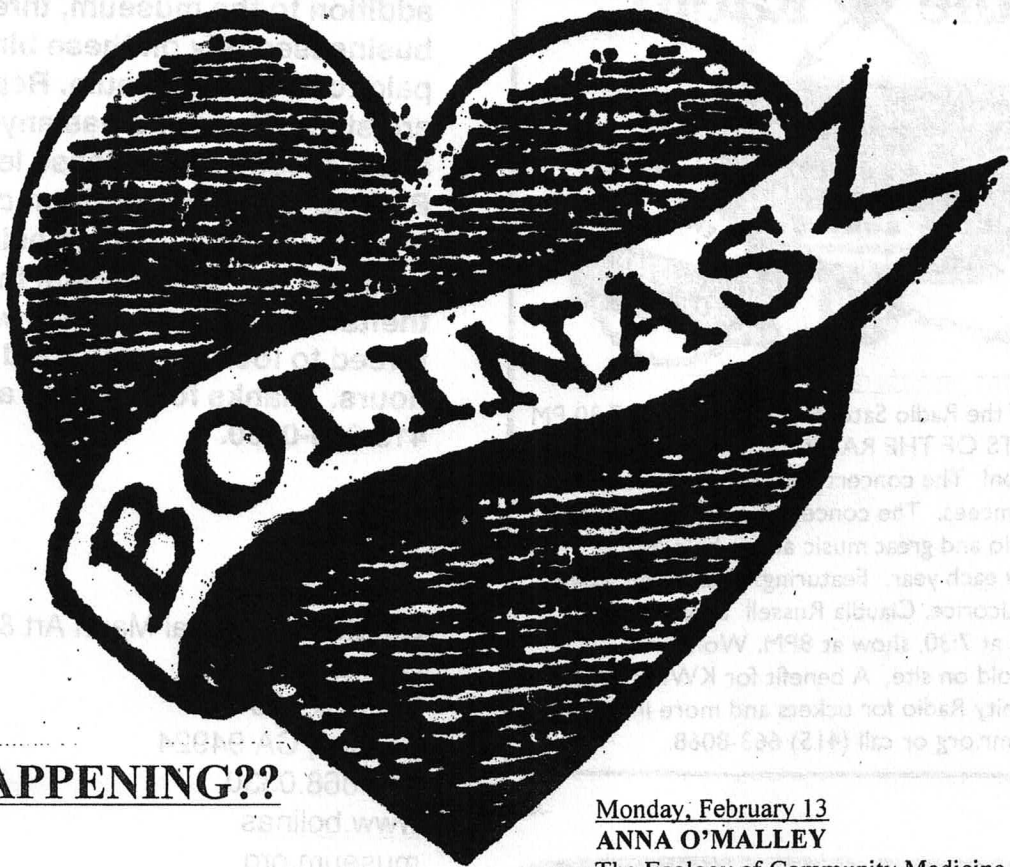



My mind raced back to Scenic Designs. There was a big sign on the office door for prospective clients - a circle divided into three sections which read: Cheap, Fast, Good, along with a subtext - choose two.

In other words, a client could have the job Cheap and Fast, but it wouldn't be Good. Or Fast and Good but it wouldn't be Cheap. Or Good and Cheap, but it wouldn't be Fast. Makes sense, doesn't it. But in this case the client was asking for Cheap and Fast and Good - an impossibility.

But it was Melinda, and the kids, so I - somewhat reluctantly - agreed.

"They're in my car, I'll drop them at the Gibson House."

Fortunately there is a big dining table at the Gibson House, and Carmen, Felipa and Maria Luisa were OK with taking their lunch in the TV room. Arn stepped right up to help me clear the table, and miraculously I had a dry space to spread out the banners.

Actually I was painting on the backside of some elaborate, computer designed and printed banners with evocative photos of kids and sharp computer type. Why they hadn't just done that again and ordered the banners online I didn't know, but I didn't linger on the question.

They were asking for Good, Cheap and Fast - very unlikely I knew from experience. And it was a super tight deadline, normally I'd have a couple of days or a week at least. But they wanted the banners by the next morning.

Normally I would have spent some time designing and laying out the copy. But I had no time so I just dove in.

Some kind of magic happen: the way the dining room instantly became my sign shop, and the way some new brushes and a pint of fluorescent red paint appeared.

All that was needed was some intense concentration and hard work.

I borrowed Kathleen's hair dryer, and with a brush in one hand and the hair dryer in the other I knocked out the first banner, and then the second. Four hours later I was done.

