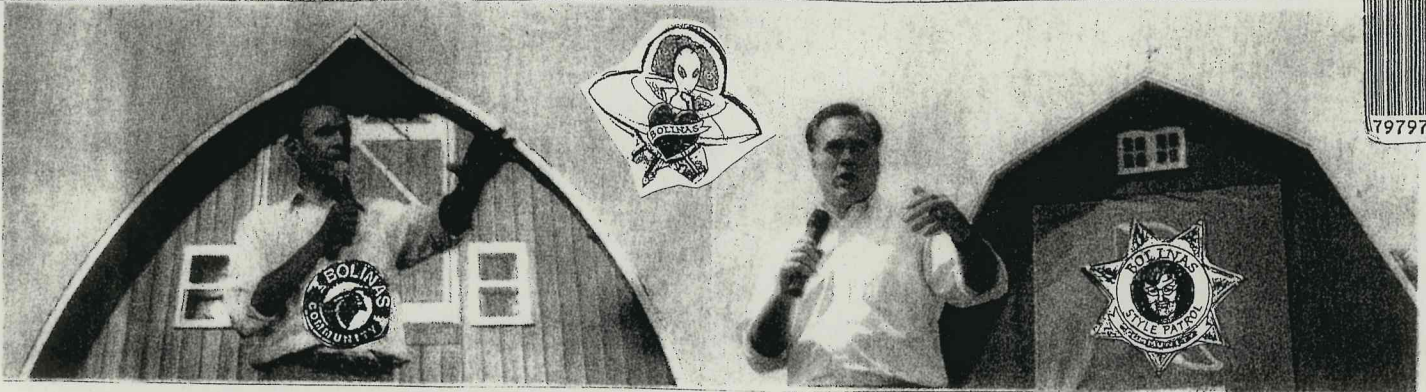

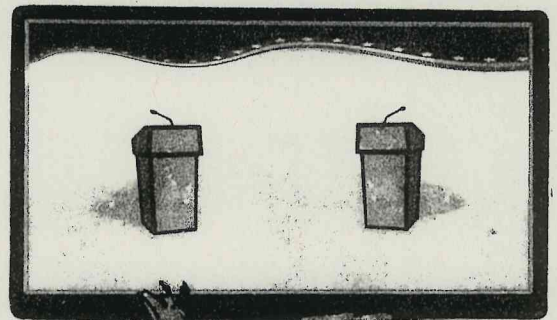

Mander argues that capitalism is no longer a viable system and that capitalism, utterly dependent on never-ending economic growth, is an impossible absurdity on a finite planet with limited resources.

**Proposed Rules for Park Use**

The Downtown Park Committee recommends the following proposed park ordinances which were taken from the Marin County Code, and are similar to all ordinances regulating public parks. Written in legal jargon, they prohibit:

1. Dumping your garbage in the park;
2. Putting up structures or signs;
3. Dumping your unwanted couch;
4. Selling stuff or using the park for commercial activities, except by permission;
5. Hassling people;
6. Getting drunk;
7. Making fires, except as permitted;
8. Using fireworks;
9. Smoking.

They already apply to the tennis court park. The Mesa Park Board will vote on adopting them for our town parks at its October 8, 2012 meeting.

**1. Garbage, refuse and trash.**

No person shall bring garbage, refuse, trash or yard clippings onto parks, nor dump or deposit such garbage, refuse, trash or yard clippings within parks.

**2. Unauthorized structures, encroachments and signs.**

No person shall erect any temporary or permanent obstructions, structure, monument, facility, physical improvement, encroachment or sign within parks. Any such item may be impounded or demolished by the agency.

**3. Abandoned and unattended property.**

No person shall abandon or leave unattended or without permission any personal property or device within parks for a period longer than twelve hours. Any property or device so abandoned or unattended may be impounded and disposed of in accordance with law.

**4. Commercial activities.**

No person shall do any of the following within parks:

- A. Sell, hawk or otherwise peddle any goods, merchandise or services;
- B. Station or place any stand, cart or vehicle for display of goods, merchandise or services;
- C. Distribute, circulate or post any handbill, pamphlet or other advertisement regarding sale of goods, merchandise or services;

D. Conduct any commercial filming or photography or activity related to commercial filming or photography except by written permission from the agency.

E. Conduct any activity of a commercial nature except by written permission from the agency.

**5. Prohibited conduct.**

No person shall do any of the following within parks:

- A. Harass or otherwise disturb others;
- B. Accost another person for the purpose of begging or soliciting;
- C. Be under the influence of intoxicating liquor or dangerous drugs in such a condition that the individual is unable to exercise care for his or her own safety or the safety of others;
- D. Engage in loud or disturbing conduct or any act tending to a breach of the peace.

**6. Alcoholic beverages.**

The use of alcoholic beverages within the parks is prohibited.

**7. Fires.**

No person shall build, light, or maintain a fire of any nature within parks, except in permanent fixed barbeques, camp stoves, or fireplaces established by the agency. The use of portable barbeques and camp stoves is prohibited except in designated areas. Barbeques and stoves shall be operated at all times in a manner that does not endanger facilities. In addition, hot coals must be disposed of in a designated manner.

**8. Fireworks.**

No person shall possess, bring onto, set off or otherwise cause to explode within parks any firecrackers, skyrocket or other fireworks or explosives.

**9. Smoking.**

Smoking is not permitted in the parks.

**PRESCRIBED FIRE UPDATE**

October 1, 2012

Dogtown prescribed fire scheduled for Thursday October 4

The Dogtown prescribed fire in the Olema Valley is now scheduled for Thursday, October 4, between the hours of 10:00 am and 4:00 pm.

Approximately 18 to 30 acres will be burned, based on air quality conditions.

This is the first of a series of three burns planned for the next few weeks.

The Dogtown burn unit is located approximately 8 miles south of Olema and 8 miles north of Bolinas.

No road or trail closures are anticipated, but there may be short traffic delays along Highway 1 while burning is in progress.

Drivers and hikers are urged to use extra caution if smoke is present.

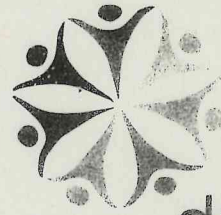

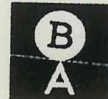

Outside prison, he says, his pals share his values: "pro-working class, anti-materialistic, egalitarian-oriented and anti-government." But inside, he hung with the people who were educated, who could talk of world events, "all committed capitalists," many in prison for fraud. "Money drives them all. ... They know my opposing social philosophy, essentially Marxism, but such doesn't seem to deter our friendship. I strongly believe that on the outside, we will revert to having 'nothing in common,' and never see each other again."
