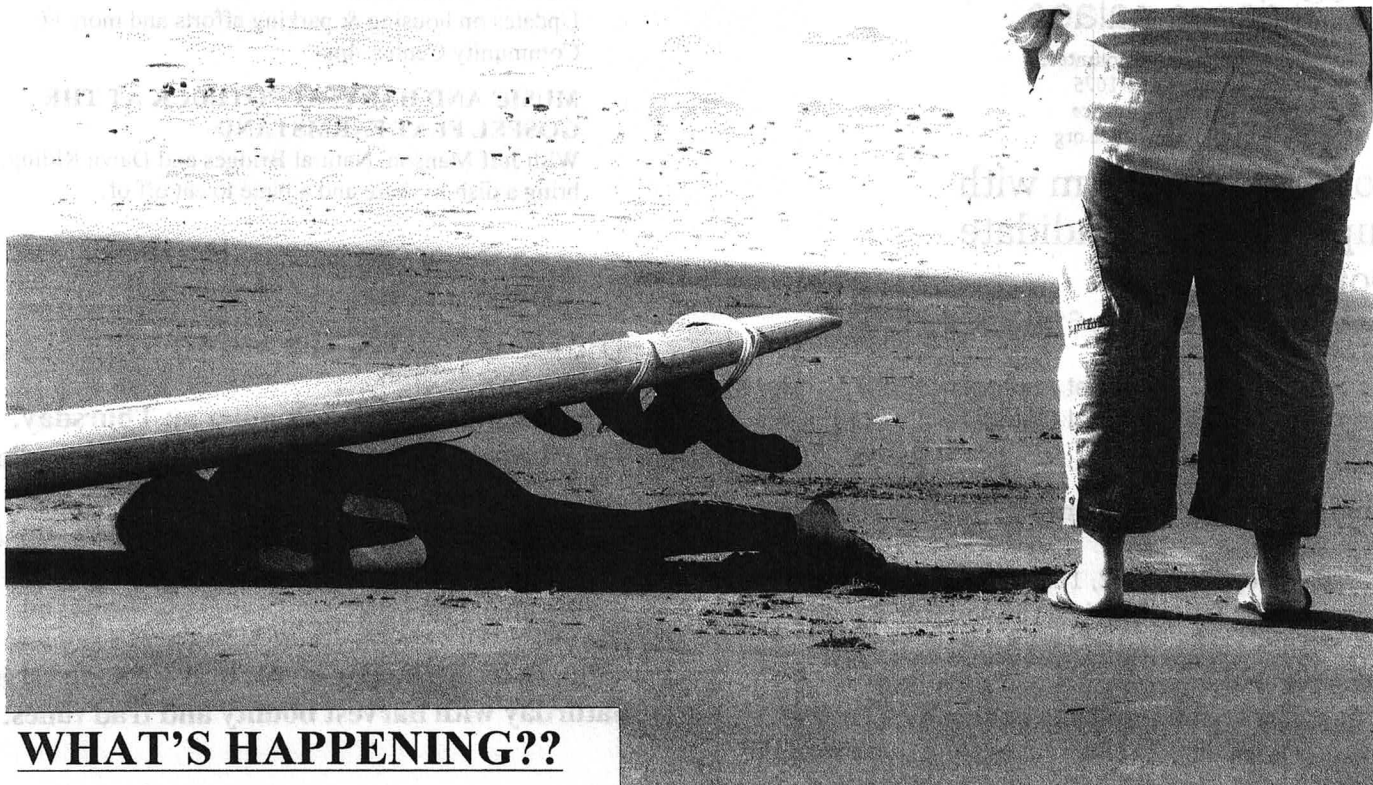

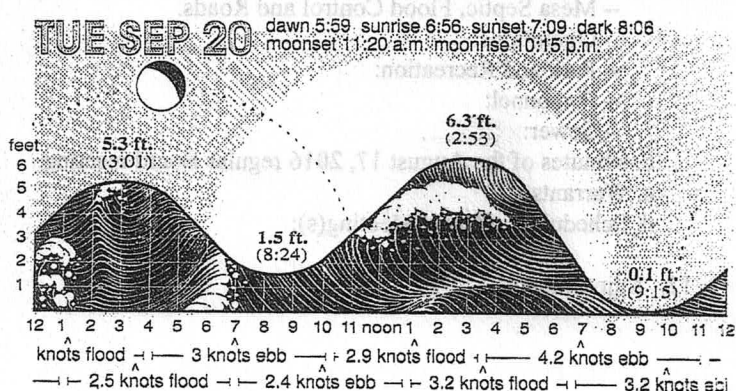
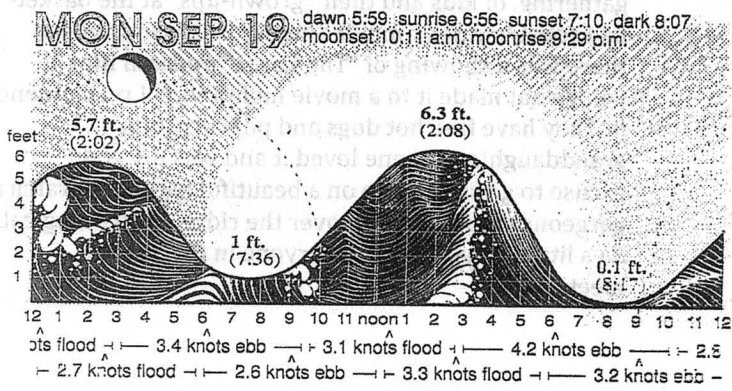

9/19/16 Monday Morning Recap from Jenniepeiffer

The meetings of the week started on Monday evening with the Mesa Park Board monthly look at what needs to be done to keep the up Mesa and down town parks going along smoothly and looking good, which they definitely do, thanks to the hours of work by that dedicated volunteer Board, and the community members they employ to do the mowing, weeding, trash tending, bathroom cleaning, and repair. I love the look of the down town park, (particularly the newly refurbished cobb oven which John Glavis is now putting to good use to make bread for the Community), which I'm thinking to call Midtown Park because when I was at the grand opening of Amanda Ross (Mann)'s Uptown Salon, I asked her about the concept of Uptown, etc. and she pointed out that if Smiley's was Downtown, which it unquestionably is, then the new Salon is at the Uptown end. The second meeting of the week was Tuesday's all morning Bolinas-Stinson School Board retreat to work on Long term Strategic Planning for the school and how we can maximize our school funding to best meet the educational needs of every one of our students.

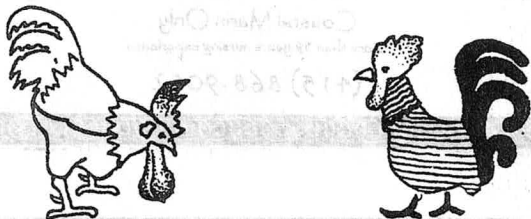

