Brenda Fitzgerald, MD, former state health commissioner for Georgia, has been named director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. She is an obstetriciangynecologist with a major interest in maternal and child health. In addition to many years of private practice in Georgia, she was president of the Georgia Obstetrical and Gynecological Society, where she made early childhood development a priority. She is a member of the American Public Health Association, (APHA) a liberal group, which has endorsed her new position. The APHA director has said that "Dr. Fitzgerald is more than prepared to face the health challenges of our time, including Zika, Ebola and our growing burden of chronic disease" Fitzgerald has been quoted as saying that abortion is a matter between a pregnant woman and her doctor. Dr. Fitzgerald is a republican, and a past friend of Newt Gingrich. She has been criticized for accepting funds from Coca Cola to implement an exercise program for children in Georgia. Readers may know that Coca Cola and other soft drink companies emphasize the role of exercise in weight loss and minimize the role of sweetened beverages.

President Trump nominated Jerome Adams, MD, MPH, to serve as U.S. Surgeon General. Adams has been confirmed by the Senate. Adams is an anesthesiologist and assistant professor of anesthesia at the Indiana University School of Medicine. He served under Mike Pence as Indiana's state health Commissioner. In this job, he was concerned with the growing opioid epidemic and a rapid rise in cases of HIV and hepatitis C from needle sharing. He reluctantly became a supporter of clean needle exchanges. He has a master's degree in public health from U.C. Berkeley where he worked with the city to develop a chronic disease prevention plan. He has worked with medical research projects in Zimbabwe and the Netherlands. Dr. Adams is an African American. As Surgeon General he plans to focus on the opioid epidemic and untreated mental illness. The APHA has praised the nomination of Dr. Adams.

Noticias interesantes sobre la salud de la Casa Blanca!

Brenda Fitzgerald, MD, ex comisionada estatal de salud de Georgia, ha sido nombrada directora de los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades. Es ginecóloga obstétrica con un gran interés en la salud materno-infantil. Además de muchos años de práctica privada en Georgia, fue presidenta de la Georgia Obstetrical and Gynecological Society, donde hizo del desarrollo de la primera infancia una prioridad. Es miembro de la Asociación Americana de Salud Pública (APHA, por sus siglas en inglés), un grupo liberal que ha respaldado su nueva posición. El director de la APHA ha dicho que "Dr. Fitzgerald está más que preparado para afrontar los retos de salud de nuestro tiempo, incluyendo Zika, Ebola y nuestra creciente carga de enfermedades crónicas. "Fitzgerald ha sido citado diciendo que el aborto es un asunto entre una mujer embarazada y su médico. El Dr. Fitzgerald es un republicano, y un amigo pasado de Newt Gingrich. Ella ha sido criticada por aceptar fondos de Coca Cola para implementar un programa de ejercicios para niños en Georgia. Los lectores pueden saber que Coca Cola y otras compañías de refrescos enfatizan el papel del ejercicio en la pérdida de peso y minimizan el papel de las bebidas endulzadas.

El Prèsidente Trump nombró al Dr. Jerome Adams, MD, MPH, para servir como Cirujano General de los Estados Unidos. Adams ha sido confirmado por el Senado. Adams es un anestesiólogo y profesor asistente de anestesia en la Escuela de Medicina de la Universidad de Indiana. Sirvió bajo Mike Pence como comisionado de salud estatal de Indiana. En este trabajo, le preocupaba la creciente epidemia de opiáceos y un rápido aumento de los casos de VIH y hepatitis C por compartir agujas. De mala gana se convirtió en un partidario de los intercambios de agujas limpias. Tiene una maestría en salud pública de la




