## The Dud Platoon

Not long after dropping out of art school in New York City I was drafted into the Army - February 24, 1969, I remember it well. Subsequently I went through basic training and then attended Military Police school where I was trained to be an MP.

I was stationed at Fort Monroe, Virginia but after a month as an MP, my attempts at dodging the draft caught up with me and I was denied a security clearance to guard the computer room where the generals played war games.

After being kicked out of the Military Police I was transferred to the "dud platoon" where the Army put all the problem soldiers. The dud platoon was mostly burned out combat vets, who were no longer willing to play the Army game. Many of them had lost all rank after returning to the states. There was rampant drug use in the dud platoon.

They thought I was an undercover narcotics agent planted by the Military Police. They excluded me from their pot smoking sessions despite my best attempts to convince them that I wasn't a narc.

One day the dud platoon was going out on lawn mowing duty and a soldier from the dud platoon offered me a chance to join the others in getting high.

"We're gonna drop acid and mow lawns." he said with a smile. "You can join us if you want." and he handed me a capsule. It was a mega dose of LSD designed to completely flip out a narc. I didn't appreciate how combat vets play for keeps.

I swallowed the capsule and we headed out to the vast expanse of lawn at Fort Monroe. The LSD began to come on in waves. I'd taken a lot of acid when I lived in the East Village, but I'd never taken a megadose on active duty in the military..

I started seeing auras. My thinking devolved into feedback loops. Amidst the cacophony of colors and patterns it became harder and harder to distinguish any sense of self.

After a while we all returned to the barracks. I took off my boots and lay down on my bunk, struggling to maintain some composure and sense of self.

Finally I knew what I had to do. I stood up and announced. "I'm getting out of the Army - RIGHT NOW!"

No one stopped me as I walked out of the barracks barefoot. The grass and sidewalk felt fantastic under my bare feet. My short hair, cut to Army length, streamed behind me in colors.

A post taxi came around the corner, and I jumped it front of it to stop it. The taxi screeched to a stop and I darted around and climbed in the back seat.

"Hey, you could've gotten killed doing that!" the soldier driving the cab shouted at me.

"Take me to the main gate." I answered purposefully. En route to the main gate I took off the rest of my uniform. I exited the taxi at the main gate wearing only my Army regulation boxer shorts and walked across the bridge which separated Fort Monroe from the sleepy Virginia town of Phoebus.

By the time I got to Phoebus I was singing and dancing. I was overjoyed to be out of the Army, and I acted out in the small downtown.

I walked into the ABC store (Alcoholic Beverage Control) the only place that sold hard liquor in Virginia. People were lined up waiting to buy their pints. I held my hand up and shouted, "Stop! That isn't the way to get high!" (I thought I knew a better way.)

The clerk behind the counter had a fit. His face turned completely red and he shouted, "Get the hell outta here." I'm sure he called the cops, because shortly thereafter the police caught me disturbing the peace downtown and hand-cuffed me.

Somehow I got away. It became a cat and mouse game between me and the police, with cop cars darting this way and that. Finally the police caught me again and this time put additional handcuffs on my ankles.

There I was lying on the sidewalk in downtown Phoebus, tripping my ass off with handcuffs on my wrists

and ankles. I began to moan and cry out. A kind police sergeant saw my pitiful condition,

and asked, "What you need, son?"

"My guitar!" I answered. I wanted to accompany the incredible melody going through my head.

He jumped back and said, "There's no guitars where you're going" Still struggling desperately to free myself, the sergeant put a sleeper hold on me and I blacked out.

I regained consciousness in a jail cell, alone, naked and still out of my mind on LSD.. The steel bars of the jail cell became bamboo and I realized that I was in prison in Hanoi awaiting execution.

I believed I was a fighter bomber pilot who'd been shot down flying missions over North Vietnam. I'd been bombing innocent women and children and I was overwhelmed with remorse and guilt.

The music playing in my head changed to the sound of jet engines, explosions and screaming people. "Are you going to shoot me now?" I'd ask any cop who came to check on me. I was so filled with anguish over my participation in the war that I was ready to die.

Then the music in my mind changed into an incredible bluesy wail. I looked down at my arms and they became the arms of a black junkie covered with needle marks. I knew that a black heroin addict had died in that cell, and now I was going to die.

"Everyone dies eventually." I consoled myself, but then I realized that my death was not in the future. My death was going to happen right now, and there was nothing I could do to postpone it.

I sat down in center of the jail cell in the lotus position and died.

I left my body with my last breath, my spirit spiraling upwards like the final puff of smoke from an snuffed candle.

I was out of the Army - free at last.