Fast, Cheap and Good! I thought to myself - for the kids and the preschool - a miracle!

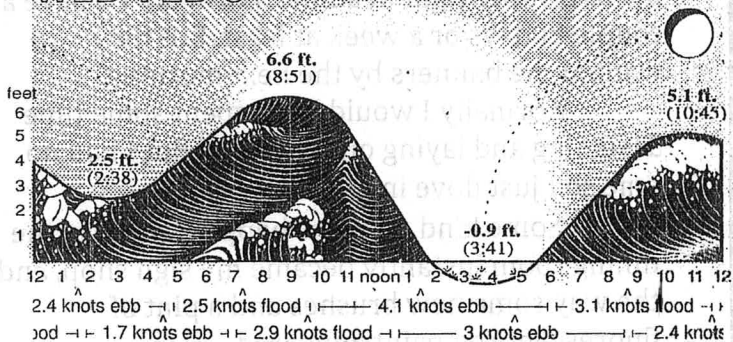

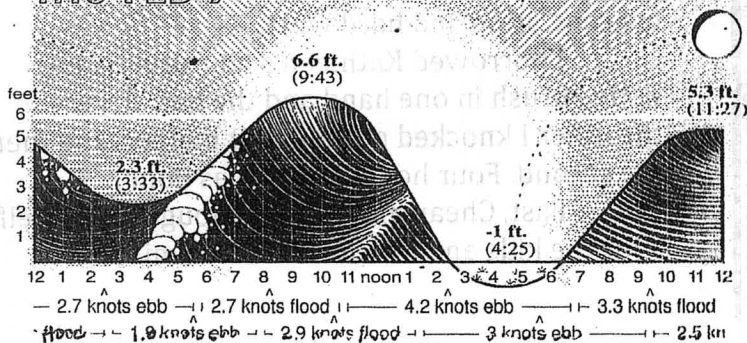

**Interview with Jake Orbison**

"There's a young poet on a fellowship
staying with me." Matt Yerington said. "His name's
Jake."

Intrigued, I introduced myself to Jake and
encouraged him to submit some of his poetry to the
Hearsay.

"Bolinas is a poetry town." I told him.

"I know," Jake answered. "That's why I
came here."

Recently, 3 of Jake's poems were published
in the Hearsay. I was interested in finding out more
about his background, so I asked him to submit to
an interview.

Hearsay: Where are you from and how did you find
Bolinas?

Jake: I'm from New York City. I graduated in May
from Yale with a BA in English with a minor in
Race. I spent the fall in the southwest, and I wanted
to come to northern California. A lot of the poets I
admire are from the Bay Area – Robert Haas,
Czeslaw Milosz and Robert Creeley. My professor
at Yale, Louise Gluck, teaches at Berkeley. I did
some research and Bolinas popped up. I knew that I
didn't want to live in the city. I wanted to be
somewhere pretty so I came to Bolinas.

Hearsay: What are you planning for your stay here?

Jake: I'm not very intrepid by nature, so I like to
throw myself into situations.

Hearsay: Can you describe your poetry a bit?

Jake: My poetry is not as elliptical as elliptical
poetry, but it shares an interest in voice. My studies
at Yale included both poetry and race. I'm
particularly interested in whiteness.

Hearsay: Where do you seek your inspiration?

Jake: I read and I shamelessly borrow from others.

Hearsay: Do you find the People's Store to be a
source of inspiration?

Jake: I'm not really predatorially seeking
inspiration. I'm trying to meet people and get to
know the town.

Hearsay: Is there anything you'd like to say to the
Hearsay readers?

Jake: Understand that I'm in Bolinas on a poetry
fellowship, and I'm fascinated by the culture and
the history of poetry in Bolinas.

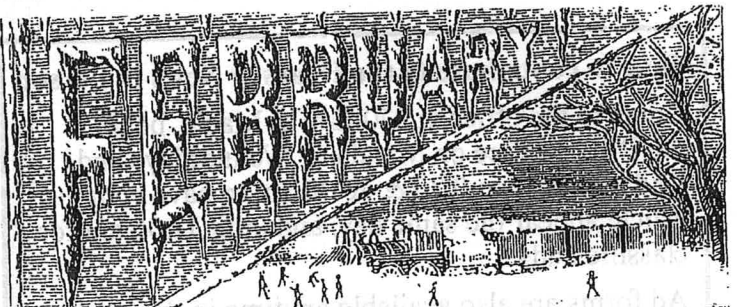
