





Community Expression:

- 1. Walk-A-Thon Fundraiser for the Bolinas Children's Center (Sat. May 7th)-10am-2pm. Someone would need to unlock gate, give access to power outlet, and mow the area between the skate park and the playground. Talk to Chas. There is also a baseball game at 1pm that day.
- 2. Nate, little league games are on Sat. need power outlet access for the pitching machine. Also need access to shed where pitching machine is being held.
- 3. Jennifer- Would like to have updates on status of the water meter at Resource Recovery site for Mesa Park. There is a study of the well in regards to sea water infiltration into the aquafer so keeping track of water usage will help in measurements accuracy.
- 4. Eric-working with Melinda Stone on community fires, wondering if they can store tools in the shed? Chas will look to see if a small box would fit. Are there restriction days on use in the summer due to fire hazards? Fire hazard regulations are set by the fire dept.
- 5. Skate park. Blair- Started fundraising along with talking to businesses that are willing to match what the park puts in for construction. Budget around \$80-100k. Still looking into volunteers and permitting. Park funds can't be used towards permits. Roy Bateman runs county permits and will be at a community meeting in Point Reyes at the dance palace 6:30pm could talk to him then about permits and costs. Measure A funds could be utilized towards

renovation but need a budget and a work plan presented.

- A) The board needs to look into adding a drainage pipe next to the area being discussed (skate park sidewalk) in order to fix the flooding issue every year. Need to pump it for now.
- B) Blair- can we have the funds raised added to the Mesa park bank account so the funds are not in his personal funds? Needs to be done by the 19th. Dylan will put it in the main fund and just restrict the funds. Go fund me- Bolinas Skatepark.
- C) Tyson- thinking of having a BBQ fundraiser. Amplified music has to be limited and notify neighbors. As well as having a fundraiser at the Community Center.

The liability for volunteers during construction would fall under the contractor licensed to do the work. Need to work up a bid as we have to open bids to the public for work over a certain amount.

6. Blair- Showcasing local surf exhibit at the museum on May 18th but might need to have it hosted in DTpark for space.

Downtown Park:

- 1. Order hooks for bathroomsordered by Chas just need to be installed.
- 2. Instillation of timer locks for bathrooms. Mark- should be happening this coming weekend.
- 3. Sign for chain across the access road. Dylan
- 4. Arn's last day is March 30th
- 5. Payroll for subcontract gardener-Rob Lenhof with a 10hr cap a week and a one month trial period.
- 6. Need a push mower.

Mesa Park:

- 1. Data for fixing the well- Norcal bid -still waiting on the bid.
- 2. Don Smith wants access to the well for a salt water infiltration study. Water table in the well is at sea level, the concern is that sea water from the pressure of the lagoon as well as drainage water from the upper lands (big and little mesa) would infiltrate the well and contaminate the water table. Need to know the radiance of the water table downtown and the flow. Looking for places to drill and measure. Hoping to be able to test

the well in DT park and continuing to testing for a year. Need access to the well once a month. Charles- we should give the BPUD a key to the well

- A) Recommend a moister probe to help reduce water use on the fields at Mesa Park- can be found at gardening stores. Recommends we look into the amount of solidity that can be tolerated in the grass before it dies. Mark will measure.
- Gopher issue- park being charged but was trapping still happening?-Mark will call
- 4. Picnic tables need to be built as well as stained. Need to be glued and screwed together.
- 5. Need to order a new sensor for water tank-Victoria
- 6. Repairing parking lot- Charles

- 1. County Audit- report card results show that we need an online presence. Dylan- the website is almost complete, just need to add content.
- 2. Charge for cutting down the Plum tree? Dylan
- 3. Follow up with the county on receiving funds for old irrigation completion. Dylan is going to follow up next meeting.



PANEL DISCUSSION: Marijuana in the Haight: From the 1967 Grateful Dead Bust to Legalization in 2016

Tuesday, April 19, 2016 - 7:30pm

Join us for a community discussion of Marijuana in the Haight: From the 1967 Grateful Dead' Bust to Legalization in 2016. The event will feature some of the original movers and shakers from the Haight's heyday to talk about how medical and health approaches to cannabis have evolved from the Summer of Love til the possibility of legalization in the present.

In October of 1967, the Grateful Dead were busted for marijuana at 710 Ashbury in the Haight. Attorneys Michael Stepanian and Brian Rohan formed the Haight-Ashbury Legal Organization (HALO) to defend the Dead and other young people who were busted during the era of Reefer Madness. The Haight Ashbury Free Clinic (HAFC) had already been was formed in 1967 to care for young drug users and held the first National Marijuana Symposium at UCSF. Marijuana research conducted at the HAFC was published in the new Journal of Psychoactive Drugs. Rock Medicine was formed to provide medical services at concerts at the request of benefactor Bill Graham.

Pot laws were quite Draconian; Timothy Leary got 10 years for possession of 1 joint and Jack Kerouac's On the Road hero Neil Cassady, who became part of Ken Kesey's Merry Pranksters, got 5 years for 2 joints. All that has changed as "medical marijuana" is almost fully legal, and marijuana is on the verge of full legalization in California. But what might that all mean for a future of legalization?

Featuring:

- Steve Heilig of the San Francisco Medical Society and member of Lt. Governor Gavin Newsom's Blue Ribbon Commission on Marijuana.
- David Smith MD, founder of the Haight Ashbury Free Clinic, will talk about how medical and health approaches to cannabis have evolved.
- Michael Stepanian and Grateful Dead historian Dennis McNally, PhD will talk about the Big Bust on Ashbury.
- San Francisco Assistant DA Andrew Clark will discuss how marijuana offenses are handled now in contrast to 1967.
- Drug Policy Alliance leader Marsha Rosenbaum, PhD, also from the Newsom commission, will address "What about the Children?" drug education then and now.
- David Talbot, author Season of the Witch, will share recollections as well.

The newly published Journal Of Psychoactive Drugs theme issue on Marijuana in California will be on sale for \$10.


