



Julie was the main songwriter for the group. She smiled beautifully and looked like she was consulting her muse as she sang with a wonderfully arched eyebrow.

Beth (our Beth) sang along with Julie and added percussion. Debbie Daly who normally plays guitar was on accordion, and Katy Larkin played cello and electric bass.

The songs were fabulous and the group was mostly acoustic, sounding sweet and feminine, but with power and direction – perfect warm-up for the march on Sunday.

A beautiful community forms around the Grateful Dead, and that CommUnity is alive and well in Bolinas. Such strength is vitally important in these dark times. Thanks to Pam and Julie and everyone else for keeping the Grateful Dead spirit alive.






