



The Board of Supervisors met Tuesday July 24, 2012 and with a sweep of the pen and no discussion, dissolved the Bolinas Lagoon Technical Advisory Committee. Two members of the public attended the meeting. Scott Tye of Stinson Beach made a 3 minute presentation to the BOS. I did also. We both opposed the Resolution as written.

The Resolution to end what has been in existence for over 40 years to guide the county in important decisions to be made regarding the Bolinas Lagoon Management Plan (1972, 1981-82, 1994) and 2008 Locally Preferred Plan is no more. How did this Resolution happen with no local Notice and a proper response time allowed for local public discussion.????? All county government plans for the Bolinas peninsula go to the BCPUD, our local forum for notices from the county concerning county plans for the Bolinas Pennisula.

The BLTAC (June 1, 2012 meeting) sent an advisory directly to the BOS opposing the Resolution as written. I raised the question to the members of the BOS at the July 24, 2012 meeting: did they receive the BLTAC advisory that opposed the Resolution as written? I was not allowed to request an answer from any member of the BOS by the President of the BOS, Steve Kinsey.

Did all members of the BOS receive the BLTAC's Advisory opposed to the Resolution prior to their approved 5-0 vote on the Resolution? I think not. Our west Marin supervisor guided the BOS on this decision. Our west Marin supervisor controls the discussion of Agenda Items at the meetings because he is President of the BOS at this time. Now the BOS, our elected politicians advise themselves concerning the future of the Bolinas Lagoon.

The BLTAC rewrote the proposed Resolution as an Advisory to the BOS that would have restored the full advisory authority to the BLTAC to set the agendas of the BLTAC meetings with no interference from the county. The county passed a Resolution in 2008 that dissolved the BLTAC and reconstituted the BLTAC with the provision that the county and the Chair of the BLTAC set the agendas. That is why there has been no voice from the BLTAC that reflects community concerns for 3 years.

I personally received Notice of the intent of the Board of Supervisors to dissolve the BLTAC by email on July 20, 2012. There was no opportunity to alert BCPUD to agendize the Resolution for full public discussion prior to the take over of the BLTAC. The county removed several important agencies from the BLTAC and created the BLAC, Bolinas Lagoon Advisory Council to function as a new advisory to the BOS. The BOS will make 3 appointments to the new advisory later in August. One from Bolinas community, one from the Stinson community and one at large. Applications are being accepted now.

THE BOLINAS LAGOON (tidelands) IS OWNED BY ALL THE CITIZENS OF MARIN COUNTY and is held in Trust by our BOS. WE WHO HAVE LIVED HERE SINCE AND BEFORE IT WAS PROPOSED AS A HARBOR DISTRICT, KNOW THE DEEP HISTORY OF THE BOLINAS LAGOON. If it wasn't for us the transfer of the Bolinas Lagoon tidelands to Marin county would never have occurred. And if it wasn't for the BLTAC as an advisory to the BOS there would be no Bolinas Lagoon Nature Preserve. You can read about the history and importance of the BLTAC in our Local Coastal Program Unit I. There are many pages about the lagoon and the Policies that govern land use in and around the logoon concerning the preservation of this precious coastal resource in the Coastal Zone. Its in all the county libraries.

For the last 18 years, San Francisco photographer Dan Dion has worked as the house photographer at the legendary Fillmore Auditorium shooting the world's greatest touring performers in rock's most holy house.

Dan Dion has opened up his archives to exhibit a retrospective of intimate backstage portraits and explosive performance shots that paint a kaleidoscopic picture of rock, jazz, country, alternative, blues, world music, and comedy.

Among the artists photographed include: Johnny Cash, Tito Puente, Debbie Harry, Herbie Hancock, Ken Kesey, Rickie Lee Jones, Carlos Santana, George Clinton, Ween, David Crosby, David Byrne, Rufus Wainwright, Lucinda Williams, Morphine, Ben Harper, The Black Crowes, Erykah Badu, Beck, Los Lobos, TV on the Radio, Radiohead, BB King, Macy Gray, The Pogues, Pete Townsend, Queen Latifah, Korn, Sonic Youth, Katy Perry, Chris Isaak, Porno for Pyros, and John Lee Hooker.

Dan Dion is both a nationally known music shooter, and the world's premier portrait photographer of comedians, with ongoing solo exhibitions of his work in New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Sydney, as well as an annual show at the prestigious Montreal Just for Laughs Festival. Locally, he is also the house photographer for The Paramount Theater, The Punch Line, and Cobb's Comedy Club. His work has been published in over 100 magazines, including *Rolling Stone, Spin, Time, Newsweek*, and *Playboy*. His first book, *iSatiristas!*, a collaboration with Paul Provenza (creator of The Aristocrats), was published by HarperCollins in 2010.

Go to Health: Eve Ensler and The Vagina Monologues

She is one of the most energetic revolutionaries in the world today, with her ambition to end violence against women and girls, everywhere. Ensler has launched a global movement known as V-Day, to end rape, battery, incest, female genital mutilation and sex slavery. She has set up a community in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, called the City of Joy, to help Congolese women who have been raped. Classes in literacy, self-defense, communication, political action and mental and physical healing were held in the first year. A terrible history of widespread and violent rape had made such a center important in the Congo.

Through V-Day campaigns, volunteers and college students in this country put on benefit performances of Ensler's plays, including The Vagina Monologues. They hold teach-ins and workshops for men, to raise awareness and funds for grassroots anti-violence groups. V-Day has produced a documentary film, Until the Violence Stops; this 72 minute documentary is available from Netflicks. It shows women from Harlem, Ukiah, Pine Ridge Reservation to the Philippines and Kenya, revealing their experiences of abuse and genital mutilation, and what they are doing to improve their situations. A five minute trailer for this film can be seen on You Tube.

Funds raised by V-Day support local and national organizations worldwide, including Egypt, Iraq and Afghanistan. The V-Day movement exists in 140 countries from Europe to Asia, Africa, the Americas, and the Caribbean.

In June, 2012, Michigan State
Representative Lisa Brown was banned
from speaking during a debate on a bill
putting new restrictions on abortion
providers, because she had used the
word 'vagina' in her remarks. As a
result, four days later a special and
rousing performance of *The Vagina*Monologues was staged on the steps of
the state capital, before a crowd of 5000.
Eve Ensler was on hand. You can watch
the action on You Tube – Vagina
Monologues at Michigan's Capitol
Steps.

The Vagina Monologues was written in 1996 and first performed in Greenwich Village, New York City. It has been performed in over 140 countries. Clearly it has been a powerful opening for women to talk about their sexual selves, their joy, their anger and their

liberation from prudery and restrictive customs. Ensler has written numerous other plays, including "I am an Emotional Creature: The Secret Life of Girls Around the World." This play was recently staged at the Berkeley Repertory Theatre. It features a cast of 6 young women who talk, sing, and dance their way through a script that covers cliques, popularity, sex, sexual slavery, genital mutilation, slave labor in a Barbie Doll factory and more. The brilliant cast has now gone to New York City.

Here's the big news of this column. The Vagina Monologues is coming to Marin, and specifically to Bolinas! It will play at the Bolinas Community Center on Saturday, September 22nd at 7:30 pm. It will be staged at the San Geronimo Cultural Center on September 15th, and at Toby's in Point Reyes on Friday September 21st. This play (which I have seen several times) is different at each staging as the cast and venue changes. It is much more than a ladies' night out; men and couples will also get a lot out of it, including humor, sadness, surprise, and a powerful understanding of the human condition.
