MOSTLY MISCELLANY & NOT MANY MEETINGS Monday Morning Recap & Week in Review 7/16/12 from Jenniepfeiffer

IT FEELS LIKE WE WERE JUST GEARING UP FOR THE 4th and here we are half way through the month already. I lost most of last week getting ready for, and then enjoying, the annual Eel River camping trip, an event that has been going on now since about 1995. It was started by a group of 6 or 7 families, friends who played soccer together, and has extended and grown as the children have - some who were toddlers at the time are now college students, and some others are now coming back with babies and families of their own. This year there were 7 dogs and 34 campers, (two infants in arms), several first timers, and at least 8 who've been there most every year from the very first trip. There is a lot of swimming, floating, kayaking, lazing by the riverside, many communal meals and other nonstop eating. In the evenings, musical instruments come out along with some whisky and exaggerated stories of past events, lots of laughing, and amazement at how the years go like the river flows, ongoing, the same but ever-changing. We were missing the large laugh that Dave Gleason always brought along with him, but we had photos of him with us and his presence was everywhere there - though not like having him with us in the flesh. The kids found a table with Dave's son Evan's name carved on it. Evan was one of the pack of kids who spent many childhood summers enjoying the Eel River campouts, and it's one of the tragedies of life that Dave and Evan both died within a space of two years. How happy I am to have spent those years on the river with them, and shared so many good laughs. It's the big lesson in life, to grab it and enjoy it, because it is a moment in time and is gone so quickly.

There is another opportunity to grab a good moment coming up this weekend. The FAR WEST FEST is fast approaching and will be upon us this Saturday, July 21st at Love Field in Pt. Reyes Station. LOT'S of great music, local beer, food, and crafts, and plenty room for the kids to run while you dance. Children under 10 are free, 10 to 17 are \$15, and tix purchased in advance are \$25 -- \$10 off the price at the gate. There are still volunteer slots available that will get you in free, but they are filling up fast, so check out FAR WEST FEST on line, or get your early tickets at KWMR in Pt. Reyes, or in Bolinas at *Uniquities Variety, Thrift & Gift*, and Really Good Pet Food Emporium, noon to 5:00 daily. Hope you're enjoying these long days, jp
