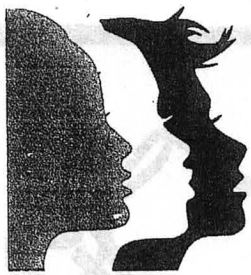

The band included 3 guitar players, 2 drummers, and 2 back-up singers. Alex Bleeker, who also prints this paper, lead the group. His sweet countenance was reminiscent of Jerry Garcia. Hearsay editor Jeff Manson played great bass for the ensemble.


I wouldn't describe the music as rock and roll but as rollicking and rolling. The Grateful Dead never fit into any known category of rock or pop music. Despite the lack of being easily pigeon-holed, the feeling of unity was as strong as ever.

The band was set up on the floor which dissolved the separation between performers and audience. Indeed, one person at the event was heard to say, "I finally get what the Grateful Dead is all about."

It was nice to see some women, Carol Ann and Bronwen fronting the band. Danny Vitale added some great guitar licks a la Jerry Garcia.

A beautiful community forms around the Grateful Dead, and that CommUnity is alive and well in Bolinas. Such strength is vitally important in these dark times. Thanks to Pam and Julie and everyone else for keeping the Grateful Dead spirit alive.
