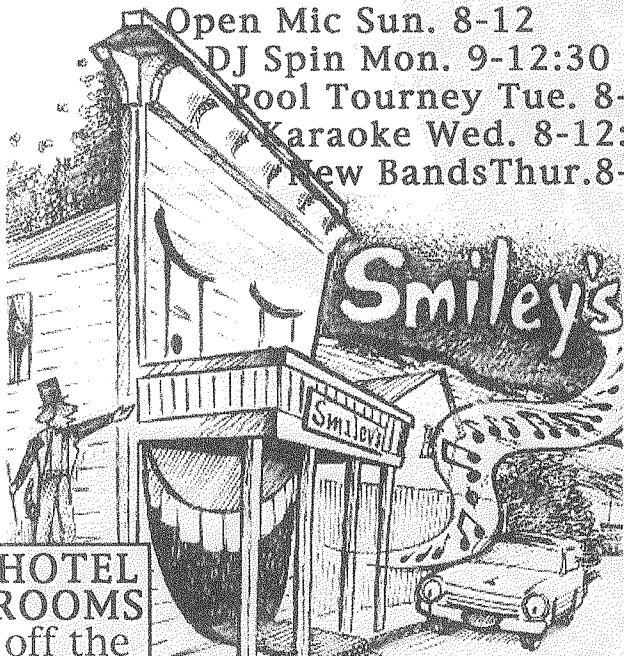

## ON KWMR, 89.9 Bolinas

Interview with C. Thomas McMillen, Rhodes Scholar, former Democratic US Congressman, member of the 1972 US Olympic basketball team, and former professional basketball player, recalls the 1972 US v USSR controversial game and the upcoming 40th anniversary team reunion in August.

Hair-raising escapes 1-"I see the girls go by dressed in their summer clothes, I have to turn my head until my darkness goes". Mick Jagger, Paint it Black

Those girls, the mom's and their kids, the tourists, they were all out Saturday. The weather in Bolinas was storied, 79 degrees and cloudless and every several minutes a slight breeze to keep a man from getting too hot. Across the driveway from the downtown park, yet to be named, are StuArt's ten iconic jewels painted on the weathered side of the downtown market. The murals tell the Bolinas story: past, present, mystical, and real. They are treasures and every effort should be made to preserve them. In the park this Saturday encircled by new green fescue and nascent local plants like Seathrift, Sage, Manzanita, and Ceonothus, sat a female Marin County Sheriff, seated on a low granite wall, eating garlic bread, baked beans, and chicken off of a paper plate. After one year patrolling West Marin and Bolinas she had been reassigned to San Rafael, and Mr. Lundy, barbeque maestro and well known Bolinas raconteur decided to throw a barbecue to honor her and unofficially dedicate the park. Karen took money out of her wallet and offered to pay for her meal but her money was no good on this particular sunny Saturday. Many residents stopped in, some stayed and had some beer and some food, others briefly left their downtown jobs to check in, Jess Tachera donated beef, two huge slabs of sirloin. Nat Siedman, Erin, and little Atticus played croquet nearby. Several local people sat or milled around. The grill had been borrowed, transported from Dogtown and wheeled into the park on a singular occasion to say goodbye and to honor Sheriff Karen *in Bolinas*. Karen is a large woman, larger still with her gear; the weapons, the radio, and cuffs, and so is her laugh which comes often and easily. Another sheriff arrived, Mike to join in. He sat with his colleague and enjoyed a lunch provided by a gracious but unrepentant Lundy, who prudently saved the story of his up close and personal experience with this Sheriff until after Mike had left. My best friend Scott stopped to sit and eat. He had stunned me and shown me what true friendship is about when he drove with me to Piru, Ventura Co. and spent the better part of a week helping organize and pack my personal things, my Dad's paintings, and furniture and books I've collected all my life. He helped me understand that some *things* are better left behind. I asked Lundy what qualities would occasion an honor to a departing Sheriff, an act contrary to the old downtown Bolinas paradigm of not being overly friendly with cops. He said "sense of humor" and "good disposition", two qualities that will take anyone a long way in life, particularly a cop patrolling in Bolinas. In a year, Matt said "I never saw her arrest anyone, *she wasn't into that*". Of the Park, The fescue is a good

choice for hardiness, solidity, and provides a sense of place. The hand crafted granite dividing the park areas into discrete sections, providing an elegant, utilitarian, and modern counterpoint to the Victorian ladies across the street, an amazing success. The downtown Park has no name and a contest has been announced in the Hearsay News to name it. My feeling is to name it for the man with the vision of creating a better town center, who purchased this private lot, David Moritz. Moritz Park sounds right to me. This park has no signs and there is nothing to say about what should and shouldn't be done there. We should keep it that way. Any social offences should they arise should be dealt privately and personally. Keep the "smile police" as Lundy calls them away and let it evolve. If you don't know what a raconteur is, ask Matt about "the jade, the rogue wave, the German woman in her yellow Cadillac and hitchhiking in the rain in Big Sur" or ask him to opine on any other subject. That's what a raconteur is.

