





WHAT HAPPENED THIS WEEK Week in Review Recap from Jenniepfeiffer 9-11-17 Monday Morning Memo

It is September 11, that day of remembrance for those who lost their lives in the collapse of the twin towers, and those who continue to struggle with the ill effects of the dust and debris that found its way into the lives of those living nearby and those arriving as rescue responders. This September 11, is also a time to send thoughts to all those finding themselves in recent disasters, the path of Hurricane Irma today and yesterday, Hurricane Harvey two weeks ago, and Hurricane Jose on the horizon. Mother Nature definitely does bat last. Between fires and floods and an unstable Whitehouse, it's become a stress a minute.

Here in our little town, we had a relatively stress-free day yesterday. Even though it was warm and sunny, there were enough parking places for locals, to allow a packed house at the Community Center to have an excellent "meet & greet" with three representatives of the University of San Francisco, new owners of Star Route Farm. Mark Butler gave a welcome and a short historical update on how this purchase came to fruition, then, there were some comments from USF Provost, legal counsel, and CFO, then some thoughtful questions by those in attendance with some encouraging answers. This is all new and unfolding, with the purchase taking place a little over a month ago, so the new owners are still finding their way, but they have the foresight to retain Warren Weber's organic farming expertise for the next 3 years, and to keep Annabelle Lenderink on as operations manager, along with the experienced workers presently employed at the farm. There was repeated reassurance that they would be slow as they go, making no immediate changes, (other than improving housing and wages for employees), gathering input from staff and community, and expressing eagerness to work with the Bolinas-Stinson School on projects that would benefit the children of the district. The farm will remain an all-organic enterprise and USF student presence at the farm will be in small groups, respectful of the concerns expressed about impact on community resources. It was a very positive and encouraging gathering, with local apples and tomatoes, Anny Densmore's yummy banana bread, and John Glavis's watermelon fruit wedges as refreshment. Thanks to all who have given encouragement on this effort, especially to Steve Kinsey who worked on this concept from the beginnings three years ago, and was there yesterday to offer congratulations. Even though he is no longer our Supervisor, he continues to be supportive of our long running efforts to support Community.

Otherwise, this week: Labor Day was another exceptional day of music, merriment, B.B.Q. and silent auction; Tuesday's school Board retreat was packed with ideas for ways to continue to improve educational opportunities for our District learners, all of which will be reported at tomorrow evening's regular monthly meeting; Wednesday was a "Back to School Night" for the Bolinas Campus; Thursday was "curbside" bulky trash pickup day which was not a moment too soon and felt so good; Saturday was Second Saturday soup and Salvage at St. Aiden's and Bo Commons; and there you have it.

I'll be back again next week, and there's a saying in the South that goes "if the good lord's willing and the creek don't rise", but that's getting to be problematical, what with all the rising creeks, so barring disaster, my intention is to Press on Regardless. jp

BCLT Bolinas Homes Quilt Update:




