



How Did You Find Bolinas?

It was a packed house at the Library last Tuesday night for a screening of "How Did You Find Bolinas?" a video made in 2006 by Marc Sanchez-Corea and StuArt.

Well known filmmaker John Korty (husband of our librarian Jane) handled the technical details smoothly.

In the film 65 people told how they found Bolinas. After the screening audience members stood up in the Library and testified how they also found Bolinas.

The screening was part of the Library's efforts to encourage storytelling in our community. I applaud that effort. These are the stories of our lives and it's good to share them.

"How Did You Find Bolinas?" has become a historical document. The video was made in 2006. Every time I watch, it gets more historical

Some of the people in the video are no longer with us - Peter Lee, Buddy Craig, Ken Botto, Rick Klaes.

Rick Klaes has a powerful moment when he testifies, "I love Bolinas. I'm gonna . . " $\,$

And then he stops himself before he says the word. He continues, "Let's just say . . .I'm going home . . . here."

Jane Blethen is in the video, and she gives a long response. She talks about "skunks and foxes" while smiling and laughing through her orange peel mouthguard.

At the end of his interview, Peter Lee, a "fourth generation Californian" gets all gnarly and growls "I wish they'd all go home."

They're all history now. It was such a flash to see my old friend Ken Botto ranting about "the hippies moving to the country."

"How Did You Find Bolinas?" captured a time and place. I'm glad we have a video record of all the colorful characters mentioned above.

Marc Sanchez-Corea did a fantastic job of collecting and editing the video. I was just the on-air talent, and wrote the theme song, "How Did You Find Bolinas?"

It would be fun to do more. What are we doing as a testament for these times?

How can we share together the historicity of Bolinas?

We are living history. Our hair dos and habits will soon be quaint. We are local color.

Let's be colorful.

There will be more living history on the **22** of February at the Community Center. Barbara Kayfetz will be showing her slides of Bolinas from 1976-2012.




The campaign has been up for almost a week. It has raised over \$2,300 and already has 45 contributors-yay!! But we still have a lot more to raise, and so am asking for your help!
