganisms from the mother's vagina at birth, breast feeding by the mother, what foods a person eats, antibiotic use, stress and genetic factors.

A Belgian study, recently published In Science, is one of the first population-wide studies on the variation of gut bacteria and its links to health, diet and lifestyle. The Flemish Gut Flora Project analyzed human stool samples from 5000 volunteers over 4 years. Factors such as transit time, health, diet, medication, gender and age were identified as linked to gut flora composition. Fiber intake was related to a healthy variety of microbes in the gut. While breastfeeding promotes the growth of beneficial bacteria in the gut, whether or not a person was breast fed as a child did not relate to adult gut microbe variety. This indicates that there is an opportunity in later life to change gut microbe composition with the right diet. The researchers said that their findings may relate to new ways of influencing mental health because of the close connection between the gut and the brain.

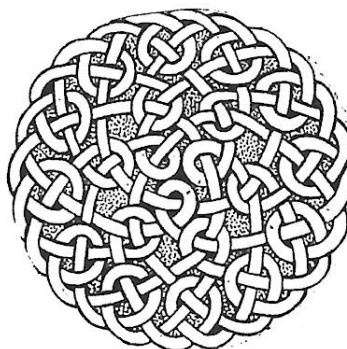
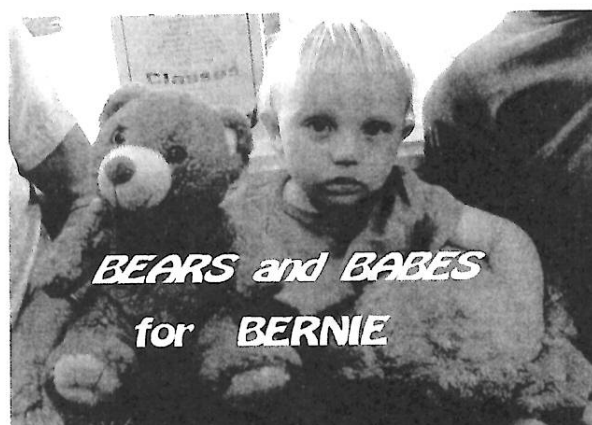
According to a recent study from The Mount Sinai School of Medicine, specific combinations of gut bacteria from mice with social withdrawal produce substances that can make normal mice show similar behavior. Social withdrawal is the mouse equivalent of depression. Also, similar gut bacteria influence the myelin content of brain cells, potentially affecting demyelinating diseases such as multiple sclerosis. Research in this area has shown that children with multiple sclerosis have been found have an increase in gut bacteria linked to inflammation. Myelin is a sheath-like material that forms a protective coating around nerve fibers.


Since the gut microbiome can influence the central nervous system and the immune system, it's important for all of us to feed it well. We know those microbes like plant food with fiber, so go high on 100% whole grains, fresh and dried beans of all kinds, vegetables and fruits. If you do this, there is little room left for refined flour and sugars. Here's the good news - there are bacteria in our gut that turn dark chocolate into compounds that have health benefits. More on this later - stay tuned.