Teachers and parents were helping facilitate this event, which was open to families and the Community Tuesday evening before the Board reconvened for our regular monthly meeting. There was very enthusiastic response from the students, parents, and Board members. It is definitely a keeper.

Other news-worthy school developments include the purchase of a 15 person van that will be just the right size for our youngest students, who are small for the 30 passenger school busses we have. This van will be more fuel efficient, has better safety belts, and will be available for class field study trips. Hopefully, it can help our graduates who travel to East Marin schools, connect with the West Marin Stage in Olema to help with their school travel needs.

Friday night was an informal meeting, more a town gathering, of kids and their "grown-ups" at the basketball court/outdoor-movie-theater in Stinson, where there was a showing of "The Lorax" updated film. If you've not made it to a movie night there, I recommend it. They have free hot dogs and popcorn, and granddaughter Simone loved it and was my good excuse to go sit outside on a beautiful night and watch a gorgeous moon come up over the ridge. Pretty magical. So a little something for everyone in this week's meetings. jp

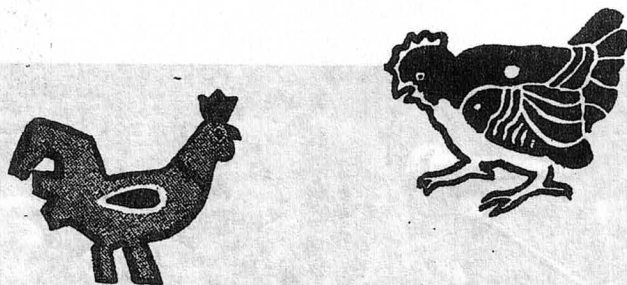
