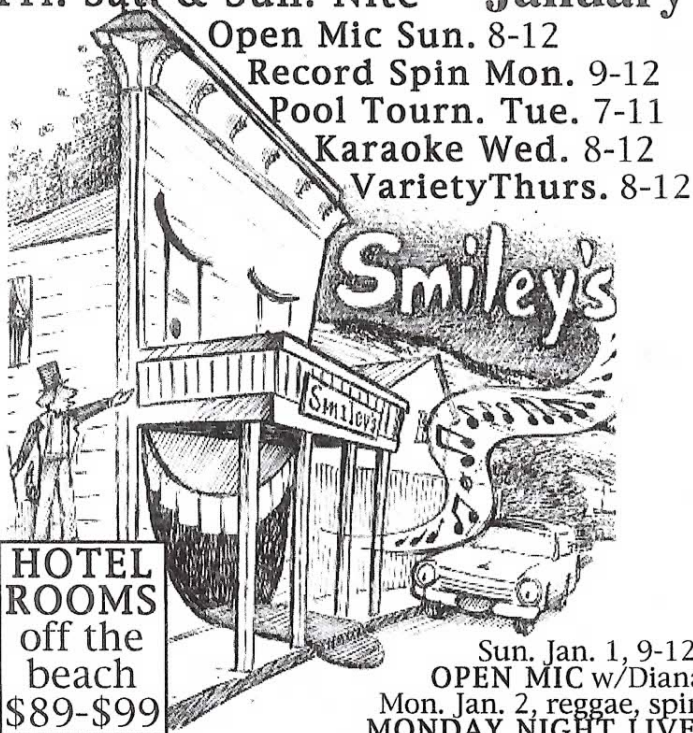

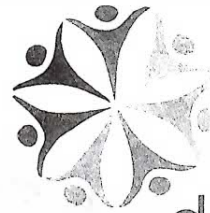

## Go to Health: Teenagers' diets, Your feet, B12 update

What Teenagers are Eating: Nationwide, teens are eating very few fruits and vegetables; this isn't news to many parents who are struggling financially and competing with chips and soda in their kid's diets. Data from a national survey of high school students show that typical daily intake of fruits and vegetables combined was slightly more than one serving a day. More than 25% of students ate fruit less than once a day, and 33% ate vegetables less than once a day. My partner, Alan, has a grandson, now 21, who refused to eat a single vegetable until recently, when his savvy girlfriend persuaded him to try some greens. I asked Ibarra Demerle, 13, for her advice to parents and teens. Her answer was immediate – kids love the smoothie shop downtown – make smoothies at home and put fruit in them. Make pasta for dinner and put vegetables in the sauce, disguised by blending them if necessary. Make fruit salad. Thanks, Ibarra, for your great advice.

Your Feet: anthropologists studying the evolution of the foot say that as we became bipedal, the foot was under selection pressure to deal with both balance and propulsion in a highly efficient way. Think about balance and propulsion when you select your shoes. Your toes should not be compressed, because from the big toe to the fifth toe, they assist your balance as they spread out, and then they push you forward into the next step. There is a new interest in barefoot walking, and in shoes that enable you to walk in a way that resembles being barefoot, but gives protection to your soles on hard or rocky surfaces. Take shorter strides to allow you to land more softly on your heel with your knees slightly bent. Roll forward through the outside edge of the foot until the ball lands, and spreads slightly as your toes spread and then bend to push you forward. Shoes that enable this kind of walking are light and flexible. Several shoe companies have 'barefoot' models. Be sure to get one with a wide toe box. Beginners' advice – walk the beach barefoot, and take off your shoes at home. Rethink high heels if you want to keep your toes happy and your calf muscles from shortening. Stretch your calves whenever you take

off high heels. Should we rethink glamour? It won't be easy, but thinking women are already making huge changes in the world.

Vitamin B12 Update: A new study from Rush University looked at levels of vitamin B12 in people over 65, and found that B12 deficiency was associated with smaller total brain volume and lower scores on tests of memory and cognition. These findings are supported by earlier (2008) study at Oxford University in England which found that over five years, people with higher vitamin B12 levels were 6 times less likely to experience brain shrinkage compared to those with lower levels. Vitamin B12 is found only in animal food, and is especially high in clams and other shellfish. Fortified breakfast cereals are an important source of vitamin B12 for vegans, who should also take a B12 supplement. Older people may have difficulty absorbing B12 from food, because of a lack of a substance called 'intrinsic factor' in the stomach that enables B12 absorption. Therefore, B12 supplements are recommended for seniors; getting the sub-lingual (under the tongue) kind that is absorbed directly into the bloodstream is the best. Low B12 levels are also related to depression, bone loss and macular degeneration in the eye. It's worth paying attention here!

To Members of the Communities of Bolinas and Stinson Beach,

Re: A special meeting of the Board, 1/23/12, 6:30 p.m., Bolinas Campus in the Middle School Classroom

In 2003, the Bolinas-Stinson Union School District, due to declining enrollment, consolidated the instruction of the first and second grades into a single classroom. As is often the case, one person's loss is another person's gain. In that vein, the vacated classroom formerly used to instruct the second grade provided a home to the Stinson Beach Preschool. In 2008, due to increasing enrollment at the school, the classroom used for first and second grade instruction was completely remodeled to allow for the simultaneous instruction of multiple student groupings with minimal noise and distraction. Enrollment has since continued to rise. Twenty-eight first and second grade students, two teachers and an instructional aide now share one classroom. Next year, the school anticipates thirty-one students will share that classroom and the school anticipates that over the next four years between 26 and 32 students will be enrolled in the first and second grades.

The inverse of that idiom, however, is also true: one person's gain is another person's loss. The district's administrative team, after observation of teaching and learning of the primary grades, and extensive consultation with instructional staff, presented the Board with a report at its regular meeting on January 3, 2012, wherein it stated that despite considerable modifications to the classroom, flexibility by teachers, adjustment of curriculum, and the use of alternate spaces on campus, the shared and overcrowded classroom is no longer a suitable learning environment for our youngest students. As a result, it is being recommended that the District reclaim the classroom leased to the Stinson Beach Preschool and revert it back to its pre-2003 function as an instructional space for a primary grade classroom.

This recommendation creates a problem – the Stinson Beach Preschool will have no place to go. The Board is aware of the impact on the community that displacing the Stinson Beach Preschool will have. Indeed, the majority of Stinson Beach Preschool students will soon be the school's first and second grade students. In short, both schools face the problem of finding adequate space to provide instruction. The Board, to ensure an informed decision, requests that members of the

community attend a special meeting of the Board at 6:30 p.m. on January 23, 2012, in the Middle School of the Bolinas campus for the limited purpose of providing potential solutions the following question:

***How can the Bolinas-Stinson Union School District best meet the needs of its primary aged students while continuing to facilitate the healthy existence of preschools in its communities?***

To be clear, the community will be limited to proposing possible solutions to this question. Susan Marx, Deputy Superintendent from the Marin County Office of Education will facilitate the meeting. This is a difficult and complicated situation and the Board has not made any decision as to how we should proceed. We look forward to hearing your ideas.

To maximize community participation and input, child care will be provided in the Quesada from 6:20 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. for children ages 3 to 10 years. Please call the District Office to reserve a space for your child.

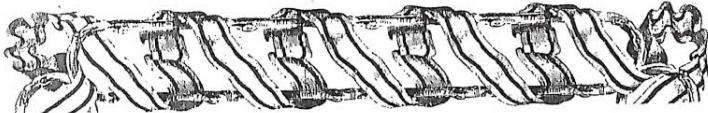
