Radiation has long been identified as a serious risk factor in various human diseases. The earthquake and tsunami in Japan, and the resultant ongoing struggles to contain radiation released from reactors there, has brought radiation to the forefront again. This call explored the many controversies which persist since the initial disaster: What are the primary risks to human health, of bgth acute high-level and lower-level exposures? Are there scientifically valid strategies for minimizing harm in those exposed? And how might such disasters best be avoided in the future?



Robert M. Gould, MD, graduated from Albert Einstein College of Medicine, and from 1981 until 2012 worked as a Pathologist at Kaiser Hospital in San Jose. In 2012 Bob was appointed as an Associate Adjunct Professor in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at the UCSF School of Medicine, to serve as Director of Health Professional Outreach and Education for the UCSF Program on Reproductive Health and the Environment (PRHE). Since 1989, he has been President of the San Francisco-Bay Area Chapter of Physicians for Social Responsibility (PSR), and in 2003 was President of National PSR, to serve again in this capacity in 2014. Since 1986, Bob has been an active in the Peace Caucus of the American Public Health Association, for which he has been Chairperson for numerous years, and in 2009 APHA awarded Bob the prestigious Sidel-Levy Peace Award. In addition to speaking and publishing extensively on the clinician's role in environmental and public health advocacy, Bob is an expert on the environmental and public health impacts of nuclear weapons; he is a contributing author to chapters on health impacts of nuclear weapons and nuclear terrorism in "War and Public Health" (2008) and "Terrorism and Public Health" (2011) published by Oxford University Press. Since 1992 Bob has been a leading member of the Environmental Committee of the Santa Clara County chapter of the California Medical Association (CMA), and through this work has authored and submitted numerous Association (CMA), and through this work has authored and submitted numerous Association (CMA), and through this work has authored and submittee numerous environmental health resolutions adopted by CMA as policy. For his work within CMA, he received the Santa Clara County Medical Association's "Outstanding Contribution in Community Service" award in 2001, and "Outstanding Contribution to the Medical Society award in 2012. Dr. Gould was also listed as one of Santa Clara County's "Top 400 Physicial in peer-review surveys published in San Jose Magazine in 2001 through 2007.



Arjun Makhijani, PhD, President of The Institute for Energy and Environmental Research (IEER), holds a PhD in engineering (specialization: nuclear fusion) from the University of California at Berkeley. He has produced many studies and articles on nuclear fuel cycle related issues, including weapons production, testing, and nuclear waste, over the past twenty years. Most recently, Dr. Makhijani has authored Carbon-Free and Nuclear-Free: A Roadmap for US Energy Policy. He is the principal editor of Nuclear Wastelands and the principal author of Mending the Ozone Hole, MIT Press.





As residents of Bolinas and Stinson Beach we know you are focused on maintaining a beautiful and thriving community. To further that, we want to familiarize you with the waste management resources available from Zero Waste Marin and our partners at Redwood Empire Disposal, Bolinas Community Public Utility District and Stinson Beach County Water District.

In the coming months, you will see advertisements throughout Marin County promoting food waste composting in the green carts. While we encourage you to recycle as many Items as possible, residents of Bolinas and Stinson should **not** place food scraps in their green carts. The green carts in Stinson and Bolinas are for **yard waste only**. This goes to a special local composting facility that does not process food waste.

Here are some other ways you can reduce your waste and help the environment:

Yard Waste Composting - It's easy to recycle yard waste in Bolinas! Place green waste such as yard trimmings, branches and weeds in your green cart. The content of your green cart is sent to the Bolinas-Stinson Resource Recovery Project where it is turned into rich soil to help grow food.

Backyard Composting – Residents in Bolinas can compost food scraps in their own backyard. Make sure to purchase an animal-proof composting container to keep unwanted visitors away. The compost you create can be used to help your garden flourish. For information on home composting classes, visit ZeroWasteMarin.org.

Reusable Bags - Bring your own reusable shopping bag on your next trip to the grocery store. Simple actions like reusing your shopping bag keeps plastic out of our landfill. Keep a reusable shopping bag in your car for any unplanned trips to the grocery store

The World Faire has been canceled for this year. Phil has been working on small building maintenance projects.


Development Director's Report: Randi reports that the insurance renewal is in process. We have received a Bo-Stin grant for the construction of a storage closet for equipment at the front of the building.

Meeting Adjourned at 11.30. Minutes submitted by Stacy Besenty


