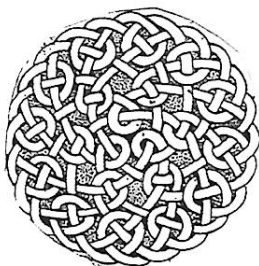

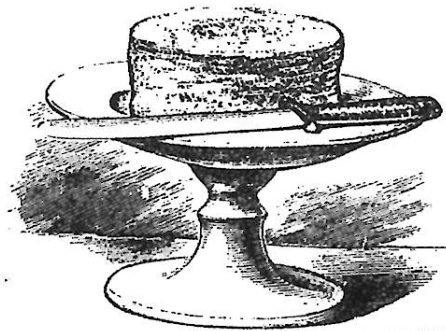
Well that was yesterday's ant report. Today, ants are gone and so is sun, though I see it trying mightily to break through the fog.?

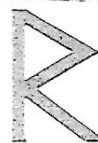
