




Daisies

as I reach down, not to pick but merely to touch the suitability of the field for the daisies, and the daisies for the field.



Most of us in West Marin have met and know people who left their home and country to migrate to the United States – for economic, political, social, and/or family reasons. Their combined stories add to the American story, the patchwork quilt of language, skin color, and culture. Their stories are essential to understanding our local history, too, from early explorers and settlers and their interactions with the Miwok peoples, to Portuguese ranchers, to the more recent arrival of Mexican, Guatemalan and other Latin Americans who have helped develop our local economy (and many others as well).

Por Que Venimos/Why We Come is a film featuring migrants living in San Rafael's Canal District telling their stories about why and how they journeyed to the United States. The film showing and discussion that will follow present an opportunity for our community to expand our knowledge and understanding of the factors that inspired those journeys, and provide a forum-for our immigrant neighbors to share their own stories as well. The 45-minute film is bilingual, and the ensuing discussion will be facilitated with translation.

All are welcome. Please bring your family and friends to this community gathering. Refreshments will be served.

The newly formed Bolinas Immigrant Action Committee is working with West Marin Community Services and West Marin's "Standing Together" Rapid Response Team to support our immigrant neighbors in becoming more fully and securely integrated into our community's social and economic fabric. Join us and help discern ways to support the immigrant residents of Bolinas.



There are Large Feline Predators in Town

On my run down Agate Beach this morning, I saw a group of vultures cleaning off a freshly eviscerated doe carcass, while an injured and bleeding buck stumbled around on the beach. As soon as he saw me, he ran right into the ocean and swam out quite a ways. I quickly went further down the beach so the buck would feel safe to come back in, and he did, stumbling back onto the beach and up into the eucalyptus groves. There was evidence of a scuffle on the beach and a combination of deer tracks and 3-4" wide feline tracks (mountain lion? another large cat?).

I've never seen anything like that. As many of you are aware, animals are fleeing the fires en masse, and are hungry, thirsty, and traumatized. Have sympathy for them, but also please keep your pets safe!

The committee's goal is to provide the Board of Trustees with a draft list of bond projects for discussion in December.

General obligation bonds are often used by school districts in California to pay for large projects that would not be affordable through a school's regular funding sources; bonds typically pay for new construction and major upgrades of existing facilities and are not used for normal operating expenses.


