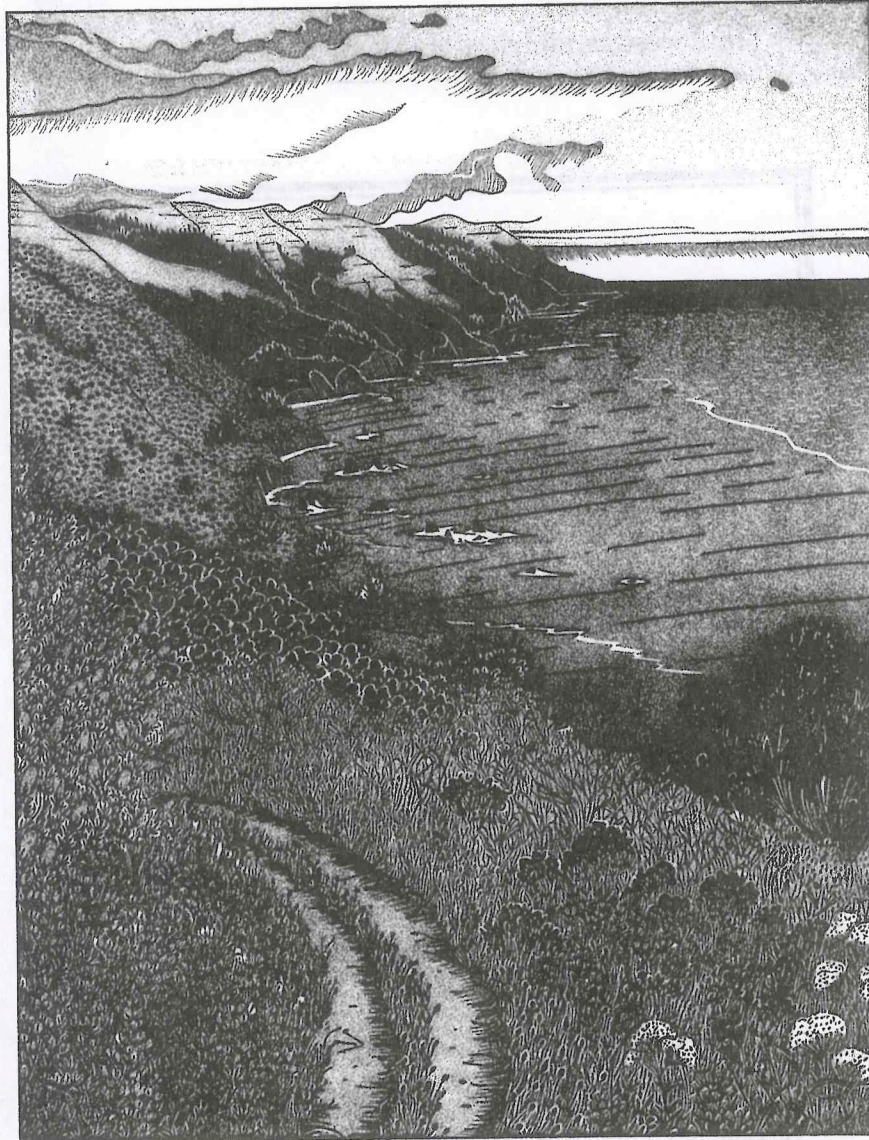

## Faces of West Marin's future, searching for a home

On August 21, the seventh Community Conversation will take place at the Dance Palace, in Point Reyes Station. The event, which follows a series of conversations centered largely on local agriculture and the environment, will focus on younger generations currently living in West Marin and the challenge many of them face in securing affordable housing.

In light of the conversation, the *Light* has compiled a series of brief portraits profiling some of the young individuals who are currently contributing to our local economy, but having difficulty finding housing.

### Vanessa

Vanessa Waring could have had so much more if she'd only stayed in Fresno. In Fresno, the farmland is plentiful, the tractors are large and the living is arguably affordable. Fresno was where she grew up; it was what she knew. But it wasn't where she felt inspired. "I remember when I first got into farming," she said. "I was telling my peers and elders in Fresno about it, and their response was like, 'Why would you do that? Don't you want to be successful?'"

In time Vanessa, 27, found West Marin, and with it the lure of an alternative, more intimate way of living on the land. She moved to Bolinas, where she now lives with a friend in a rented space, and is working with Arron Wilder to launch the inaugural Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) season at Point Reyes Farm. An antiquated blue Volvo transports her back and forth.

But financially, it's a struggle. "It doesn't really make sense to farm on land that you're not living on," she said. "If you're trying to actually make a living off of it, it just ... it doesn't work."

