Minutes from the February 27, 2012
Bolinas Fire Protection District Board
Meeting

Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:30PM. Vice Pres. Kilkenny, Dir. Kimball, Dir. Smith and Dir. O'Donnell were present. Also present: Chief Brown, Secretary Brown, Laura Fezini of Crown Castle, Don Smith and various community members.

MSC, Kilkenny/O'Donnell (unan) to approve the agenda.

Training

Emergency Medical Technician trainings are now complete as of Saturday February 25th. All BFPD EMTs successfully completed the course and will be submitting their paperwork to the Marin County EMS office. The course costs \$90 per person and certifies each EMT for two years.

Volunteers

BFD/BCPUD Shared Personnel Update: The reciprocal training issue is yet to be resolved.

Apparatus

Each piece of apparatus at the station will be rotated through a schedule in order to receive annual safety inspections.

Recently, the front brakes on E283 needed repair which Buck Meyer kindly resolved. U219 needs new tires. Chief Brown brought a recommendation for a minimum bid of \$1,300 to be used to sell existing U231 in a closed bidding process. After the new U231 arrives in early March, she will advertise the old U231.

Disaster Council

Chief Brown plans to attend an all day course on Tsunami Awareness at the MC Civic Center on February 28th. She also plans to attend a Tsunami/Earthquake Preparedness workshop at the Stinson Beach Community Center on March 2nd hosted by the SBFD. Speakers will attend from the California Emergency Management Association and the California Geological Society.

Dir. O'Donnell mentioned a recent report on the Japanese Tsunami that she heard on National Public Radio which she recommended everyone listen to.

Building and Grounds

Chief Brown reported that deep cleaning and interior painting is in order to maintain the fire station building. She is in the process of getting quotes from local businesses for cleaning services and painting/minor repairs. The firehouse and clinic are also experiencing difficulties with the digital thermostats. She will inquire about a quote for installing a simpler model.

General Operations/Administration
Chief Brown will be on vacation for one
week beginning March 19th.
Maintenance Agreement – CHA
Chief Brown reported that Dir. Kimball
has crafted an additional section to the
CHA lease regarding the photovoltaic
system. Nancy Dombrowski of CHA has
reviewed and accepted the section. When

she is done reviewing the entire document, the final draft will be brought to each respective Board for approval. Chief Brown thanked Dir. Kimball for his diligent help and expertise.

Surfers Overlook Repair/Terrace Ave. Dir. Kimball reported that GM Blackman of BCPUD is in negotiations with SAGE over the contract for the second stage of geotechnical assessment necessary to enable the design of specific temporary inkind and long term full bluff stabilization repair alternatives. The BCPUD and the County of Marin are set to split the cost of the repair. Dir. Kimball also stated that a permit from the Coastal Commission to construct a temporary "in-kind" repair might be unnecessary. This is yet to be determined.

Chief Brown reported that two structure fires listed in the Fire Calls and Emergencies were mutual aid calls that did not occur in Bolinas.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Action Item #1: Approve Resolution #163-2012 prohibiting use of Bolinas Disaster Council data base for anything other than Disaster Council related activities.

MSC, Kimball/Kilkenny (unan) to approve Resolution #163-2012 prohibiting use of Bolinas Disaster Council date base for anything other that Disaster Council related activities. Dir. Kimball was concerned about the action item inadvertently restricting the function of the Council. Chief Brown reiterated that all relevant information would be shared as needed within the Council.

Action Item #2: Grand Jury Survey request for financial information and response.

MSC, O'Donnell/Smith (unan) to approve submittal of request by Grand Jury for financial information. Chief Brown agreed to send in the Survey as soon as possible.

Action Item #3: Approve Verizon request for to add microwave dish to existing Crown Castle tower located on Fire District property.

Chief Brown reviewed that the BFPD has an existing lease with Crown Castle who provides space for Verizon on its tower at the station. She stated she approached Crown Castle about opening the lease and making

amendments such as requiring regular monitoring of EMFs around the fire station property and placing a cap on EMF emissions in the future. Laura, a representative of Crown Castle present at the meeting, reiterated that Crown Castle, if obliged to the request, would then lower the monthly rent paid to the District. She suggested the Board approach Verizon directly with conditions for regular monitoring of EMFs instead since they are requesting the additional microwave dish. Dir. Kimball asked who would pay for the monitoring. Laura answered that if monitoring is a condition for an additional microwave dish for Verizon, then Verizon would have to fund the condition to be met. Laura was doubtful about Verizon accepting a future cap of EMFs emitted at the station. Chief Brown and Dir. Kimball will continue to pursue possible conditions for the request and will seek Jennifer Vuillermet for legal advice at the County of Marin on the matter.

Don Smith still needs information about what exact equipment is located on the tower and what EMFs are presently emitted. Laura of Crown Castle suggested that he have a conference call with representatives from Crown Castle such as Mark Gagne, SiteSafe and Verizon to answer questions and share information. Dir. Kimball requested to join the conversation. The Board thanked Laura for her offer to arrange the conference call and for her help on the matter in general. Pres. Buchanan requested that the item be continued on the next agenda.

Discussion: Emergency only access and egress alternatives to closure of Terrace Avenue and Overlook Road. Pres. Buchanan reported that GM Blackman of the BCPUD is still pursuing PG&E for radical trimming of limbs above Mesa Road in order to keep limbs from falling and the road open. Chief Brown said she would also pursue PG&E and contact GM Blackman about the matter. Dir. Smith commented on the frequent illegal parking along Terrace Avenue at Surfers' Overlook. Chief Brown encouraged everyone to call the Sherriff's Office and report illegal parking as often as possible in order to get the problem addressed.

Dir. Kimball requested keeping the discussion item on the agenda until the repair at Surfers' Overlook is resolved. He commented that it would be a shame to have the two repairs completed along Terrace to then have access to an emergency blocked due to illegally parked

Dir. Kimball thanked Chief Brown for a balanced budget.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Pres. Buchanan reported that the Personnel Committee met earlier in the day to work on an employee handbook. Dir. Kilkenny, Pres. Buchanan and Chief Brown are working on a draft to bring before the Board when complete.

Secretary Brown said she has completed the Board Binder that includes all BFPD Resolutions. (The Resolutions are too numerous to be included in the binder and can be located in a separate binder next to the Board binder.)

GOOD OF THE ORDER

Dir. O'Donnell thanked Chief Brown and Sec. Brown for jobs well done. Dir. Kimball thanked Buck Meyer for his brake repair on E283.




