




## Wreck of the RD Inman, Duxbury Reef, 1909

R. D. Inman stranded on extreme upper end of Duxbury Reef (Bolinas Point) in 1909. Went inshore looking for possible boats from a supposed burning vessel, which proved to be a fire on beach. Captain was merely hallucinating, took too much "headache remedy" before departing San Francisco. Weather; cloudy, dark, strong southeast wind, rain squalls, sea gulls, generally not very nice out, good for wearing fashionable rain-boots. Struck once and bucked off -struck again and became helpless, lost or broke propeller on rocks. Lifesaving steamer Snohomish and Lifesaving crew from Bonita went to scene of the wreck but nothing could be done.

Wreck Report: R. D. Inman came to rest parallel to the shore, 500 feet from the beach, washing over the reef into a shallow basin and listing heavily to starboard. The vessel was wedged tightly in the rocks; no attempt was made to get her off. Instead, owner F. S. Loop of the Loop Steamship Company collected his \$100,000 insurance policy. Abandoned as a total loss, R. D. Inman was partially salvaged by the underwriters and left to the sea; "the steamer will be stripped of machinery and deck fittings and everything of value that can be secured." The townsfolk of Bolinas, then, as now, all notorious scavengers, grabbed everything of any possible value before the insurance company could get there.


#### Shelter Serra

Shelter Serra was born in a small coastal town in northern California named Bolinas. His interest in making art started at an early age playing with clay and Legos©, also as a teenager skateboarding in parking lots after school and doing spray paint graffiti murals in San Francisco. Shelter is the son of famed lawyer, J. Tony Serra (who was depicted by James Woods in the movie "True Believer") and the nephew of sculptor, Richard Serra. He studied at the University of California at Santa Cruz and received a Master's of Fine Arts in Painting and Printmaking from the Rhode Island School of Design. Shelter's recent artwork reflects the global spread of technology and how it constantly alters our visual environment. His work investigates our culture's relationship to objects of status and how advertising diversifies consumption. His inspiration comes from many sources including traveling and literature. Shelter has participated in group shows at Alleged Gallery, Marlborough Gallery, Eric Firestone in New York, and at Space 1026 in Philadelphia. He has also exhibited in Japan. Shelter currently lives in New York City and works in his studio in midtown Manhattan.







Minutes from the October 22, 2012 Bolinas Fire Protection District Board

Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:30PM. Vice Pres. Kilkenny, Dir. Kimball, Dir. O'Donnell and Dir. Smith were present. Also present: Chief Brown, Secretary Brown and Barbara Kayfetz.

MSC, Kilkenny/Smith (unan) to approve the agenda.

#### CHIEF'S REPORT MERA None.

Inspection Sam's House - Safety Inspection

Planning 20 Nymph Road – Demolish existing residence, construct new one 15 Oak Road - Legalize existing retaining wall 415 Yucca — Solar Install 100 Mesa Road — Addition to communications tower - Verizon 40 Mesa Road – Solar Install 76 Altura Road – Remodel 324 Ocean Parkway – Addition 160 Overlook – Solar Install 280 Mesa - Demolish existing structure, construct new one, and legalize multiple existing structures

#### Volunteers

Fire Safety Day was a great success. Chief Brown thanked everyone who participated. Pres Buchanan reported that Asst. Chief Marcotte conducted a kitchen stove fire demo that was both exciting and educational. Next year, Chief Brown would like to offer a vehicle extrication demonstration using the Hurst extrication tools next year.

The Volunteer's annual raffle mailing has been sent to local residents. This annual fundraising event is the only one the Volunteers hold.

At this point in the meeting, Barbara Kayfetz asked to speak. She presented a photo album that she had created with large photos of Fire Safety Day. Pres Buchanan and the rest of the Board thanked her for her generosity and thoughtfulness.

Apparatus

Chief Brown stated she feels that the old U231 pick up is unsafe to sell as it has brake and steering issues. The Board agreed that the vehicle sounded too unsafe to sell in good conscience. Parts that can be sold off of the unit will be with the pick up itself will be used for extrication training.

#### Disaster Council

Chief Brown reported that she participated in the Great California Shake Out on October 18th. She reported that not many Disaster Council Area Coordinators were able to participate. She plans to schedule another drill in the near future on a weekend day so more people can attend. Operationally, the Shake Out was beneficial as Chief Brown drafted a form titled "Steps to Take" which outlines procedures for the first fifteen minutes after an earthquake for use by Volunteers and/or anyone at the station.

Building and Grounds

Chief Brown reported that one of the sump pumps was failing due to debris being flushed down toilets at the Clinic. The staff moved quickly to correct the situation. Repairs were made to the pump which is now functioning. The Clinic will be responsible the cost of the repair. Chief Brown met with the new site manager of the Coastal Health Alliance, Deborah Harmell-Antonio. They discussed routine maintenance of the building and grounds and disaster plans.