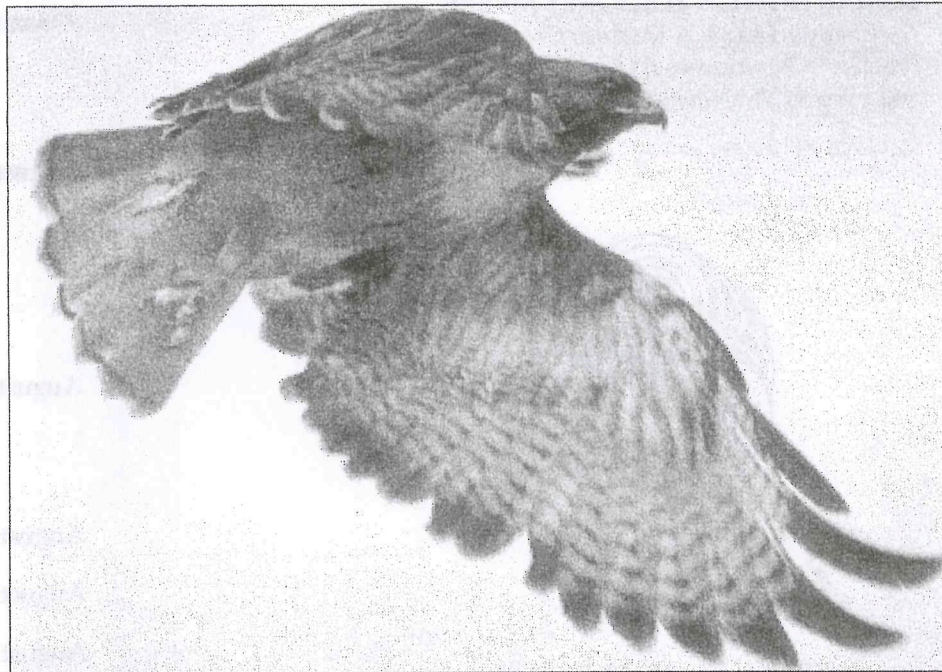

JENNIEPFEIFFER-RILEY RECAP

With so much mediocre bullshit in film these days this one is truly a wonder.

The occasional wobbly-camera and out-of-focus moments of this excellently edited & produced documentary only contribute to its authenticity and the dedication of its makers. And the music track arrangement by a guy named Robbins is deliciously appropriate & thankfully tempered.

Robert Redford, director & star of *The Horse Whisperer*, appears briefly in *Buck* and gives much credit to its star for the success of his (Redford's) movie. Buck was a consultant to Redford's film and a stand-in for its star.

Leonard Maltin gives three & a half stars to *The Horse Whisperer* & has this to say about it in his *Movie/Video Guide*.

"Exquisite rendering of Nicholas Evans' novel about a teenaged girl, traumatized in a horse-riding accident, whose mother drives them ~ including the horse ~ to Montana, where a renowned horse trainer tries to rehabilitate the animal ~ and simultaneously, the girl. ~ ~ Redford the filmmaker takes his time telling the story. It's risky, but it works."

## Buck ~ The Film

*The Horse Whisperer* may be the stuff of Hollywood legend, but the charismatic horseman who inspired him is very real. For Buck Brannaman, a true cowboy who is also part guru and part philosopher, horses are mirrors of the human soul. Winner of the Audience Award at the Sundance Film Festival, this richly textured and visually stunning documentary follows Brannaman on the road through his horsemanship clinics, as he teaches people to communicate with horses through instinct, not punishment. Referring to the personal abuse he suffered as a child, he eschews violence and seems to possess near magical abilities as he dramatically transforms horses (and people) with his understanding, compassion and respect. In this truly American story about an unsung hero, the animal-human relationship becomes a perfect metaphor for meeting the challenges of daily life.

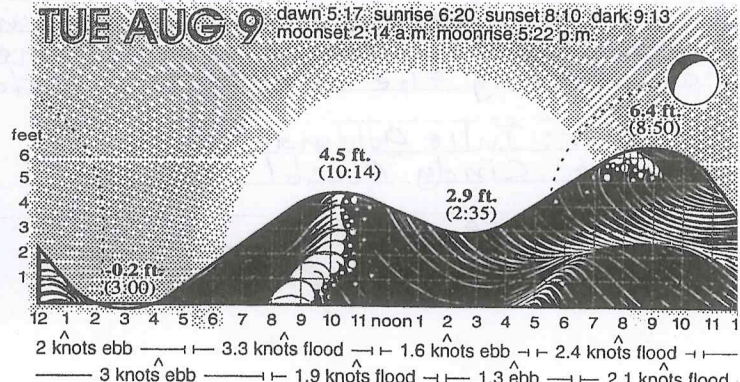
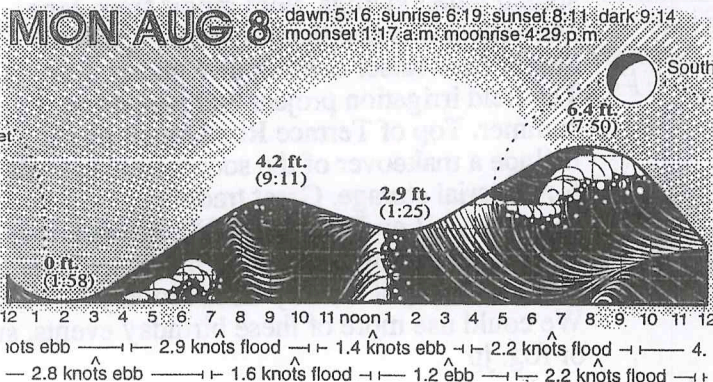
