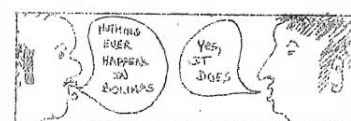

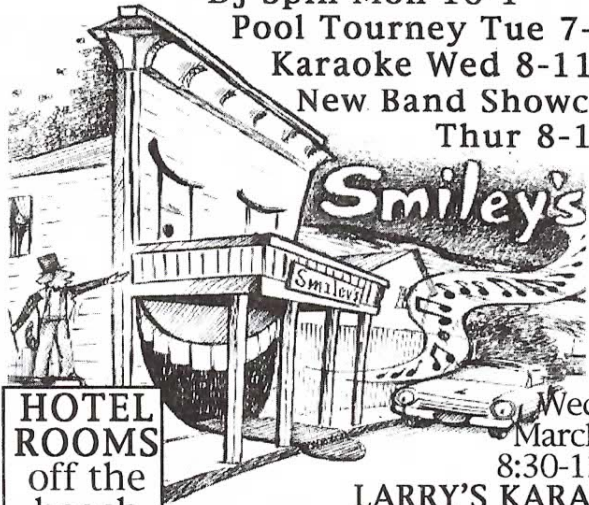

School tax increase measure put on June 4 ballot

Voters in Stinson Beach and Bolinas will soon be asked to renew an annual \$250-per-parcel schools tax and increase it by \$50 after officials voted to place an initiative on the June 4 ballot.

The Bolinas-Stinson Union School District has had a parcel tax since 1988. The tax generates about \$450,000 per year, or about 16 percent of the 2010-11 budget of \$2.9 million.

Superintendent Larry Enos said the tax has helped pre-

serve art, music, physical education and other programs parents view as essential.

"The revenue we receive from state, federal government and even local property taxes is not sufficient to maintain programs and deal with the escalating cost of doing business," he said.

The district's tax is second-lowest among Marin school districts after West Marin's Shoreline Unified School District, which has a tax of \$184.70 per parcel. And unlike most districts, Bolinas-Stinson does not automati-

cally raise its tax each year to adjust for inflation.

Last week, the district's school board voted 4-1, with Steve Marcotte dissenting, to place the tax on the June 4 ballot.

In an interview, Marcotte said he supports a tax increase but voted "no" because he did not have enough information about the district's financial picture. He said his work schedule prevented him from attending a meeting where district staffers presented information to the board.

"I knew we needed to raise

it," he said of the tax. "I didn't know if we were raising it high enough, or if we were raising it too high."

The last time the tax was on the ballot, residents approved it with 75.2 percent of the vote, well above the two-thirds needed.

"We have enjoyed tremendous support from the community and we're very hopeful that support will continue," Enos said.

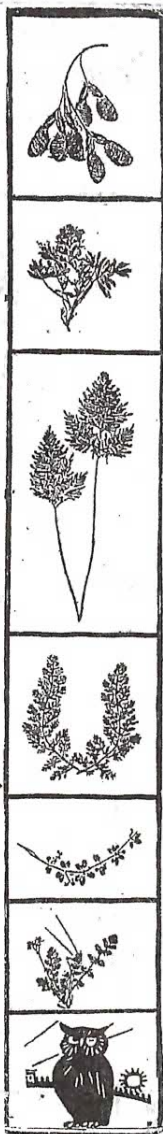

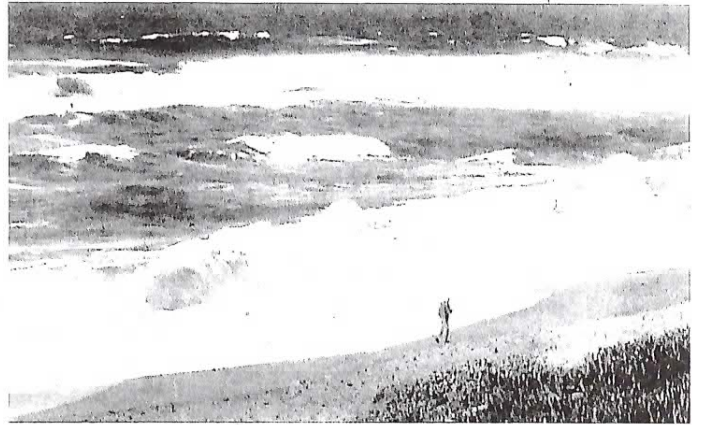

OYSTERS OVER RICE

For two.
Fry one jar of oysters in butter until the edges curl. Add one heaping teaspoon chicken stock base (or 2 bullion cubes), some pepper, 1 tsp soy sauce, and 1/2 tsp sweet basil. Stir. 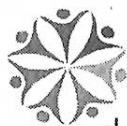


We were just basking in the lagoon, half asleep. And then I saw them. Humans. Standing on the dunes. It was incredible.

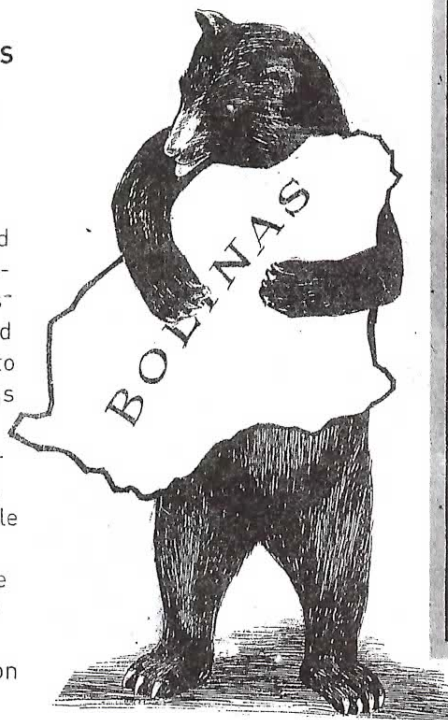

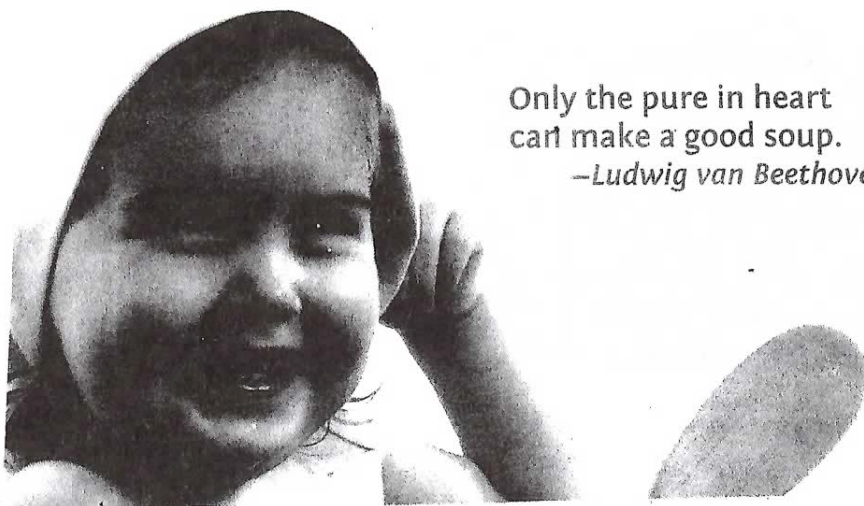