General Operations

Chief Brown reported that the annual audit took place on October 3<sup>rd</sup>. She said that it was completed early in the afternoon due to District organization and thorough preparation. She thanked Secretary Brown and Bookkeeper Kaaren Gann for their hard work.

Surfer's Overlook

Dir. Kimball reported that the work scheduled for this fall to test for soil conditions and to take soil samples for the next phase of the repair at Surfer's Overlook has been delayed until approximately next April. The sand levels on ground level are too low and inhibit the operation of large equipment. The tides are predicted to be low enough in April which would allow access of large equipment.

Dir. Kimball reported that the BCPUD has begun a major project to replace the main water pipe along Terrace Avenue which will take approximately two to three weeks to complete. One hydrant will be added. He assured everyone that at Surfer's Overlook, there will be no digging up of new soils to reroute the main that might result in destabilizing the cliff area. Instead, the pipe will be rerouted up hill on the other side of the road away from the ocean.

Maintenance Agreement - CHA Chief Brown discussed a cap on the Common Area Maintenance account with the Board. She reviewed the potential maintenance costs including the generator, pumps, roofs, asphalt, etc and discussed a cap between \$30,000 to \$50,000 from each agency. The Board discussed the issue and decided that a \$30,000 cap from each agency to be paid at a rate of \$5,000 per year for six years would be adequate. Chief Brown agreed to present a letter of agreement describing the Common Area Maintenance account payment schedule at the November Board

Pres. Buchanan remarked that there were many fire calls and emergencies last month. Chief Brown described a motor cycle accident at the top of 13 turns on Highway 1 due to slippery roads after the rains. She cautioned everyone to be careful on wet roads.

#### GENERAL BUSINESS

Action Item #1: Approve CalPERS requirement for a publicly available pay schedule.

After edits made by Pres. Buchanan, the Board approved the pay schedule. MSC, O'Donnell/Kilkenny (unan) to approve the CalPERS requirement for a publicly available pay schedule.

Discussion: Approve Verizon request to add microwave antennae to existing Crown Castle tower located on Fire

District property. Director Kimball explained to the Board that he attempted to schedule a conference call meeting with Crown Castle representatives, Verizon engineers, Site Safe engineers, Chief Brown, Don Smith and himself to explore alternatives Verizon might be willing to implement to minimize the ground level RF emissions without compromising their service level standards. He reported that there has been no response from Crown Castle to the meeting schedule but he received a message from the District manager that the Fire District is legally required to approve the request as the microwave emissions would be so minimal. There has been no communication since. Pres. Buchanan suggested that Crown

Castle and Verizon complete the installation of the panel antennas approved in 2009 and then pursue an RF compliance report based on all 12 panel antennas functioning at full capacity. Dir. Kimball suggested that if the Board approves the Verizon request to add wave antennae, that a copy of the

Crown Castle with a notation that the Board intends to respectfully work with them towards the lowest possible RF emissions and the best possible solution(s) for all parties involved.

Discussion: Emergency only access and egress alternatives to closure of Terrace Avenue and Overlook Road. No update.

CONSENT CALENDAR

MSC, Kimball/O'Donnell (unan) to approve the Consent Calendar including the Minutes from the September 24, 2012 regular meeting and the warrant lists from September 18 – October 16, 2012, and the financial reports for August 2012 including the account balances. Dir. Kimball asked how the budget graph reflected the accounts and the overall annual budget. Chief Brown answered that there are outstanding accounting issues regarding categorization of expenses that the bookkeeper Kaaren Gann will be resolving soon. Chief Brown requested that the Finance Committee meet with Kaaren after new committees are formed after the next meeting in November.

PUBLIC EXPRESSION None.

BOARD MEMBER REPORT None.

PERSONNEL MATTERS None. ANNOUNCEMENT None.

GOOD OF THE ORDER

Pres. Buchanan thanked Vice Pres. Kilkenny for her last four years of service. (This was her last neeting as she has finished her four year term.) The Board gave her flowers and chocolate and huge thanks, especially for her work on the personnel committee. Pres. Buchanan thanked Barbara Kayfetz

for her thoughtful photo album. He also thanked Secretary Brown and Bookkeeper Kaaren Gann for their organization and preparedness which contributed to a successful annual audit.

The Board then sang a happy birthday song to Pres. Buchanan.

The next two regular Board meetings are scheduled for November 26th and December 17th.

ADJOURNMENT MSC, Kilkenny/O'Donnell (unan) to adjourn the meeting at 8:25PM.
