Monday Morning Recap & Week in Review for 8/13/12

It was a very small notice in Friday's Hearsay News about the death of Judith Elliot, but it had a very large impact. Judith has been such a survivor all these years, and we have all benefited from her relentless research on the holistic ways to treat cancer, beginning with her diagnosis maybe 20 or so years ago. She gained so much knowledge on herbal remedies for, not just cancer, but many other maladies as well, and it seemed she had whipped her cancer into submission and then put her energy into sharing with her friends and community all the information she gathered about herbs and their medicinal uses. Judith's Herbs, her herbal potions and notions store, in the heart of downtown, was a wonderful resource for so many of us looking for remedies that came with a bit of Judith's wealth of information on what local plants might be in our own back yards that have medicinal healing properties. As I hiked with visiting family this weekend, and questions came up about a variety of plants, including poison oak, and what uses it might have had for native peoples of the area, I found myself thinking that Judith would know the answers. How I was missing her and wishing she could be here to answer these and so many more questions I haven't even known to ask. I'm so glad we were able to have her in the community for so many years, and glad some of her items will be offered in the newly opening store next door to her recently closed business. We send Condolences and healing wishes to her friends and family, especially her daughter Sephira.

It was also a week to think about celebrating the life and many songs of Woody Guthrie, as Molly McGuire and Howard Dillon hosted a musical tribute to this folk hero on the 100th anniversary of his birth. His songs are just as relevant today as they were in the dust bowl days when they were written. Congratulations to all the performers - younger, older, and in between - who did such an outstanding job Friday and Saturday.

Saturday night at Smiley's, one could see the direct progression of the music from traditional songs of Guthrie's day, to the ballads so beautifully crafted by Ethan Okamura and Steve Trivelpiece. They all give an historical perspective, and show the timelessness and ongoing nature of human struggles and the songs that tell those stories.

RODENTICIDE FREE – WE'RE PART WAY THERE

As most of you know, the Rodenticide Free Project, in keeping with the concerns of the U.S. EPA, the California Dept. of Fish & Game, and numerous organizations and municipalities, to include the County of Marin, has been engaged in trying to remove the presence and use of rodenticides from West Marin... with much success. To date, the Bolinas General Store, the Bolinas Bay Hardware Store and the Stinson Beach Market have all agreed to forego the sale of rodenticides in favor of non-toxic alternatives...AND, gratefully, many of you in West Marin have agreed to participate.

THE NEXT STEP – PEST CONTROL COMPANIES

Various individuals, businesses and property owners/managers still rely upon the services of pest control companies to address their rodent problems and SOME of these companies use poisons...BUT NOT ALL. Those that don't, rely mostly on exclusion (eliminating the ability of rodents to enter a given premises) and trapping.

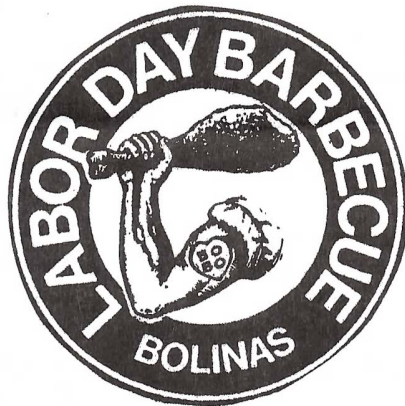
All pest control companies operating in West Marin have been contacted, advised of efforts to make West Marin communities' rodenticide free AND, asked to participate.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO MAKE WEST MARIN...RODENTICIDE FREE

In addition to personally foregoing the use of rodent poisons, if you contract with a pest management company, please ask that company to use ONLY non-toxic methods when addressing your rodent problem(s). If they refuse, then consider using a company that will comply...of which there are a few. (Referrals available upon request).
