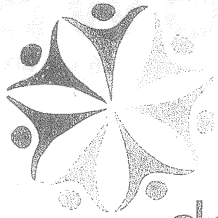

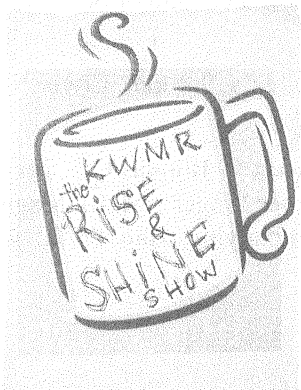

Heard It at the Hardware

OPERATION BETTY. It all started when Chris Whitefield came by yesterday and I overheard him talking about Liz and Lily Grace's cute brown dog and how it had healed up well from an unprovoked pit bull attack on the beach a couple of weeks ago. I glanced down at my feet where my dog Betty is typically stationed, if she's not outside hunting varmints and protecting the universe from Alien Invaders, but she wasn't there. I went outside to call her, which is usually enough to spark her interest as she believes food might be involved when she hears my voice. Nothing.

Panic didn't set in until an hour had passed, and Bill, Terry and I had all searched the yard and under all the buildings to no avail. I decided to drive around, and asked several people if they'd seen her. Nobody had, but they promised to keep an eye out. Then I drove toward home and had gotten as far as the fire station when Bill called. He'd heard her bark and knew she was somewhere outside of the containers where we stash plywood. I began dialing everyone I could think of to help us – friends, neighbors, our gardener, the fire department, animal rescue – most people weren't home but messages were left all over town.

Tom Higgins was the first responder, cheerful and willing. Colin Smith happened in and overheard my frantic message-leaving. He jumped in to help, so now Bill and Terry had bramble chopping compadres. Colin suggested calling Ryan Fitzgerald, which I did, but had to leave another message. Next thing I knew, Ryan was out there with the others. Hawk Weston wanted to help but two new dogs had just been dropped off for their first day at Camp Hawk, and she was stuck. Half an hour later, she came to the store and joined the search. Cruz Garcia sent his right hand man, Trinidad, and now a full crew was in force. Every so often, Betty would let out a bark, but we could not find her, even though the area we were searching in was quite contained. Right around this time, Mark Rafferty popped by and assumed the role of supervisor and human wrangler, assuring me the dog would be fine. He suggested changing her name to Baby Jessica, momentarily amusing those of us with inappropriate senses of humor.

Phil from the fire department stopped in and helped too, until a wasp's nest was uncovered. Tom got attacked with four or five bites so he needed to bow out, and Phil asked that we stop searching until the wasps calmed down. "Safety first. Human safety." I agreed and Phil departed. I went out to ask that people take a break to find Hawk barking. Yes, a perfectly intelligent, grown, red-haired woman was barking. "How do you find a dog? Bark like a dog."

And it worked. Betty responded with barks of her own, which confirmed we were in the right vicinity. We just couldn't find the dog. Several people commented that the bark sounded "forehead height."

Colin looked at the trunk of the rotted tree and noticed a large hole, perfect for a burrowing animal's nest. He and Ryan knocked on the trunk and realized it was hollow. Betty had to be somewhere within. Pat Barton came down to help, Barb Rothwell and Jean Rene stopped on their way to the beach -- and then the Oakanders...ah, the Oakanders! They never leave home without their tree trimming equipment, their helpful attitudes and their vast expertise involving all things tree-related.

Meanwhile, Colin and Ryan had determined Betty's exact location: 20 feet up into the tree trunk. Luckily for us, the trunk went up only five or six feet, then veered off and hugged the fence. And a bit further up was the start of a hole. Reed Oakander pulled the bark and bits from that section and soon a filthy, wet nose appeared from inside, snuffing the fresh air. Betty the determined digger had been located.

Someone suggested cutting the tree just below where she was cowering, but Chuck Oakander didn't like that plan, as predicting where the tree could possibly crumble was impossible. Carefully and quickly, Reed and Chuck sawed a bigger hole into the spot, one hand protecting the pooch and the other hand sawing. Soon, a perfect Betty-sized hole was carved out.