IT WAS A BEAUTIFUL DAY FOR SATURDAY'S FAR WEST FEST, WEST MARIN'S ANNUAL MAGICAL, MARVELOUS, MUSICAL PARTY. Lots of beautiful sun, no fog, and just enough breeze to keep it from cooking the crowd of revelers as they ate, drank, danced and boogied on down to non stop music at the 7th annual Far West Fest, the 6th at Love Field in Pt. Reyes Station. There were more vendors this year than I've seen in the past, and a large crowd of appreciative participants, enough people to reach critical mass of enthusiasm, but not to overcrowd the venue, which is so appropriately named for a Far West Love Fest, and it is so generous of the Love family to open the ball field for this wonderful event. It was heartening to see how relatively free of litter the field was at the end of the day, a combination of respectful revelers, and an efficient volunteer litter patrol. There were enthusiastic volunteers who stepped forward in many other capacities as well, a great way to put in a minimal amount of time and effort for a maximum amount of good time, plus you get to enjoy great music while working with a top notch group of people - all in our own backyard at a price that is far less than the larger venues farther away (that can't possibly offer better music or more fun.) The conception of this festival started with the vision of Adrienne Pfeiffer (full disclosure is that as my daughter, she is one of my two best conceptions as well), when she was development director at KWMR, the sponsoring producers of the first Fest which was held at the Olema Campground. It was a huge success, and has since merged with Home Base, (the nonprofit organization that keeps Love Field in operation), and through the efforts of many groups and individuals working together, this event has expanded to provide funds (over \$150,000 raised) for so many deserving community organizations in the communities of West Marin - truly good times for the greater good. It feels good to know that money paid to have fun and feel good, is also being used to do good work. The quality musicians that Adrienne brings together for this festival are an excellent mix of top notch local performers - Charlie Docherty & Just Friends, Vinyl, Bo Carper, Erin Redner, homegrown Marshall Payne - and top name bands of the larger world, such as Les Nubians and Orgone. And of course there was the banjo tribute to Warren Hellman, who was so generous in his support of traditional musicians, and played at Far West Fest many years. The three stages keep the music going without long interruptions, and the children's & family zone saw a lot of use.

Thanks to all those who made this event such a success. If you missed it this year look for it in 2013.

After the Fest, there was the after party at the old Western; and at Smiley's, the Emma Lee Project did not disappoint, with a great night of new compelling songs by this excellent singer songwriter, plus delightful stage decorations of happy sunflowers, bringing a homey feel to the bar. If you missed it, catch her next time for sure.

This week is shaping up to be a big meeting week. At tonight's Fire Board meeting, I hope to find out about the possibility of having our Fire Chief Anita be the County's third party inspector for Solar power installations, so we can start a major local push to transition to solar in a big way.

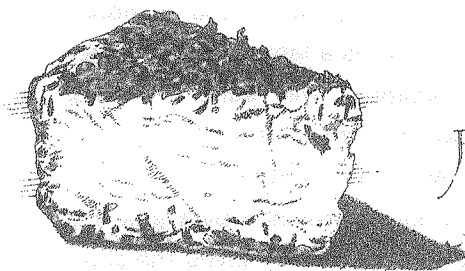

**Process and Timeline for Principal Selection at Bolinas-Stinson Union School District**

The Bolinas Stinson Union School District Board of Trustees has authorized Superintendent Larry Enos to work with the Marin County Office of Education in selecting a new principal for the school. The following outlines the process and timeline that will be followed.

**July 10, 2012** Position announced and posted through Ed Join, ACSA, MCOE Job Hotline, other local outlets.

**July 11, 2012** Screening/Interviewing Committee selected which includes 2 parents/community members, 2 classified employees, 1, confidential employee, 3 teachers (RSP plus 2 others), 2 board members, superintendent. Superintendent chairs committee.

**July 23, 2012** Members of Screening/Interviewing Committee receive link and instructions for accessing application packets from Ed Join. Screening and ranking of applications is completed electronically and begins for committee members upon submission of confidentiality statement.

**July 24, 2012** Deadline for interested individuals to submit application online via Ed Join. Only online applications will be accepted.

**July 24-29, 2012** Committee members complete screening and ranking of applicants. Deadline for all committee members to complete screening is 6PM, July 29, 2012.

**August 1-6, 2012** Top five candidates identified based upon paper screening rankings. Reference checks conducted.

**August 6, 2012** Screening interview committee meets to discuss protocol, 9AM review schedule and refine questions for interviews.

**August 7, 2012** Committee interviews and deliberation 8AM-4PM

**August 7, 2012** Special Meeting of the Board to conduct final interview and 5PM approve contract of employment.

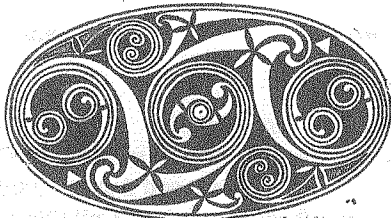

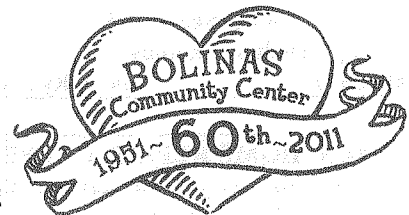
