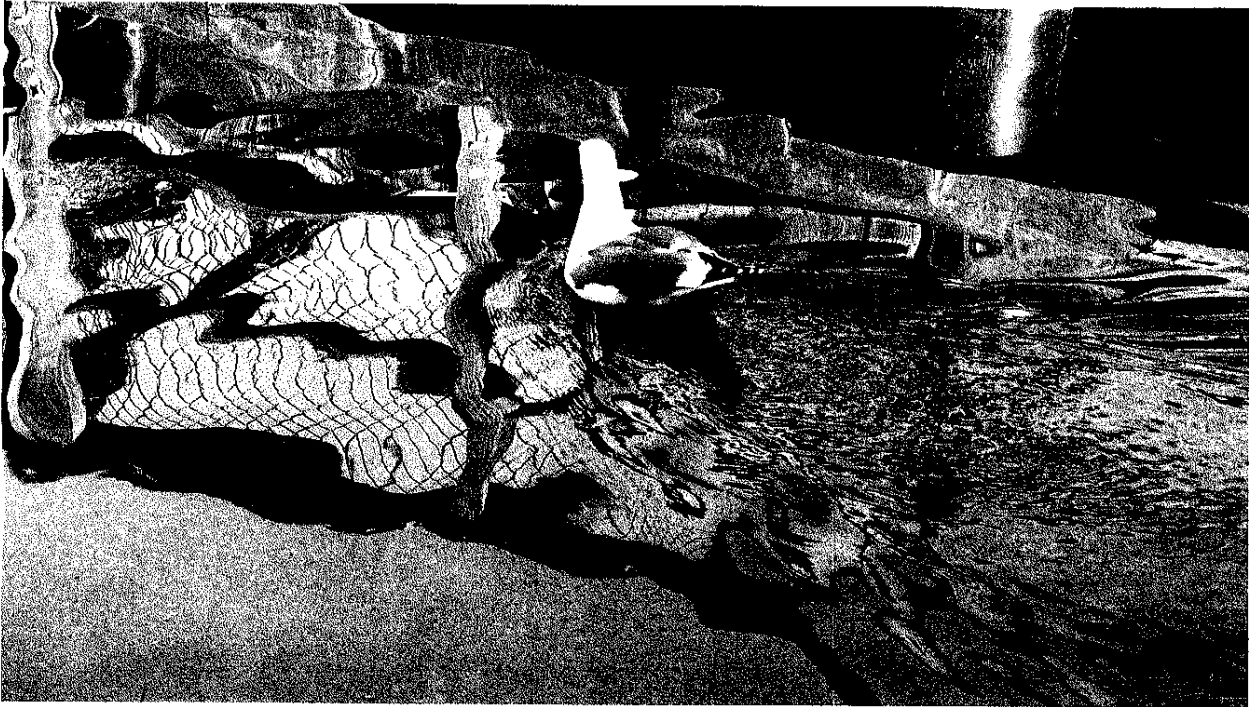

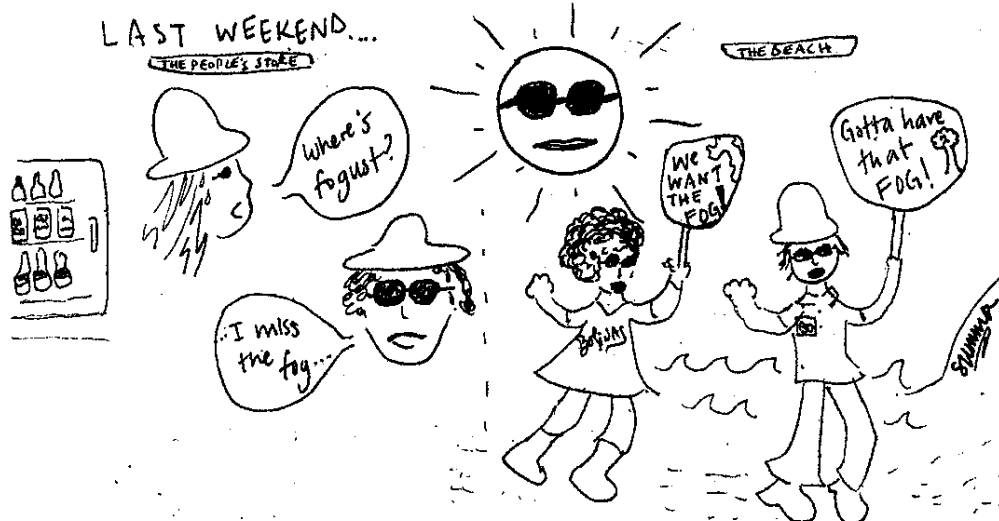

LICENSED AND INSURED ARBORISTS:

The Bolinas Community Public Utility District is coordinating the receipt of bids from licensed, insured arborists for a public/private eucalyptus tree removal/trimming project in the Dogwood right-of-way (west side of the road) near the intersection with Mesa Road in Bolinas. The scope of work includes the removal of hazardous eucalyptus trees located in the public right-of-way and ranging in diameter from 6-inches to 30-inches and ranging in height from approximately 60 to - 70 feet. In addition, the scope of work includes the removal of large branches overhanging the Dogwood road. There will be a **mandatory** pre-bid site meeting at the project site (Dogwood and Mesa Roads) on **Wednesday, August 26th beginning at 10:00 a.m.** The specific scope of work (and potential alternate scopes of work) will be discussed at the site meeting and questions will be answered at this meeting and/or subsequently to all attending arborists in writing. Arborists not attending the mandatory pre-bid site meeting are not eligible to bid on this project.
