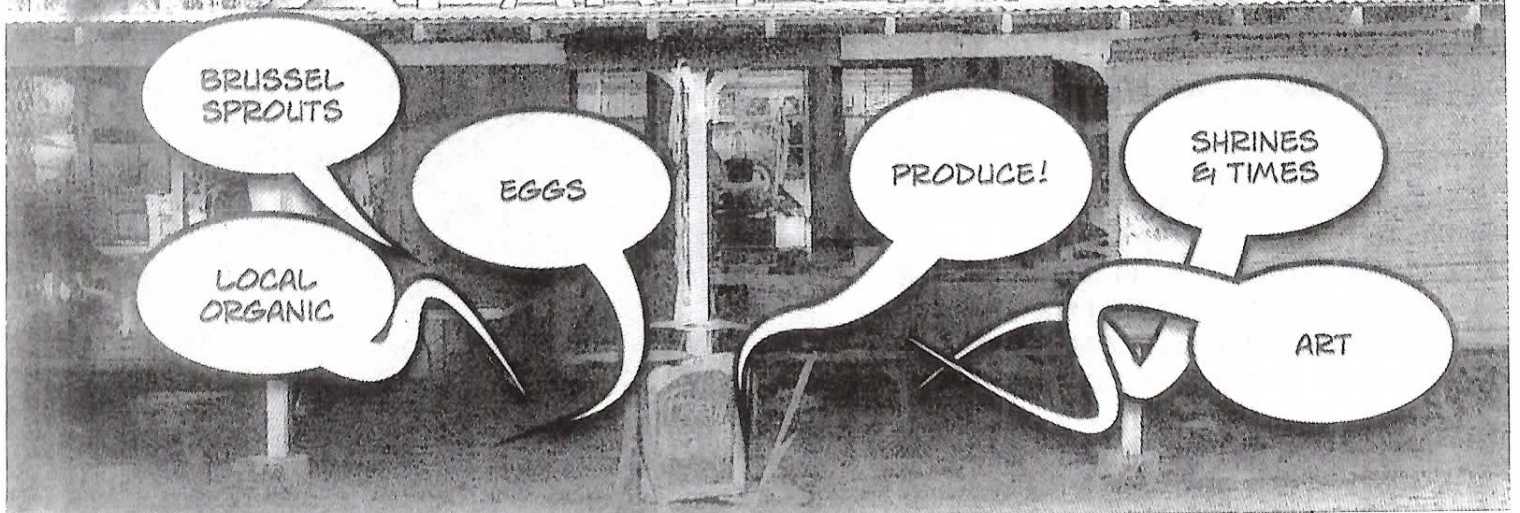

Artist's Statement

It's traditional to write a statement when having a show, and since I'm having a show at the Farmstand Gallery I'm making a statement. (The artist's reception for the show is this Saturday from 1-5pm. Please come and celebrate the creative spirit.)

The exhibit at the Farmstand features artwork from a number of different periods. For instance the painting of David Gleason with the Rolling Rock bottle on Brighton Beach is from 2004. There are two other paintings from the same period - one of a dance performance at the Community Center and one of the seed exchange at Mesa Park.

The 3 paintings were based on sketches I made at each event. At the time I was interested in capturing modern village life. I painted with a loose sketchy, almost cartoony style.

For the series of "Smiley's Scenarios" I repeated the same basic interior view of the saloon but I let my imagination run wild on how to populate the place. Snakes, sharks, robots and extraterrestrials all take their turn at the pool table.

Part of one wall at the Farmstand is filled with Shrines. I call them Shrines because they have roofs. Someone gave me a bunch of mitred frame samples. I used them as roofs for Blue Bear wall plaques made for the Winter Faire.

Pyramid energy has long been of interest to me and I saw the pyramid roof as a cosmic energy accumulator. I painted icons on the shrines to benefit from the cosmic energy. I made shrines to the Goddess, to Bolinas, to Water, to Mermaids, to Peace, to everything I cherish in life.

My recent art reflects my interest in no narrative. I love listening to and telling stories, and I usually like a strong story line in my art. But lately I've been experimenting with no planned narrative in my art.

Over the past ten years I've been making hand cut mylar stencils. All of the stencils have a great deal of personal meaning, but I've been randomly throwing them together in my art.

I'm rearranging personal iconography in new and startling ways. With the use of random juxtaposition I hope to uncover an alternative metaphoric meaning via synchronicity and serendipity.

As it is. What it is. The power of the present.

Art is a chronicle of the times.

Art reflects the mindset and mood of the cultural epoch that we all share.

