Marin History Watch: Kindling cargo from Bolinas

According to the Oct. 19, 1868, San Francisco Daily Evening Bulletin, 1,000 cords of wood were for sale on the Bolinas waterfront. Bolinas was a big producer of firewood for San Francisco; between 1855 and 1880, an estimated half million cords were lumbered in Bolinas forests. It was such a profitable business that as many as 10 schooners were employed at one time to haul firewood into the city. (Pictured: A passenger and freight ship sails along the coast near Bolinas in 1890s.) And then there was the Continental, a 77-foot steamer built by Bolinas Navigation Co. to take advantage of the thriving wood trade. Unfortunately, the ship itself didn't thrive - its propellers continually broke in shallow waters. Later sold, it now rests in Humboldt Bay.


