Extra-High Tides To Hit Again!

King Tides, the term for the especially high tides that occur a couple of times each winter due to an alignment of the sun and moon's gravity with the tilt of the earth, The term King Tide appears to originate in Australia and New Zealand and refers to the highest of tides that typically follow an semi-annual pattern, with the most notable tides happening during summer (January) on Australia's eastern coast, and in winter in California.

The tides serve as visual alarms, as CBS reports, for those hoping to raise awareness of the potential impacts of rising sea levels. The California King Tides Initiative is one of those groups, encouraging people to upload photos to their Flickr group showing flooded roads, beaches, infrastructure, and wetlands during the season of King Tides. The idea is to give visual evidence of what the permanent affects of rising seas will look like in coastal areas. Another set of King Tides are due to hit at the end of January, from the 29th to the 31st.



### The Power of the Bolinas Free Box

Bolinas residents and tourists spend a Sunday afternoon not at the beautiful beach, but huddled inside the Free Box, looking for treasures. The closet-sized shed is packed with stuff: wool sweaters, cassette tapes, adult diapers and more. "Something in the Free Box for everyone," says one resident. "This is where my mom gets me my birthday presents," shares another.

The Bay Area town is known for its natural beauty, surf and creative spirit. It was the one-time home of Jefferson Airplane and poet Lawrence Ferlinghetti. Bolinas is also notorious for being not-so-friendly to outsiders. But nestled between the community center and an organic grocery co-op, the Free Box is one place in town that welcomes everyone.

"Whenever tourists or people from out of town come," says a longtime Bolinas resident and faithful Free Box curator who goes by the name StuArt. "I always ask them to take one little thing from the Free Box as a talisman of something, of a free society, of a gift economy."

A man named Bob Dill, who worked for the community center, started the box in 1975. He decided to build a couple of shelves when he noticed people were leaving old clothes out front. Now, with the help of volunteers, the Free Box has evolved into a full-blown operation.

"With no real organization or structure we've managed to provide what I think is the best examples of the spirit of the '60s in Bolinas," StuArt says. "There's more fun in the Free Box than any place in town except for the beach."

The Free Box even has a manifesto, written by StuArt himself. He ducks out and retrieves a dusty piece of paper, brushing it off as he starts to read: "Like Bolinas itself, the Free Box exists in a different realm than the ordinary world. The Free Box is a magical portal to a hidden dimension. The Free Box is a place of metaphor and mystical meaning."

The box helps residents preserve a long-held culture of gifting. StuArt says this preservation is important given how much has changed in the town since the '60s. It's become a magnet for the super rich seeking a getaway — exclusive in a different kind of way now. "Bolinas is gentrifying, only the rich can afford to buy here," StuArt says. "I think the average house is like \$700,000."

It's actually closer to \$1 million. Although the high property values mean fewer people actually need things from the Free Box, resident Tina Kochan says it sure does make for better clothing options.

"A long time ago, you had to be careful what you got from the Free Box. There was a few more dirty folk around. It's a bit cleaner, a little more higher-end brands now, so it's kind of reflective of the community.


There's a lot more well-to-do, second-home owners. They come and they bring their Calvin Klein jeans that I go garden in!"

Everyone has a story of something great they've found in the box. A sign above the door reads "expect a miracle." Music teacher Annie Owen has lived in Bolinas for seven years and gets most of her clothes there. "It's just amazing, that what you need is right here," she says. "You just have to dig or open your eyes up really clearly."

One day when it was raining, resident James McDaniel found a pair of rain boots in his size. "Sometimes when I need something in my life but I can't find it in a store or maybe I don't have money for it, there have been several times I have come down here and found what I was looking for."


And even when you aren't looking for anything — and I certainly wasn't — StuArt says everyone needs to take something from the box. "You should accept the power of Bolinas yourself. It's a healing spot." The power of the Free Box did take over: I scored a pretty cool denim dress.

I want to take a moment to update you on a crucial issue that is being debated in the State Capitol. Hydraulic fracturing, or "fracking" as it is known, is a harmful method of extracting fossil fuels that presents a significant harm to public health and safety and the environment. The impacts of fracking range from furthering the current and future dangers of climate change, threatening our water supply, contributing to our air pollution problems, and escalating seismic activity that may result from fracking activity that may result from fracking.

Thank you for reaching out to my office earlier this year with your position on Senate Bill 4 (Pavley). I was happy to learn of your interest in this important issue and agree that fracking is a serious problem. That is why I am working with CREDO Action to call on the governor to implement a statewide moratorium on fracking. Nearly 30,000 Californians have signed CREDO's fracking moratorium petition. 
Next week, CREDO Action will deliver their petition and my letter to the governor, which is also signed by seven other lawmakers calling for a moratorium.