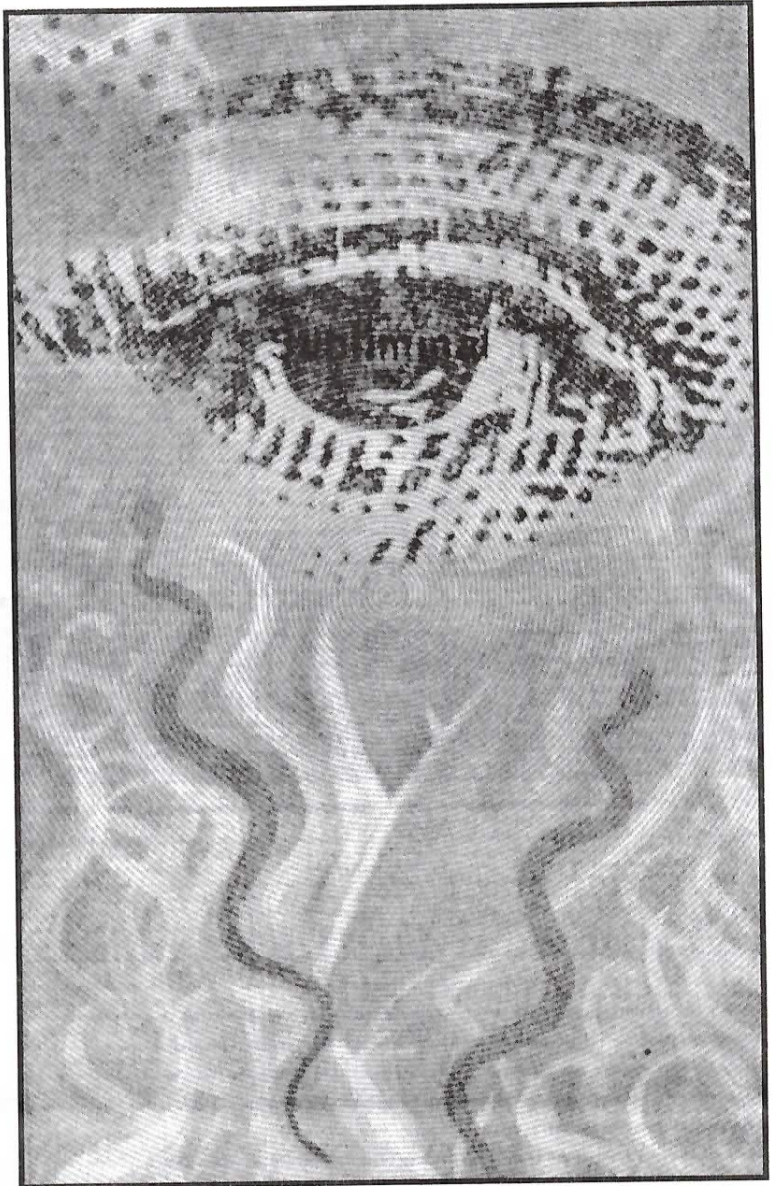
Life and history pass like water through our fingers. Art is a snapshot of that great flow, the Way, the Tao.

Jessica left formal education at an early age, taking refuge in books and music. She has performed extensively with spoken word and song throughout the US, Ireland, England, Europe, Japan and Hong Kong.

From California to London to New Orleans, and more, around and back and around again, her work has been greatly influenced by her journeys. However, she says, the only real journey is the journey of the heart.

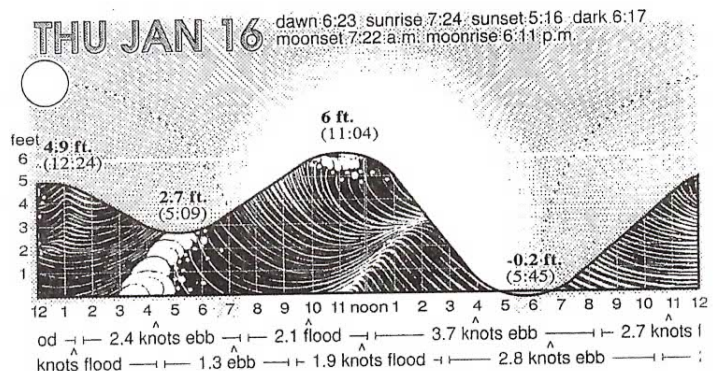
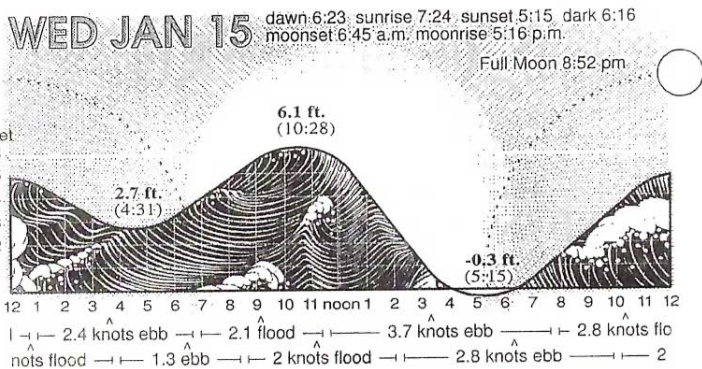
ARROYO HONDO MEANS DEEP RAVINE IN SPANISH

