Epilogue to the Dud Platoon

A number of people read my story "The Dud Platoon" in the Hearsay on March 19 and wanted to know what happened after I died in the jail cell. Large doses of LSD sometimes culminate in a spiritual experience of disincorporation and reunification with the infinite. It's an awesome, mind blowing event and it happened to me thanks to the soldiers in the Dud Platoon.

I came back to my senses to find myself naked, sitting in the middle of an empty jail cell. How did I get here? What happened? I asked myself. I imagined it was a vivid dream. Then I gradually realized that I'd been overdosed by the paranoid soldiers in the dud platoon..

A friendly police officer with whom I had worked as an MP held up a telephone book at the bars of the cell. "We know you're Chapman," he said "and we're going to call your father if you point to his name."

I need to digress for a moment to provide a little background information. Hampton, my hometown, was only 12 miles from Fort Monroe. The reason I was stationed at Fort Monroe and wasn't sent immediately to Vietnam after getting kicked out of the Military Police was because of my sister's godfather. He was the top civilian at Fort Monroe and regularly dined at the Officer's Club with his wife Lucy, who my sister was named after. They were my parents' best friends and although I have no concrete evidence I believe he pulled the strings to keep me out of harm's way during my military service.

The fact that I wasn't sent to Vietnam after being booted out of MPs contributed to the suspicion of the Dud Platoon that I was a narc. The only other person to have escaped a similar fate was the nephew of a Senator from New Jersey. Back to my story:

I pointed to my father's name, and not long thereafter my dad showed up and bailed me out. My dad was great. He was kind and supportive, although concerned about what the Army would say about my arrest.

The next day I went to my commanding officer and told him what had happened. I decided not to implicate the soldiers in the Dud Platoon who had dosed me. Instead I concocted a story about meeting a hippie friend for lunch who had slipped me an overdose of LSD.

The Army accepted my story. Two weeks later I appeared in civilian court to answer the charges of disorderly conduct and resisting arrest. The judge asked me to explain the reason for my behavior. I told him I had been dosed with LSD. The gavel came down and I was given a six month suspended sentence and a \$75 fine.

The Army put me at the golf driving range in the far reaches of Fort Monroe. I spent my days sitting in a sheet metal garden shed. Occasionally an officer would stop by to practice his swing, but besides picking up golf balls and mowing the putting green I was left undisturbed.

I spent the next couple of months meditating and studying Buddhist and Hindu texts in an attempt to make some sense of my recent religious experience. I was especially attracted to the Bhagavad Gita, and the discourse between Krishna and Arjuna which takes place on a battlefield. Their discourse has been interpreted as an allegory for the ethical and moral struggles of human life.

One morning a sergeant stopped by and told me that they were entering me in a contest for Soldier of the Month. I almost laughed out loud. Two weeks later I went before a panel of sergeants and officers and was quizzed about my understanding of the military way of life.

Because of my meditation and study I was well versed in the code of the true spiritual warrior and I blew them away with my answers to their questions. I was chosen as Soldier of the Month and awarded a \$25 savings bond and a promotion to Corporal.

Shortly thereafter I was transferred to Arts & Crafts and became Assistant Arts & Crafts Director, teaching copper enameling, macrame, watercolor and ceramics to soldiers and their dependents.

Arts & Crafts is where I spent the rest of my two year hitch in the Army. My MOS (Military Occupational Specialty) changed from Military Police to Recreation Specialist.

On February 23, 1971 I received an Honorable Discharge from the Army and awarded a Good Conduct Medal. After my two years of active duty I was eligible for the GI Bill which paid for my return to art school. I spent my junior year at Cooper Union in New York City and my senior year on an exchange program at California Institute of the Arts. (I received a BFA in painting and printmaking from Cooper Union.)

The GI Bill also paid for two years at the Instituto Allende in San Miguel de Allende, Mexico where I got my MFA (Maestro de Bellas Artes) The Instituto is where I met Amy Urdang, who was studying weaving and recuperating from her life in Bolinas.

That's my story — I was lucky and I was blessed. And I still feel blessed to be living in Bolinas.

Thank you, Goddess. I'm a lucky boy.

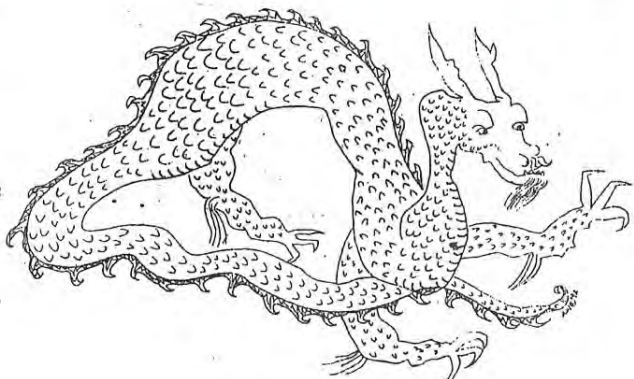
Transportation and Land Use in Marin County