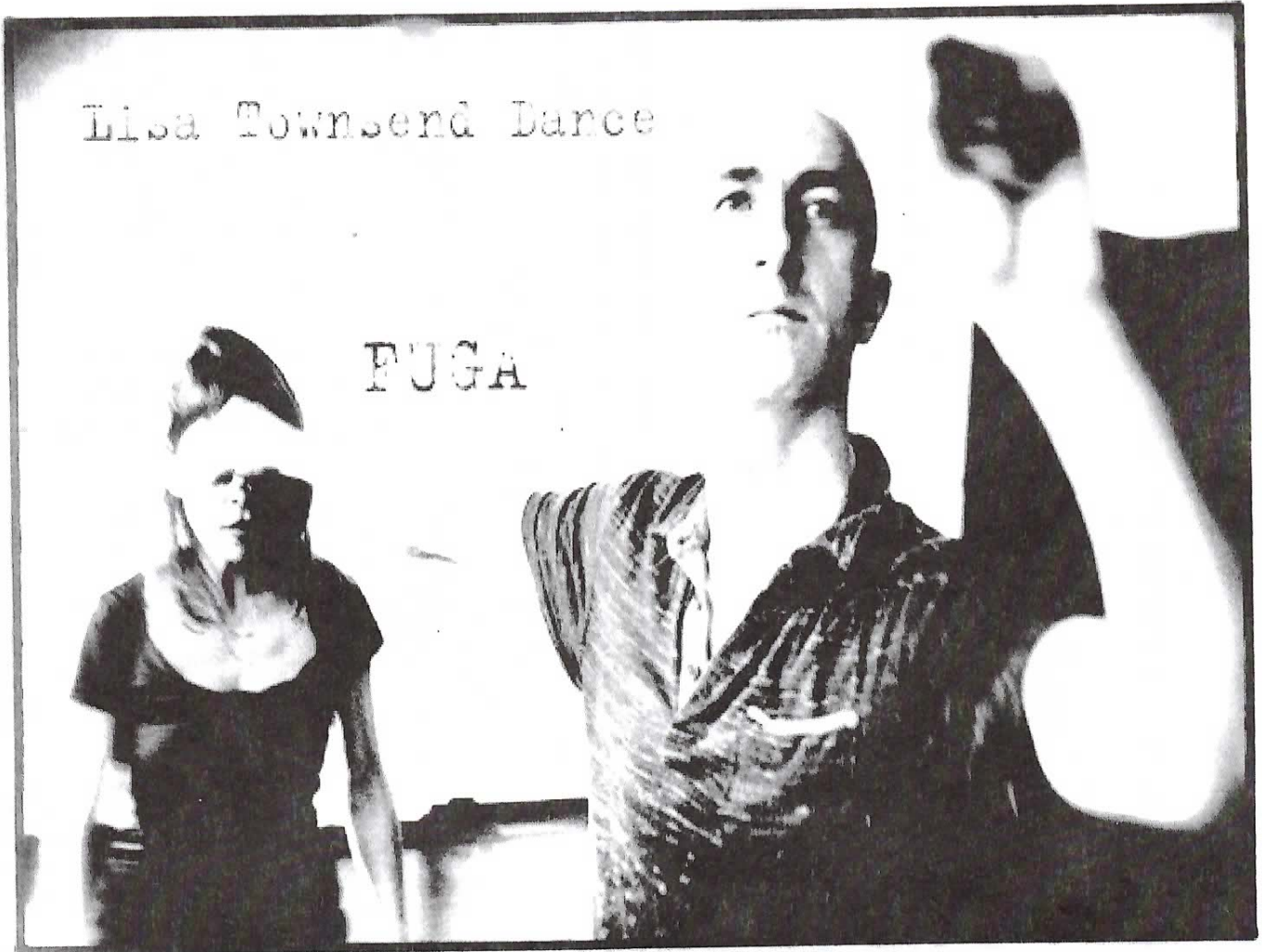
